- (a) Definition. For purposes of this section, the word "kennel" shall be one pack or collection of dogs on a single lot, whether maintained for breeding, boarding, sale, training, hunting, or other purposes and including any shop where dogs are on sale, and also including every pack or collection of dogs three months old or over owned or kept on a single lot irrespective of the purpose for which they are maintained.
- (b) A public hearing before the Municipal Council shall be required prior to the issuance of a new class I, class II or Class III kennel license subject to M.G.L. Chapter 140, sec137A. Annual renewals are also subject to a public hearing but may have the public hearing waived by majority vote of the Municipal Council. The owner of the property must be the petitioner for the kennel license.
- (C) Kennel licenses shall be classified as grade one for keeping four to six dogs; grade two for keeping seven to twelve dogs; and grade three for keeping more than twelve dogs
- (d) The Municipal Council may authorize the issuance of a grade one license after public hearing and upon the applicants' written certification of the following:
 - (1) That the premises upon which the dogs are to be kept contain one half (1/2) or more acres;
 - (2) That each dog to be kept on the premises has received all required shots and/or vaccinations;
 - (3) That each dog subject to the license is disease free, adequately nourished and otherwise in good health;
 - (4) That the keeper of the dogs subject to the license will obey the leash law;
 - (5) That the keeper of the dogs under the license will obey the laws relating to excessively barking dogs;
 - (6) That the dogs will be housed, sheltered, or kept a minimum of one hundred (100') feet from the nearest residential dwelling.
 - (7) That the premises upon which the dogs are to be kept shall be open to inspection by the Chief of Police or the Animal Control Officer at any time in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 140, sec137C.
 - (8) That the premises upon which the dogs are to be kept are subject to a Special Permit issued by the Municipal Council pursuant to section 5.2 of the Zoning Ordinance only if used for a commercial purpose.

The residents of the Viking and Seaver Street neighborhood would respectfully request the denial of the application for a kennel permit for the owner of 1 Seaver Street, Joan Kilroy for the following reasons:

- 1. The dogs currently owned by the petitioner and residing at the residence are a danger and a nuisance as defined in MGL Part I/Title XX/Chapter140/Section157. At least 2 of the dogs are a constant and disruptive nuisance in the neighborhood with prolonged and frequent barking at all times of the day including many mornings and weekends when people and their children may be sleeping, trying to enjoy quiet family time, watching television as a family or engaging in other relaxing activities that are severely disrupted by the incessant barking of these dogs. In particular, the German Shepard has a very loud and vicious sounding bark, and the beagle has an ear piercing yowl that does not cease. The littlest sounds, distractions or normal neighborhood activities set off these animals and their barking does no cease for long stretches of time, sometimes tens of minutes to over an hour. These prolonged episodes of barking are often accompanied by the dogs lunging and biting at the fences as people quietly and peacefully walk by the property.
- 2. In particular, the German Shepard is very dangerous. The owner has bragged on multiple occasions that it's a "trained police dog". The dog most definitely displays highly aggressive behavior as people walk by the fence, which is in terrible disrepair and has multiple holes that the dogs have escaped through more than a few times. This particular dog has shown the ability to get its chest and head above this less than adequate short fence and has scared children in the neighborhood, some who will not walk past the house anymore. The dog barks in a vicious manner and leaps at and bites at the chain link. This behavior also seems to stir up the other dogs even worse. Many times this dog is let out into the back yard with the others and left unattended to act out at anyone unlucky enough to walk by.
- 3. Some of the dogs have escaped through one particular area of the fence where a "gate" has been crudely pieced together from a single board and a very inadequate bungee cord. And even with a chain and a bungee, there is a significant gap that any of the dogs easily slip through. The dogs have been seem roaming the neighborhood, keeping some residents in their homes until the dogs are eventually tracked down. This fence overall is extremely inadequate for all of the dogs.


- 4. The fence has also been dangerously (possibly illegally) equipped with an electric wire running its entire length, including sections abutting neighboring property for long stretches. This is a metal fence throughout! How can that be a) legal and b) safe??? Not only safe for the abutting residents, but for the dogs???
- 5. The residence is so small and in ill repair and upkeep. How is that safe or adequate to house 2 dogs, never mind now 4 and possibly 6 if this permit is granted?? And there are at least 2 cats that can be seen in the windows at various times! A residence should be large enough and adequate enough at all times when housing pets.
- 6. It appears that the application states some false information. The owner claims that there is no kennel. There is a small wire fence kennel in clear view in the side yard area to the left of the house. The dogs are frequently left in the kennel both when the owner leaves and when the owner is in the house. The dogs bark most frequently, most loudly, and for the longest stretches when left out in the kennel. This kennel in nowhere near large enough or secure enough to house this many aggressive and unruly dogs. It begs the question: what kind of person stuffs this many dogs in a kennel made for just the one bigger dog? A person who deserves a permit for 6 dogs??
- 7. The dogs are never seen being walked or taken out of the home. While it is possible that this may happen unseen, it is unlikely since no one in the neighborhood has seen it and the vehicles there look to be incapable of transporting that many large dogs. That many large dogs in a small environment getting too little outside exercise is just a recipe for encouraging and creating even more bad and aggressive behavior. Again we ask, how can the pet load here be allowed or increased?

In summary, the residents are respectfully requesting that the permit be denied and that an investigation of the conditions be performed by the animal control officer or pertinent authorities to avoid any future problems and to hopefully improve the current condition based on the above facts and evidence. Thank you very much for your time and attention to this request.
