

Dear Mayor Hoye and Members of the Municipal Council,

In March I had given you copies of letters written to the property managers/owners of the above properties regarding concerns about trash within the plazas, the drainage swale on County Street, and possible trash falling into the Mill River at 17 Park Street.

I have spoken with all the property owners and responsible parties within the plazas regarding the issues with which the Municipal Council was concerned. The manager at Olive Garden will be taking care of the swale at 1 Mozzone Boulevard. The individual stores within the Mill River Plaza will be responsible for their areas. CVS is responsible for the bank along Frederick R. Martin Parkway.

I did a site walk with the owner's representative at 17 Park Street. The siltation barrier was refreshed and trash was cleaned up. There is no indication of siltation into the river and the boom is still in place along the bank of the river.

RE: Harts Four Corners Pedestrian Signals Timing Concerns

Dear City Clerk Rose Marie Blackwell:

Per City Council request, I have investigated concerns about the pedestrian crossing timing at Harts 4 Corners intersection. On Thursday 4/26/12, I observed the operation of the traffic signals from 4 - 4:30 pm and again on Friday, 4/27/12, from 7-7:30 am. I found the intersection operating/functioning properly according to its permit. I actuated the pedestrian signals several times and it performed properly each time. For this intersection, the permit calls for a total of 26 seconds of walk time in the pedestrian phase of operation: 7 seconds of white "Walk/Man" display, 18 seconds of orange flashing "Don't Walk/Hand" display, and 1 second of a solid orange "Don't Walk/Hand" display before signaling traffic to flow again. The 26 seconds is divided into 3 segments: White "Walk/Man", orange flashing "Don't Walk/Hand", and an orange solid "Don't Walk/Hand" displays. The industry standard for designing the operation of pedestrian crossings is as follows: For pedestrian crossings that have "Walk/Don't Walk" displays but no "seconds countdown" display, it is intended for the pedestrian to cross the roadway while the pedestrian signal display operates through the 3 segments described previously. Upon start of the pedestrian cycle, a white "Walk/Man" display illuminates for a short period of time (typically 6-8 seconds depending on length of road crossing), then a flashing orange "Don't Walk/Hand" display illuminates for the remaining allowed walk time across the roadway (typically 10-20 seconds depending on length of road crossing), then the pedestrian signal displays a solid/constant orange "Don't Walk/Hand" display informing the pedestrian that the walk time has ended and traffic will be signaled to flow again. The theory behind the orange flashing "Don't Walk/Hand" display is to inform the pedestrian that the walk cycle is approximately half over so the pedestrian is aware that if he/she is not halfway across the roadway at that time, then he/she needs to speed up his/her pace to make it across the road before traffic is allowed to flow again. This procedure can be confusing and misleading to the average pedestrian, but is one of the industry standards used globally. Newer methods are available, such as countdown displays which actually display the seconds left in the pedestrian cycle so the pedestrian actually knows the amount of time he/she has before traffic is allowed to flow again. We have started installing this type of "countdown" pedestrian signal at various intersections in the City. I suggest and propose that the City of Taunton consider utilizing "Countdown" pedestrian signals at its heavily traveled pedestrian crossings.
