## Agenda Item 8 – Superintendent's Update

- The Early Learning Center and the Elementary School have just competed MAP testing and DIBBLES assessment; analysis of this data will help administrators make strategic decisions on curriculum development and instruction.
- PTO-sponsored Family BINGO Night took place on February 18<sup>th</sup> at the Elementary School. This event was rescheduled from an earlier postponement and as it occurred on the Friday before the vacation week, was not as well attended as hoped.
- Students in grades 3-10 will be taking the English Language Arts (ELA) portion of the MCAS in late March.
- The Middle School will be presenting the play "North Woods Nonsense" at 7 p.m. on March 11 and 12, and 2 p.m. on March 13. The price of admission will be discounted with a donation to the Food Pantry.
- 'Harmony Week' in the Middle School will take place during the week of March 21-25, with the Harmony Ball scheduled for March 25<sup>th</sup>.
- > The 7<sup>th</sup> grade Long Composition will be on March  $22^{nd}$ .
- The first of three parent informational coffees will take place on March 16<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. The topics to be discussed will include the new schedule that will be adopted at the Middle School and placement of the portable classrooms. - Under Mr. Durgin's leadership, the district is exploring possible technology changes in the future there will be a presentation tomorrow by Apple, Inc. about electronic tablet technology (versus textbooks.)

- The district has begun implementing automated AlertNow messages to notify parents that their child is absent if a parent has not called the school to report an absence.
- Another technology initiative underway is to synchronize the various student information software systems so that they all contain the same information.
- The District is planning to run its own summer camp program under the umbrella of school system, beginning this summer; a brochure is in development with the goal of distribution before April vacation.
