Re: All Terrain Vehicles and the Whitesmith Condominiums

Dear Mayor and Councilors:

You have referred to this office the question of whether the City can place barriers at the rear of the Whitesmith Condominium complex to prevent All Terrain Vehicles from trespassing upon property of the Condominium Association.

Our research indicates that the land immediately abutting the rear of the condominium is a railroad right of way and is still assessed as such by the Board of Assessors. The City cannot erect barriers on private property or on property outside of its jurisdiction except in very extraordinary circumstances or in accordance with a Court order. The erection of a barrier at the rear of the condominium property by the City would be an unlawful trespass and an interference with the lawful right of way. The City can place barriers surrounding its own property and the condominium association would be within its rights to construct a fence on its own to keep vehicles from trespassing from the rear. However, since the City cannot interfere with the railroad right of way, no barrier created by the City can prevent ATVs from accessing the right of way, legally or not, through private property that does not have such a barrier and, while the City can enforce trespass laws against ATVs using that right of way, it can only do so if there is an actual trespass or blatant attempt to trespass and it can only prevent the use of the right of way by policing, not by the erection of barriers on private property.

The condominium association would be advised to consider erecting their own fence or contacting the railroad with regard to barriers between the right of way and
