- T. Brown replied they should be able to mow the grassy area right to the stonewall.

- B. Faneuf explained how to keep this area as a hay field and to cut it a few times a year. Using 6" Granite with a placard on top of it, instead of the signs.
- T. Brown said this NOI is for the roadway only, the houses shown on the plan is what can be done on this subdivision project.
