Old & New Business:

There was discussion of the details of the new fines policy. The Board unanimously voted to accept the new policy with an ammendment to clarify the food donation. The ammendment changed the policy to read: "In Lieu of monetary payment of Sutton Library fines, patrons may donate non-perishable food items and recieve \$1.00 off of their fine per item donated."

The FY 2019 budget was reviewed and discussed. It is currently level funded. Changes to salaries are on hold pending negotiations with other unions in the town. Most areas of the library budget will remain level funded. In March the budget will be presented at the Finance/Warrent Advisory meeting.

Lisa received a notice from the Board of Library Commissioners stating that the Sutton Public library is certified to participate in the FY2018 State Aid to Public Libraries Program. There will be two award payments. The first payment of \$5,526.68 was received..

This year the Library Legislative Breakfast will take place at the Milford Public Library on February 9 at 7:30 am.

The Library will be closed for the following holidays: 12/25 - Christmas, 1/1 - New Year's Day and 1/15 - Martin L King Day.
