Order for a second reading to be ordained on a roll call vote

Ordered That,

\$800,000 is appropriated in addition to the **\$6,000,000** previously appropriated for the purpose of financing the construction, reconstruction, replacement, repair and rehabilitation of sewers and storm water conveyance facilities, including without limitation sewer infiltration and inflow abatement improvements and pumping station upgrades, including the Phase 8 SSES, for the purposes of eliminating unauthorized sewer connections to the City's drainage system, to eliminate combined sewer overflows and sanitary sewer overflows, to reduce infiltration and inflow within the City's sewer system and to mitigate flooding and surface water contamination; that included are all costs without limitation as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C of the Massachusetts General Laws; that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow **\$6,800,000** and issue bonds or notes therefor under Chapter 44 of the General Laws and/or Chapter 29C of the General Laws; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City unless the Treasurer with the

approval of the Mayor determines that they should be issued as limited obligations and may be secured by local system revenues as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C; that the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust established pursuant to Chapter 29C and in connection therewith to enter into a financing agreement with the Trust and otherwise to contract with the Trust and the Department of Environmental Protection with respect to such loan and for any federal or state aid available for the project of for the financing thereof; and that the Mayor is authorized to enter into a project regulatory agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection, to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary to carry out the project.

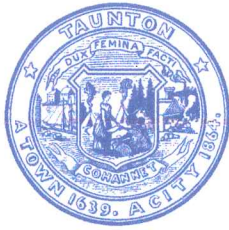

Subject: Request for Waiver of Street Opening Moratorium, Hodges St., Map 33, Lot 5

Dear Mayor and Municipal Council:


Enclosed are three copies of a site plan for a proposed new dwelling on the subject property. This lot was created in 1999 by an ANR plan of 561 Hodges St. The existing water main is located on the opposite side of the street from the lot. This section of Hodges St. was repaved app. 1 year ago, and is therefore under a 5 year moratorium for street openings.

I discussed the situation with the Taunton Board of Health and the possibility of putting a well on the lot for water supply. It was the Agent's opinion that this would not be acceptable to them, since City water is available. We therefore must request a waiver of the moratorium from your department and the City Council due to hardship.

The applicant, M. B. M. Builders, is willing to take special precautions to minimize damage to the pavement. It should be possible to directional drill under the pavement, and tap the water main with a small excavation on the south edge of pavement. This could then be repaired by use of flowable fill and an infrared treatment of the pavement patch. We will however comply with any requirements you may have.

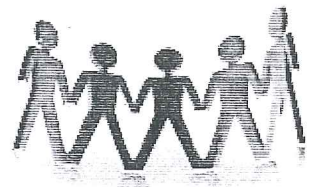
We respectfully request that you review the plan and advise us of what steps we must take to satisfy your and the Council's concerns. Thank you for your cooperation and assistance.

Light the Way Suicide Prevention Walk



Death by suicide has managed to crawl its way up from the 11th to the 10th leading cause of death in the United States.

Among youth ages 10-24, it's now the 2nd leading cause of death. Most suicides, not all, but most suicides are preventable.

For the 4th year, the Taunton Suicide Prevention Task Force has formed a collaborative to take a short walk that can increase awareness about this major public health issue. One life lost is too many.

How can you help?

Form a team small or large, or walk on your own. Create team tee shirts, wear organization shirts, school colors, etc. Invite others to fill out your pledge sheets. Show up on Sept. 8th ready to walk at 1:30 pm (rain or shine). The route is 3 miles & we'll have a "One Mile Turn-around" for those who can only do that distance.

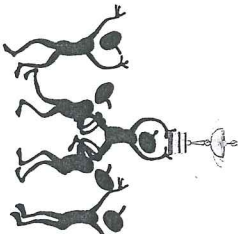
Where?

There is no registration fee, but pre-registration is requested so we can better prepare for the walk and the cookout that will follow. Sign-in will open at 12:30 pm.

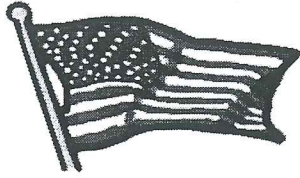
