Chapter 14

OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Sec 14-19. Certain video or mechanical devices

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

That Section 14-19 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, be and hereby are further amended by adding the following:

Sec. 14-19 – in section (b) delete the wording “having a multiple coin in take feature” and insert the wording - “designed to take currency or credit”.

All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

Chapter 13

Motor Vehicles and Traffic

Sec 13-94. Uninspected Vehicles

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

That the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, be and hereby are further amended by adding the following section:

Section 13-94. Uninspected Vehicles.

No person shall cause to be parked on a public way or public property any vehicle that is required to be inspected pursuant to M.G.L. Chapter 90, which displays an inspection sticker that is more than one month, expired. Any vehicle so parked shall be cited under this Section for a fine of \$50.00. Each day the vehicle remains uninspected and parked in violation of this Section shall constitute a separate offense.

All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

ARTICLE III. STOPPING STANDING & PARKING

**Sec 13-81 Same—Trucks loading and unloading;
license for loading, etc., penalty for violation**

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

That Section 13-81 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, be and hereby are further amended by adding the following:

Sec. 13-81 – in (a) and (b) delete the word “overnight” and add “anytime between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am”.

All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

AN ORDINANCE

Chapter 13

Sec 13-82. Prohibited parking places.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

That Section 13-82 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, be and hereby are further amended by adding thereto the following:

- Delete in its entirety: Bay Street, (Watson’s Pond) on west side for a distance of 20 feet on both sides of the entrance to the park in front of Watson Pond State Park.
- Delete only “from dusk to dawn”. Bay Street, (front of Watson’s Pond) on west side from #1714 Bay Street for a distance of 1,200 feet south along the front of Watson Pond State Park.

All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

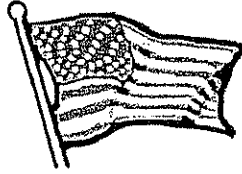
