Misc:

We've been working with Better World Books for a few years now but we are now required to pre-screen materials that we send them so we are only sending them what they want. We are exploring other avenues to use to discard withdrawn titles and donations. I'm working with a new company called More Than Words (https://www.mtwyouth.org/) to set up book pick up. They will leave a bin with us that they will pick up once a month. They will also do a massive bulk pick up of the book sale leftovers on Monday, June 11. Their mission is: "More Than Words is a nonprofit social enterprise that empowers youth who are in the foster care system, court involved, homeless, or out of school to take charge of their lives by taking charge of a business." I feel like they will provide a good avenue to solve the issue of the unwanted books we have.

Staff:

Staff day is Monday, June 11. I've ordered new staff t-shirts as well as some cups for them this year (Payment for these items comes out of State Aid.). (Lunch for the staff is provided by The Friends group.)

Old/New Business:

Laptops spec'd by CWMars have arrived for Betsy and Shannon. The town Tech. Department is now prepping them for use.

The Intern from Sutton High School is doing a great job helping Shannon prepare for Summer Reading programming along with doing many other tasks. This internship has proven to be very helpful!

The library needs to hire a new Page (age 16+) for summer and going forward. The position will be posted in early June.

A proposal was made to draft a statement to the Board of Selectmen based on speculation around town and on

social media about using the former police department space for the library. After discussion, a decision was made to wait on issuing a statement to the Board of Selectmen until after the spring town election. Meanwhile, Betsy will check with the Town Administrator on any status changes or proposals for the use of the P.D. space. She will report back to the Trustees at our next meeting.
