Dear Mayor Crowley and Members of the Municipal Council,

On February 16, 2010 the Development Impact Review Board met to review the application of Catherine Cyr to allow a Class II Kennel license and Special Permit Site Plan Review for a maximum 12 dog animal rescue facility at 80 Theresa Street, Taunton, Ma which requires a Special Permit/ Site Plan Review and a kennel license from the Municipal Council.

In considering the petition, the DIRB familiarized itself with the premises and examined the location, layout and other characteristics.

After reviewing the petition, plans and testimony, the DIRB finds that the petition was formally sufficient and submitted and reviewed in accordance with the procedures set forth in the Zoning Ordinance and that proper notice was given

The DIRB hereby recommends that any approval of this petition by the Municipal Council contain the following conditions:

Condition #1) That the plans dated November 29, 1993 shall govern with the following additional conditions;

Condition #2) The petitioner is proposing no exterior changes. As a result, if the Municipal Council grants the petition as presented, the following waivers must be approved by the Municipal Council in said approval;

- a. Waiver of the minimum lot size of one acre (only 28,027 sq ft is provided)
- b. Waiver of the requirement for each dog to have a shelter or dog house (none provided, all dogs are proposed to be housed in the house)
- c. That no more than three dogs shall be housed in the residential dwelling (12 maximum is proposed)
- d. That the dogs shall be housed at least 150 feet from the nearest residential dwelling (estimated closest dwelling is 113 feet)

Condition #3) That an 18 foot by 18 foot gravel area be provided on the easterly side of the driveway to meet the minimum parking requirement for the residence/ business use

Condition #4) A set of updated plans shall be submitted that conforms to all of the requirements of this decision. Two sets are required
