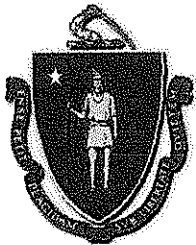
\$8,331,000 is appropriated for the purpose of financing the construction of improvements to the City's wastewater system, including but not limited to: Winthrop Street, Williams Street (Duffy Drive, Phyllis Road, Barbara Road, Ellen Road, Baylis Road, Donna Terrace, Mary Drive, Marilyn Drive), Davenport Terrace and Matthew's Landing and any other water pollution abatement improvements, all in accordance with the City's Comprehensive Wastewater Management Plan, including without limitation all costs thereof as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C of the General Laws; that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow **\$8,331,000** and issue bonds or notes therefore under G.L. c44 §8(15) or §7(1) or any other enabling legislation and/or Chapter 29C of the General Laws; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City unless the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor determines that they should be issued as limited obligations and may be secured by local system revenues as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C; that the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust established pursuant to Chapter 29C

and in connection therewith to enter into a loan agreement and/or a security agreement with the Trust and otherwise to contract with the Trust and the Department of Environmental Protection with respect to such loan and for any federal or state aid available for the project or for the financing thereof; and that the Treasurer or the Mayor is authorized to enter into a project regulatory agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection, to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary to carry out the project.

Dear Mayor Crowley:

On October 31st, we wrote an opinion for the City detailing the process required for the City to accept from the Taunton Development Corporation (TDC) a parcel of land described in **SECTION 9** of **CHAPTER 395** of the **Acts of 2002** ("the Act"). Section 9 of the Act requires that "recreational area 'A'" (as described therein), "shall be maintained as a recreational area unless and until the Taunton Development Corporation ["TDC"] provides to the City of Taunton 25.20 acres or more of contiguous comparable land within North Taunton, to be approved by a vote of the city council and mayor."

Our October 31 opinion concluded that the Act required approval of the City's Parks and Recreation Commission ("Commission") for the City to accept the substitute land from the TDC. Our opinion relied on conflicts between the Act and other state laws and the apparent purpose of the Act. Those factors led us to conclude that the best reading of the Act required the City to designate the substitute parcel to be used for recreational uses only, in order to release "recreational area 'A'" from the recreational use restriction placed on it by the Act. In that case, the Commission's approval of the transfer would be necessary.


Since October 31st, a further review of the legislative history of the Act has caused us to alter our original opinion. The Legislature amended an earlier version of the Act to eliminate language requiring that the substitute parcel be designated for recreational uses only. The Legislature's express consideration and rejection of that requirement should be sufficient to override the apparent purpose of the Act, which was to create comparable recreational land.


Given this newly acquired information regarding the legislative history of the Act, our opinion now is that the Act does **not** require the approval of the Commission for the City to accept title to the substitute parcel from the TDC, only an affirmative vote of the City Council and the Mayor.

RE: Transfer and Use of Property per Chapter 395
of the Acts of 2002

Issue

How does the City of Taunton ("City") proceed in acquiring from the Taunton Development Corporation ("TDC") a 25.2-acre parcel of land as a substitute for the land described by Section 9 of Chapter 395 of the Acts of 2002 ("Act")?

Answer

In our opinion, based upon the facts you have provided to us and for the reasons described below, any acquisition of a substitute parcel of land must be approved by the Municipal Council and Mayor only, and not by the Park and Recreation Commission.

Facts

You have provided us with the following facts. TDC is considering using the 25.2-acre parcel of land identified by Section 9 of the Act and restricted to recreational use ("Recreational Area A") for non-recreational purposes. You have also provided us with an advisory opinion regarding a draft version of the Act, dated April 16, 2002 and prepared by the City's former City Solicitor ("2002 Opinion") from which we have gathered additional facts.

Law and Analysis

The use of Recreational Area A is governed by Section 9 of the Act. Section 9 of the Act states that Recreational Area A "shall be maintained as a recreational area unless and until the Taunton Development Corporation provides to the city of Taunton 25.20 acres or more of contiguous, comparable land within North Taunton, to be approved by a vote of the city council and mayor."

Section 9 of the Act makes clear that Recreational Area A can only be used for recreational purposes until TDC grants to the City an alternate 25.2-acre parcel (“Substitute Parcel”) located in North Taunton and comparable to Recreational Area A. The Act also makes clear that the City’s Municipal Council (“Council”) and Mayor must approve of the Substitute Parcel.

