This has been approved by the Board of Health along with the location of the existing well. He explained this road is a private way and the property extends across the private way. Three large pine trees need to come down, as they are in the location of the proposed septic system. Eight to ten blueberry bushes would be planted near the end of the pond, and the mountain laurel along the slope would be moved and transplanted. There would be a recharge system in the ground throughout the house for drainage.

B. Faneuf summarized his site visit on the property. He asked if there were any plans for the dock that is in bad shape.

R. Murphy replied the dock is already there but would need to be brought up to compliance.

R. Tefft questioned the vapor barrier against the septic.

R. Murphy explained the 40ml plastic barrier to be used.
