
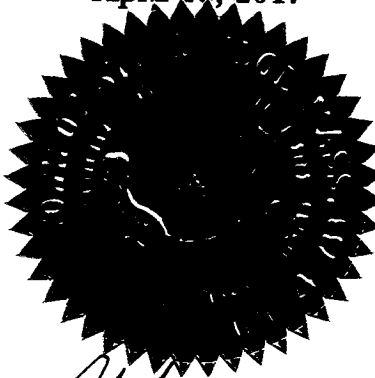


# PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, Trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products, and
- WHEREAS, Trees in our Town increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and
- WHEREAS, Trees are a source of joy and spiritual renewal, and
- WHEREAS, Sturbridge has been recognized as a Tree City USA by the National Arbor Day Foundation and desires to continue its tree-planting ways,
- NOW THEREFORE, the Board of Selectmen of Sturbridge do hereby proclaim April 28, 2017 as ARBOR DAY in the Town of Sturbridge. We urge all citizens to support efforts to care for our trees and woodlands, support our Town's community forestry program, and plant trees to gladden the hearts and promote the well-being of present and future generations.
