Announcements:

Moderator Markarian announced the Annual Harbor Festival this year will be held Saturday, June 28th, Blessing of the Fleet is at 12:00 noon, teen band concert is at 4:00 PM.

Moderator Markarian announced the town started metals collections the last Saturday of every month to support the Jackson Park playground construction. He thanked Keven & Karen Donaher, John Picariello, Chris Miles, Myriam Rosen, DPW Director Gino Cresta, Meninno Construction, Aggregate Industries, Swampscott Rotary Club & Moderator Markarian himself who all worked very hard on this project for a very long time with very little resources other than their own labor, materials and support.

Moderator Markarian introduced Cathy Cormier Precinct 2 TMM & acting Director of the Swampscott League of Women Voters who announced the league is currently seeking to reorganize and reenergize by working their leadership & rebuilding their membership. The League of Women Voters is a nonpartisan multiuse citizen's organization that has worked since 1920 to improve our government and engage all citizens and decisions that impact our lives. They operate at national, state & local levels throughout more than 800 state & local leagues.

She mentioned opening day of the Farmer's Market along with an update of the Swampscott Education Foundation's progress. She thanked former Education Foundation grants writer chair Suzanne Wright who worked very hard for many years & congratulated Suzanne Wright & Gargi Cooper for their recent election to the School Committee.

Moderator Markarian mentioned & remembered Conrad Chouinard, Gerald Kaloust & Larry Picariello who recently passed away.

Moderator Markarian recognized outgoing & incoming newly elected officials along with other Town Officials. Moderator Markarian also recognized his predecessor Martin Goldman who was thanked for his many years of service to the town.

Moderator Markarian introduced this year's chosen poet Laureates Abigail Rhoads & Nancy Hewitt. Poet Abigail read her poem "Your World". Poet Nancy Hewitt read her poem "Ellergy for the Chalkboard". Winners of the team poets' award Sophia Bereaud & Claire Weaver-Zemen will read their poems at tomorrow night's town meeting

ARTICLE 2. To hear and act on the reports of Town Officials, Boards and Committees.

Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen

To accept the report from Joe Crimmins TMM P2 & School Building Committee Chair with an update of the MSBA approval & proposal of the new Hadley Elementary School site.

To accept the report from Peter Spellios TMM P2 & Charter Review Committee Member with the Committees progress of reviewing the Charter & meeting with various town officials for feedback of updates & changes. The committee will report back again at a later Town Meeting.

To accept the report from Michael McClung TMM P4 Regionalization Committee Chair aka Article 6 Committee with an update on regionalization. The committee has been looking at surrounding cities & towns and why the town should regionalize, the benefits of regionalization, their work in progress and next steps.

To accept the report from Phil Bereaud Cultural Council Member with a brief update of what the Council does. The Committee was able to award 11 out of 12 grants this year. The committee is trying to expand their fundraising role.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to approve the Swampscott Retirement Board's vote to increase the cost of living base from \$13,000 to \$18,000 consistent with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 32, Section 103, as amended by Chapter 188, Section 19, of the Acts of 2010, or take any action related thereto.

Sponsored by the Swampscott Retirement Board

Comment: Retirees and survivors of the Swampscott Retirement System who are eligible to receive an annual cost of living adjustment receive that adjustment based only on the first \$13,000 of the retiree's allowance and the cost of living adjustment in any given year cannot exceed 3% by statute. Thus, in any given year the Swampscott Retirement Board can only grant a \$390 cost of living adjustment allowance. By increasing the base to \$18,000, the Board has the discretion to grant up to a 3% increase or an annual increase of \$540. Accordingly, by voting to increase the base to \$18,000, each eligible retiree and survivor of the Swampscott Retirement System will receive at maximum an additional \$12.50 per month in their retirement allowance each year.

The Retirement Board's actuary has calculated the change to the Retirement System's Present Value of Future Benefits (PVFB) to be approximately 2.3% of the existing liability, or \$2 million. The PVFB is the cost of the system for current employees, current retirees and beneficiaries if paid in a lump sum. However, similar to the effect of the change on the retiree's benefits, the cost of the benefit increase does not need to be paid all at once. Incorporating the additional cost into the existing 15-year funding schedule, the Fiscal 2016 contribution would increase by about \$200,000. Note that the increase in the contribution amount is expected to increase by approximately 4.0% per year over that 15 year period.

Comment: The Town has no current use, and will not likely have a future use, for this small parcel. Upon the sale of the parcel and recordation of the deed, the new owner would be responsible for the payment of property taxes thereon.

Comment: This proposed Zoning By-Law Amendment would allow awnings in the B-1 District and outlines guidelines for their installation.

