Update

To extend the Order of Conditions.

J. Tetreau explained what they need to do to finish the project. Put the top coat down, replant 15 trees, clean the catch basins, and take the silt out of the detention pond.

M. Briggs told him the Conservation needs a letter from the engineer stating, the BMP's, storm drains, and detention pond, are all functioning properly and are built according to the plans. Mr. Briggs stated that the previous Conservation consultant watched this project before he retired and now the Commission would like to enlist the new consultant, Brandon Faneuf, Ecosystem Solutions to oversee the conditions of the site, and a quick review of the trees to be planted.

M. Smith explained that Ron Anger will remove the burned house. He gave the Board a letter showing photos of the house, and the foundation would be filled in for public safety concerns. There is town sewer on Buttonwood Ave, however he doesn't know if the cesspool was filled in. The Cemetery people will check the two stones found on the property to see if this was a grave site area.

J. Sheehan suggested, do the demolition of the house, stabilize the area, and get the erosion control in and out of the area before the brook gets any higher. Also put a second tier on far side of the building, if needed. Check with the Board of Health to see if the cesspool has been abandoned property. Come back to Conservation for any further work to be done.

M. Smith replied he will return with a Notice of Intent to re-build the house.

J. Sheehan said the erosion control needs to be across the driveway during the construction, even while they are on the site working. If they cut into the hill there will be an erosion control problem once it starts to rain. The whole project needs to be stabilized before October before the heaviest rains.

Note per Mr. Sheehan: The erosion control problem is not a big deal for the contractors.

M. Briggs said to get the road in and stabilize it. Once the erosion controls is in call the office for the hay bale inspection.
