PART II REVISED ORDINANCES

Chapter 1

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

Dear Honorable Council Members;

This letter is a formal request to the Council that I officially remove and dismantle Engine 21 from service.

Engine 21, a 1988 pumper has served the city well but has outlived its usefulness and is currently categorized as being out of service. The vehicle is in need of a new motor and a complete refurbishment. I do not believe that expending the kind of money needed to get this engine back into working order would be a sound investment for the city. The city would still have 5 frontline engines and a capable spare piece in Engine 22. It is my recommendation that we remove all usable parts from the truck and have a salvage company scrap the remaining truck body. No city funds will be required to recycle this vehicle. I would like to use any funds that we receive from the salvage company to help purchased a new Thermal Imaging Camera for the Fire Department. Our current cameras are old and bulky. They were purchase over 12 years ago and the technology has improved significantly since that time.

Dear honorable members;

Today I am appalled to learn that not only has a new trash tax of \$73.00 a year been approved by your body. But we will also continue to pay the \$1.00 tax fee for the trash bags. I consider this double dipping and am ashamed by your behavior.

When the 73.00 was first discussed, I thought it was doing away with the \$1.00 trash bag tax fee. I would have preferred to pay \$2.00 a bag tax than be charged a flat tax fee for the following reasons.

- People are more apt to recycle when they have to pay a per bag tax fee.
- People pay for the amount of trash THEY create.

My husband and I only have a bag of trash every two to three weeks. Now it is going to cost us 3.80 or 5.20 for each trash bag we put out. We will have to pay \$1.00 for the bag tax fee and 2.80 or 4.20 for two or three week's worth of your new flat tax fee. This is OUTRAGEOUS. You can see why \$2.00 a bag looks good to me.

This is a four to five fold increase in tax fees for us. Yes, we are senior citizens and we are on a limited income. We recycle all products that we can. We compost as much as we can. And we even recycle our cooking oil by taking it to the dump.

Government is out of hand and I am going to start with you. All of the Councilors get a stipend of 10,000.00 a year. This is an OUTRAGEOUS amount of money. Councilors like most local government elected officials were volunteers. They received a very small amount of money for their time. Many elected officials received nothing.

\$10,000 is more than some people make for the entire year. There are many Senior Citizens that receive less than \$10,000 a year on Social Security.

Please review your vote from last week, rethink what you did, and change it as soon as you can.