Proposed	Amendment	3.2.2.6
Awnings for buildings containing non-residential uses are permitted subject to the requirements of Section 3.2.5.5. All awnings (and portions of the awnings/valences) shall be fixed or folding (retractable). Multiple awnings on a single building shall be consistent in size, profile and location and shall be limited to the first story of the building. Multi-tenant building awnings may vary in color but shall be located at the same height and have similar profiles to preserve the architectural lines of the building. Awnings shall not span numerous storefronts.		
3.2.2.6(a).	Permitted	
	a) Fire-resistant, water-repellant marine canvas material. Other material may be considered through Site Plan Review process.

Where lettering is desired on awnings, any lettering or graphics on an awning shall be counted towards the maximum area (s.f.) of exterior advertising signage otherwise permitted under this By-Law. The valance on an awning shall not exceed 10" in height. Awning lettering and signage shall be on a valance only and a maximum of 6" in height.

With regard to all existing awnings, a replacement of an awning or any change or alteration of lettering or graphics on an awning shall be considered a new awning and subject to the restrictions set forth in this section. When installing awnings, both signs and awnings shall be updated to comply with current signage by-law requirements.

All awnings shall undergo an Administrative Site Plan Review by the Planning Board.

ARTICLE 11.

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning By-Law Section 3.2.3.3, regarding contractor’s signs, by deleting the text of the current Section 3.2.2.6 in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the text set forth below, or take any action related thereto.

Comment: Approval of this amendment will allow contractor’s signs to be located on the project site before a building is constructed.

Proposed Amendment to 3.2.3.3

In all districts, one (1) contractor’s sign, not exceeding six (6) square feet in area, and not exceeding six (6) feet above grade as measured to the topmost portion of the sign, may be displayed in connection with the ongoing renovation or construction of a building. The sign shall be removed within the earlier to occur of (a) ninety (90) days following the issuance of the building permit permitting such work or project; or (b) ten (10) days following the completion of the work or project. Such sign shall be attached to the building, provided that:

1. such sign may be placed on a fence in front of the construction project solely in the event that the frame of such building is not yet constructed; or
2. such sign may be placed within ten (10) feet of the construction project, on the site of the land containing the construction project, solely in the event that:
 - a. the frame of such building is not yet constructed; and
 - b. a fence in front of the construction project is not yet constructed.

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning By-Law Sections 5.12.1.4 and 5.12.1.8, regarding drive-throughs, by deleting the text of the current Section 5.12.1.4 in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the text set forth below, and by amending Section 5.12.1.8, by inserting a new sentence as set forth in bold below with the existing text shown for informational purposes only, or take any action related thereto:.

Comment: This amendment will distinguish between different types of drive through locations and stacking requirements.

Proposed Amendment to 5.12.1.4
The vehicle stacking standards of this Section shall apply unless otherwise expressly approved by the Board. The Board may require additional stacking spaces where trip generation rates show that additional spaces will be needed. A minimum number of off-street vehicle stacking spaces for queuing purposes shall be based upon the approved use type. For the purposes of this Section 5.12.1.4., the dimension of each vehicle for the purposes of planning the stacking shall be twenty (20) feet in length by ten (10) feet in width.

Proposed Amendment to 5.12.1.8
The drive-through lane shall be designed to permit vehicles to leave or escape the drive-through lane without reversing the vehicle and without any obstruction that would prevent such vehicle to leave or escape. **The Board may waive such requirement based on the site layout, traffic patterns, parking, and stacking space requirements.**

ARTICLE 13. Comment: This Zoning By-Law amendment is proposed to define and allow the use of Medical Marijuana Treatment Center in the Industrial District, and to provide minimum distance requirements from schools and libraries.

Add a new use of Medical Marijuana Treatment Center to Section 2.2.0 (Regulations Pertaining to Medical Marijuana Treatment Facilities) as follows:

2.2.9. Medical Marijuana Treatment Center: A non-profit facility or location that has been registered by the Department of Public Health where medical marijuana is grown, processed and/or made available to a qualifying patient or a personal caregiver, provided that:

2.2.9.1 A medical marijuana treatment center shall not be located within one thousand feet (1,000') of an elementary school, middle school, high school, or public library in existence at the time of enactment of

the Zoning By-Law amendment establishing this use.

And, amend Table of Principal Uses – Principal Use Regulations in Section 2.2.3.0 to F. Industrial #8. Medical Marijuana Treatment Center as an allowed use in only the Industrial District with Site Plan Approval required (designated with a capital R in the last column of Table I) and not allowed in any other District (designated by the word “no” in the Table of Principle Uses as shown below.

Comment: This will change how lot area is calculated for building coverage ratios.

