 - 267-269 HUMPHREY STREET (MASS DEP #71-291) Request from the SARKIS DEVELOPMENT GROUP for a Certificate of Compliance for the work performed on the property. Property location: Map 2, Lot 198
- 4. Request for Determination of Applicability
 - 30 DANVERS ROAD Request by AGGREGATE INDUSTRIES, proposing minor modifications to existing holding lagoon, including construction of a concrete barrier, retrofitting existing weir (replacing wooden weir boards and other work), these activities will occur within the 100-foot Buffer Zone to Inland Bank and Land Under Water associated with Foster Pond. Project also includes placement of additional trap rock to the energy dissipater, which will not occur in buffer zone. Majority of activities to be done by hand, except excavation for concrete barrier. Best Management Practices will be utilized throughout the project to prevent erosion and sedimentation into resource areas.
