RE:

Spadina Avenue Discontinuance

Our records indicate that Spadina Avenue is an unconstructed private way located in East Taunton. The layout for the roadway was established as part of "Central Homestead Park", in August, 1915, but was never constructed.

As a private way with no known owner, all abutters have rights to the centerline of the layout. The abutters include the petitioners as well as 65 Sherborne Street and 83 Sherborne Street, and should be included in the discussion.

It is my understanding that once discontinued, the land within the layout then becomes part of these abutting properties. A discontinuance plan is needed to show this work, and deeds filed to show new ownership.

Because the roadway has not been constructed, is not needed for access to any of the abutting properties, and is likely to never be built, I recommend that Spadina Avenue be discontinued as a way.

RE: Spadina Avenue - Discontinuance

Dear Mayor Hoye and Members of the Municipal Council:

Please be advised that at our regularly scheduled meeting held on March 1, 2012 the Taunton Planning Board was in receipt of the public hearing request for the Discontinuance of Spadina Avenue submitted by Diane Maki, 67 Caswell St. and Edward & Patricia Arcikowski, 59 Caswell St., Taunton, Ma.

After some discussion the Board concluded they have no objection to an abutter pursing the discontinuance of a "paper street." However, since the street is not a public way, was not laid out by the City, no Cityowned land abuts it, and there are no Cityowned or other public utilities within the layout, it is beyond the scope of the City's authority to discontinue the street. In fact, the Board believes that such an action may expose the City to potential liability by appearing to eliminate a layout to which the abutters, including the non-petitioners have specific rights. The Board suggests that the City waive any rights it may have in the street layout and further suggests the abutters pursue elimination of the layout through Land Court or by entering into an agreement amongst <u>all</u> of abutters and following that up with a "Form A" plan to document the new property division lines.

Dear Property Manager:

I have received numerous complaints from City Councilors regarding the trash within the plaza and along the grassed banks on both the Washington Street and the Frederick R. Martin Sr. Parkway sides of the property.

It is your responsibility as the property owner to ensure that the plaza and its landscaped areas are kept clean and free of debris at all times. The banks along the sidewalks are littered with cigarette butts, paper, and other debris which is unsightly. It is also considered a wetlands violation as it is within the Riverfront Area of the Mill River on both banks mentioned in the above paragraph.

The Taunton Conservation Commission and City Officials expect you, as the property owner and manager, to maintain these areas. If you fail to clean the plaza and landscaped areas and keep them free of debris, the Conservation Commission will have no other choice but to issue a Violation Notification that could result in monetary fines under the Wetland Protection Act, Rivers Act, and Taunton Conservation By-Law.

Libby Lane (Libby Estates, Taunton)

- 1. Recommend to install 1-70watt high-pressure sodium light on Standard # 1 Libby Lane. Per customer request.
 - Estimate cost is \$ 5.29 per month
 - Does not include fuel adjustment credit

Blake Street (Lagoon Landing, Taunton)

- 2. Recommend to install 2-70watt high-pressure sodium light on Standard # 1 & Standard # 2 Blake St. Per customer request.
 - Estimate cost is \$ 10.58 per month
 - Does not include fuel adjustment credit

My wife Lisa and I are organizing our 4th annual road race to benefit Universal Newborn Screening and Hunter's Hope. The loan order for \$230,000 is an amendment to the loan order which was previously approved by the Council and the Mayor on June 22, 2010.

\$230,000 is appropriated in addition to the \$6,300,000 previously appropriated for the purpose of financing the construction of various improvements to the City's water system, including without limitation the laying and relaying of water mains in various City streets, the replacement of City water meters and meter information collection system and the construction of well pumping appurtenances, chemical feed systems and water main replacements associated with the Dever Wells and including without limitation all costs thereof as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C of the General Laws; that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow \$230,000 and issue bonds or notes therefor under Chapter 44 of the General Laws and/or Chapter 29C of the General Laws; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City unless the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor determines that they should be issued as limited obligations and may be secured by local system revenues as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C; that the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust established pursuant to Chapter 29C and in connection therewith to enter into a loan agreement and/or a security agreement with the Trust and otherwise to contract with the Trust and the Department of Environmental Protection with respect to such loan and for any federal or state aid available for the project of for the financing thereof; and that the Mayor is authorized to enter into a project regulatory agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection, to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary to carry out the project.