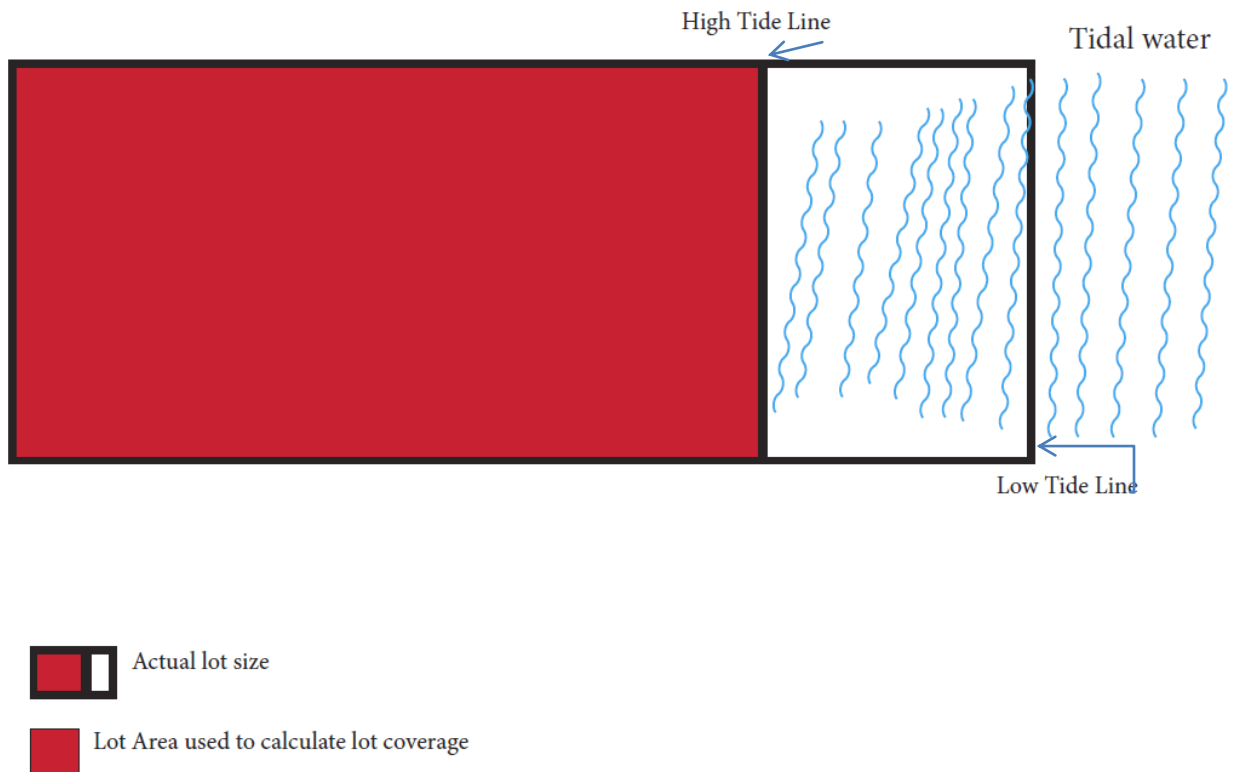
Proposed Amendment to Article VI. Definitions

Lot area:

The horizontal area within the exterior lines of the lot, exclusive of any area in a street, and exclusive of any horizontal area subject to oceanic tidal action but below mean high water or under any water body, bog, swamp, wet meadow, marsh, or other wetland as defined in G.L. c. 131, § 40, as may be amended.

Lot Area Calculation for coverage ratios will use the High Tide Water Mark as the coastal boundary.

ARTICLE 15. Comment: The purpose of the new overlay district is to establish preferred patterns of development and a design framework for the historic downtown district of Swampscott, and to protect the overall quality of the built environment in the district. This district seeks to allow new uses for property that may be redeveloped in the future, while respecting the scale and character of abutting residential neighborhoods. The new zoning overlay amendment and design guidelines would seek to balance aesthetics, energy efficiency, and sense of a "downtown" for the Swampscott community

ARTICLE 18.

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning By-Law, Section 4, by inserting the text shown in bold and underlined which amendment will bring the Town into compliance with FEMA requirements, with the existing text shown for informational purposes only

4.2.3.0. Location of District. The CFAOD is herein established as an overlay district. The CFAOD includes all special flood hazard areas within the Town of Swampscott designated as AE, AO, or VE on the Essex County Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for the administration of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). The map panels of the Essex County FIRM that are wholly or partially within the Town of Swampscott are panel number 25009C0531G, 25009C0532G, 25009C0533G and 25009C0534G dated July 16, 2014. The exact boundaries of the CFAOD may be defined by the 100-year base flood elevations shown on the FIRM and further defined by the Essex County Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report dated July 16, 2014. The FIRM and FIS report are incorporated herein by reference and are on file with the Town Clerk, Planning Board, and Inspector of Buildings.

Comment: FEMA has updated the flood zone maps for The Town of Swampscott. New or existing property owners located in the previously defined or newly defined flood zones are typically required by their lenders to obtain flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). In order for the above mentioned property owners to obtain flood insurance through NFIP, the Town must participate in the NFIP program. Adopting this zoning change will allow the Town to remain compliant with the NFIP.

A non-related issue is property owners disputing the new maps. These requests can be sent to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) by the property owners privately hired Professional Engineer or Land Surveyor by means of submitting an elevation certificate showing that the structure’s sill elevation is above the base flood elevation.