Based upon the absence of any provision in the Act regarding the use of the Substitute Parcel and upon the 2002 Opinion, which essentially opined that the City’s Park and Recreation Commission (“Commission”) holds the power and authority to acquire and approve the acquisition of the Substitute Parcel per G.L. c. 45, § 14 and Section 15-42 of the City of Taunton Revised Ordinances (“Ordinances”), the question arose as to whether the Act requires the City to acquire the Substitute Parcel, acting by and through the Council with Mayor approval, or acting by and through the Commission with Council and Mayor approval.¹

Whether the Act requires the City to acquire the Substitute Parcel, acting by and through the Council and Mayor, or acting by and through the Commission with Council and Mayor approval, depends upon whether or not the Act requires the Substitute Parcel to be used for recreational purposes. Unfortunately, the Act is silent with regard to the question as to whether the use of the Substitute Parcel must be restricted to recreational purposes. The Act does not expressly restrict the Substitute Parcel to recreational use nor expressly affirm that the Substitute Parcel may be used for any specific or general municipal purpose.

If the Act were to require the City to hold the Substitute Parcel for recreational use, then the City would need to acquire the Substitute Parcel, acting by and through the Commission, pursuant to the Commission’s enabling act (St. 1980, c. 569, the “Commission’s Enabling Act”), G.L. c. 45, §§ 3 and 15, G.L. c. 40, § 14,² and Section 15-42³ of the Ordinances, which collectively empower the Commission to acquire and control recreational land within the City. Alternatively, if the Act were to allow use of any Substitute Parcel for other, non-recreational purposes, then G.L. c. 40, § 14 empowers the Council to acquire and control the Substitute Parcel without approval by the Commission.

When questions regarding the interpretation of statutes arise, affected parties and the courts apply various rules of statutory construction to interpret those statutes. The cardinal rule of statutory construction is that we must presume that a legislature says in a statute what it means

¹ Massachusetts law provides for several ways municipalities can hold property. Although title to City property is acquired by and vests in the City, City property is acquired as authorized by statute, by a particular public body typically for a specific municipal purpose. The acquired property remains under the care, custody and control of that public body for that specific municipal purpose until the controlling public body determines that it is no longer need for such purpose and declares it surplus under G.L. c. 40, § 15A, at which time the municipality’s legislative body can vote to dispose of the municipal property. See G.L. c. 40, § 15A; Harris v. Town of Wayland, 392 Mass. 237, 240 (1984).

² G.L. c. 40, § 14 states in part that the Council “may purchase, or take by eminent domain ... any land, easement or right ... for any municipal purpose for which the purchase or taking of land, easement or right therein is not otherwise authorized or directed by statute; [provided] the taking or purchase thereof has previously been authorized by the city council” See G.L. c. 40, § 14 (emphasis added); see also G.L. c. 4, § 7.

³ Section 15-42 states that, “[a]s provided by statute (Chapter 45 of the General Laws), the [C]ommission shall exercise the powers and duties contained therein as to parks, playgrounds and public domains, and specifically as contained in Section 14 with regard to recreational programs, except the [C]ommission shall not make appropriations of money.”

and means in a statute what it says. Connecticut Nat'l Bank v. Germain, 503 U.S. 249, 253-54 (1992).

Because the Act is silent with respect to restricting the use of the Substitute Parcel, any construction of the Act that the City's use of the Substitute Parcel must be restricted to recreational purposes must necessarily be based upon an assumption that because the Act restricts Recreational Area A to recreational use until TDC grants to the City comparable land, the Substitute Parcel must also be restricted to recreational use.

Ultimately though, based upon the above-referenced cardinal rule of statutory construction, the better interpretation of the Act is that because the Act does not expressly restrict the use of the Substitute Parcel or expressly require Commission participation in the acquisition of the Substitute Parcel, the Act does not impose any restrictions on the Substitute Parcel and the City may use the Substitute Parcel for any municipal purpose. If the Act does not impose any restrictions on the Substitute Parcel, then the City, acting by and through the Council (with the Mayor's approval under Section 9 of the Act), may acquire the Substitute Parcel for any municipal purpose pursuant to G.L. c. 40, § 14 without approval by the Commission.

Although that cardinal rule of construction should be a sufficient basis to establish that the Council may acquire and ultimately control the Substitute Parcel without approval by the Commission, the legislative history of the Act provides further support that the legislature intended that the Substitute Parcel not be restricted to recreational use.

