PROCLAMATION

CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

- **WHEREAS** Childhood cancers make up less than 1% of all cancers diagnosed each year; about 12,000 children in the United States under the age of 15 will be diagnosed with cancer this year, and childhood cancer rates have been rising slightly for the past few decades; and
- **WHEREAS** Because of major treatment advances in recent decades, more than 80% of children with cancer now survive 5 years or more, and overall, this is a huge increase since the mid-1970s when the 5 year survival rate was less than 60%; and
- **WHEREAS** Different types of cancer can behave very differently; they grow at different rates and respond to different treatments. That is why children with cancer need treatment that is aimed at their particular kind of cancer; and
- **WHEREAS** Cancer is the second leading cause of death in children younger than 15 years old (after accidents); and
- **WHEREAS** About one in 500 young adults is a childhood cancer survivor, and nearly 2/3 of the survivors later experience significant and chronic medical problems or develop secondary cancers as adults that result from the treatment of their original cancer.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Town of Sturbridge stands in official observance of **CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH** for the month of September in the year of 2015.
