#### New/Old Business:

It was reported that the library circulated over \$1 million worth of items during the last fiscal year.

The cost per person to the town was \$20 for a \$90 per person value in materials. These totals do not even include the value of programs or electronic format items which would increase the total value per person.

Betsy reported that the budget for the first half of the fiscal year looks good and is on track.

Alan and Peggy Blume have agreed to chair the Capital Fund Drive for the proposed new library building. Discussion took place about opening a Friends bank account specifically for money collected during the fund drive. A Planning meeting is tentatively scheduled for Dec.1. Betsy will work on firming up a time and date.

Betsy reported that our library is included in the town's capital plan for \$5 million in the proposed fiscal 2018 budget.

The 2016 Osterman Family Grant received by the library has been completely spent. The library has applied for another Osterman Grant for 2017.

The Library inherited the historical Society binders of Sutton news clippings. There was discussion about archiving appropriately. There were suggestions about possible volunteer or internship opportunities to help with the collection.

The library is in the process of considering Zinio among other programs as a delivery method for online periodicals to patrons. We are also considering the Boopsie App which looks promising. No decision has been made at this time.

Betsy reported that the library will need new air conditioners in 2017.
