At their regular meeting on Tuesday, April 2, 2013, your Bristol-Plymouth Regional Technical School District Committee voted to approve the FY 2014 budget. Prior to the regular meeting, a public hearing was held in accordance with the notice posted in all member communities and advertised through a legal notice in The Enterprise.

Information regarding the approved budget and the assessment to the City of Taunton, as well as the assessments to the other district communities, is enclosed. The City of Taunton FY 2014 total assessment is \$4,326,732. Please note that the figures presented here are based upon the latest available information from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Department of Education.

As in previous years, the FY 2014 budget reflects community assessments at the minimum required level. These levels are established by the regional agreement, the Massachusetts Department of Education and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts based on the Governor's budget. Should these figures change, we will adjust as necessary and notify our communities accordingly.