As of January 2001, a draft version of Section 9 of the Act stated that Recreational Area A "shall be maintained as a recreational area unless and until the Taunton Development Corporation provides to the City of Taunton 25.20 acres of comparable land within the city for recreational uses." See Massachusetts' Senate Bill No. 1591 of the 2001-2002 session of the legislature (emphasis added). As of April 2002, according to the 2002 Opinion, a subsequent draft version of Section 9 of the Act stated that Recreational Area A "shall be maintained as a recreational area unless and until the Taunton Development Corporation provides to the City of Taunton 25.20 acres of comparable land within the city for recreational purposes." See the 2002 Opinion (emphasis added).

Both draft versions of the Act clearly indicate that the legislature considered whether to restrict the use of the Substitute Parcel to recreational purposes. The final version of the Act, as amended and approved on December 11, 2002, did not contain any such restrictions however. See St. 2002, c. 395, § 9. Even though the legislature clearly considered imposing such restrictions, because the final version of the Act contains no use restrictions on the Substitute Parcel, the legislative history of the Act substantiates the legislature's intent not to restrict the City's use of the Substitute Parcel to recreational purposes.

Please note that we have not performed any title examination in connection with your request for a legal opinion and are basing our opinion solely upon the information provided. We are not making any representations or warranties with regard to title or to the City's rights to Recreational Area A. This opinion is being furnished to you solely for your benefit. This opinion is limited to matters as of the date hereof, and we specifically disclaim any obligation to address any subsequent changes in facts or the law.

Conclusion

Based upon the express provisions of the Act and the Act's legislative history, the City may accept and approve a Substitute Parcel acting by and through the Municipal Council and the Mayor, without the approval of the City's Park and Recreation Commission. The legislative history of the Act supports a conclusion that the Act does not require that the Substitute Parcel be designated for recreational uses at the time the City accepts title.

Resolved that the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton, Massachusetts designate ^{MAYOR}Richard Shafer, acting as and through the Taunton Development Corporation (TDC), as the responsible individual and entity for developing proposed development districts, invested revenue districts, development programs, and invested revenue district development programs and for seeking local approvals for said items under the District Improvement Financing statute (M.G.L. c.40Q) on behalf of the Municipal Council pursuant to the Council's authority.

Resolved that the Municipal Council approve the creation and designation of the proposed approximately [insert correct number, see below] acre Dever School Phase IV and V Development District, Development Program, Invested Revenue District, and Invested Revenue District Development Program as described within the District Improvement Financing application for a period of twenty (20) years.

Resolved that the Municipal Council authorize thirty-five percent (35%) of the incremental captured assessed value from the District per year be applied to the Development Program on a year-to-year basis to pay for the municipal improvements and costs associated with the development of the park.

Resolved that the Municipal Council authorize the submission of the Dever School Phase IV and V District Improvement Financing application to the Massachusetts Economic Assistance Coordinating Council for its review and consideration.

If Prospect Hill Street, 55.7 acres (Parcel I.D. # 25-148 & 25-149)

Resolved that the Municipal Council authorize the submission of the Dever School Phase IV and V District Improvement Financing application to the Massachusetts Economic Assistance Coordinating Council for its review and consideration.

Resolved, that Lot 77E in the Myles Standish Industrial Park (Lot 77E) and shown on the plan entitled "Subdivision Plan," dated August 14, 2002, last revised August 26, 2002, and recorded at the Bristol County Registry of Deeds Northern District in Plan Book 412, Page 34, which contains approximately 28.805 acres of contiguous land within North Taunton according to such plan, is comparable to that certain recreational land located in the Myles Standish Industrial Park designated as Recreational Area A and further described by Section 9 of Chapter 395 of the Acts of 2002 (2002 Act).

Resolved, that the City, acting by and through the Municipal Council, accept from TDC the grant of Lot 77E in lieu of Recreational Area A described in the 2002 Act for general municipal purposes pursuant to the quitclaim deed before us.

Resolved, that Lot 77E shall remain in its current natural condition and shall not be used for recreational purposes.



At the Council Meeting on October 18, 2011, you directed that the Safety Officer investigate reports of hedges overgrown and interfering with traffic at Bay and Jefferson Streets. 

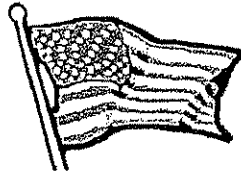


