Old Business/New Business:

After discussion, the Trustees decided not to file with the MBLC for a new building grant extension. We feel that the town has missed out on a wonderful opportunity but that filing for an extension will not change the outcome of the decision made by the voters at the Fall Town Meeting. It was noted that we will not be able to apply for another grant for 10 years and that there is no guarantee that another grant round will take place at that time.

A decision was made by the Board to revise the library fine policy. We will now have "food for fines" in place year round to benefit the Sutton Food Pantry.

The annual library staff/ trustees dinner event is postponed to January.
