Dear Mayor Crowley and Members of the Municipal Council,

This letter is in regards to the access issues on Johnson Court in the area of 64 Weir Street. At the request of Council Croteau, we have looked at the suitability of the current access through Johnson's Court. We have attached a copy of two site plans for this area which includes the engineering templates for the required turning radius for a 45' 7 inch fire truck on plan 1 and the required turning radius for a WB-60 semi trailer (60 foot wheelbase, 65 foot total length) on plan 2 to safely access Johnsons Court and be able to make the turn at the rear of 62 Weir Street. This access is necessary regardless of what uses are operating in any of the abutting buildings.

What the templates show is that in both cases the 45'7 inch fire truck and the 60 foot wheel base semi-trailer can navigate the entrance to Johnson's Court and make the turn to the rear of 62 Weir Street with the fire lane enforced on the side and rear of 62 Weir Street. However, the turn would be safer and easier if parking were restricted on the South side of Johnson Court (abutting the Mill River) as well. There is also a fire hydrant on this side that must remain accessible. The existing parking prohibition to the rear of 62 Weir Street has been compromised in that the owner of #62 has striped the area with parking spaces. These parking spaces have not been approved by any site plan review as is required and is therefore a zoning violation. These parking spaces should be removed and the parking prohibition restored and enforced in this area. Finally, the fire lane on the easterly side of Johnsons Court abutting bldg #2 64 Weir Street should be restriped in that it is faded and not readily readable and the vehicles and trailers parked on the westerly side of Johnsons Court behind numbers 32 through 48 Weir Street should be removed and no parking instituted along this area to provide sufficient width for emergency vehicles and 2 way traffic to access through this area.





Dear Mr. Mayor,

I want to inform you that Section 34 of the Governor's FY '11 Supplemental Budget, filed the same day as his FY '12 budget recommendations, includes the conveyance of surplus land in Taunton.

The specific language and parcels named in the bill are as follows:

SECTION 34. (a) Notwithstanding sections 40E to 40I, inclusive, of chapter 7 of the General Laws or any other general or special law to the contrary, in order to facilitate the reuse of the properties identified in subsection (b) and to generate non-tax revenues for the commonwealth, the commissioner of capital asset management and maintenance may sell, lease for terms up to 99 years including all renewals and extensions, or otherwise grant, convey or transfer to purchasers or lessees an interest in any of those properties, or portions thereof, subject to this section and on the terms and conditions that the commissioner considers appropriate. The commissioner shall dispose of each property, or portions thereof, using appropriate competitive bidding processes and procedures. At least 30 days before the date on which bids, proposals or other offers to purchase or lease a property, or any portion thereof, are due, the commissioner shall place a notice in the central register published by the state secretary under section 20A of chapter 9 of the General Laws stating the availability of the property, the nature of the competitive bidding process and other information that he considers relevant, including the time, place and manner for the submission of bids and proposals and the opening of the bids or proposals.

- (b) This section shall apply to the following properties:-
- (8) Those certain parcel of lands located in the city of Taunton on Stanley avenue or portions thereof, containing approximately .32 acres, together with any buildings and structures thereon.
- (9) Those certain parcels of land located in the city of Taunton at the Taunton state hospital, or portions thereof, containing approximately 26.5 acres in the aggregate, together with any buildings or structures thereon.

The language in Section 34 calls for the expeditious sale of the property. This will result in a suspension of some of the standard protocol, such as public hearing. The proceeds of the sale will go to the General Fund.
