#### Ordinance for a second reading to be passed to a third reading

#### AN ORDINANCE

# Chapter 2 – Administration Article XV – Capital Improvement Budget Ordinance

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton and by authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out Article XV in its entirety, including Sections 2-340 through 2-355, inclusive.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

#### Order for a second reading to be approved on a roll call vote

Ordered That,

\$4,000,000 be appropriated for the purpose of financing the construction, reconstruction, replacement, repair, and rehabilitation of sewers, and stormwater conveyance facilities, including without limitation sewer infiltration and inflow abatement improvements and pumping station upgrades, including the Phase 9 SSES, for the purpose of eliminating unauthorized sewer connections to the City's drainage system. to eliminate combined sewer overflows and sanitary sewer overflows, to reduce infiltration and inflow within the City's sewer system, and to mitigate flooding resulting in potential surface water contamination; that included are all costs without limitation as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C of the Massachusetts General Laws; that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow \$4,000,000 and issue bonds or notes therefor under Chapter 44 of the General Laws and/or Chapter 29 of the General Laws; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City unless the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor determines that they should be issued as limited obligations and may be secured by local system revenues as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C; that the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust established pursuant to Chapter 29C and in connection therewith to enter into a loan agreement and/or a security agreement with the Trust and otherwise to contract with the Trust and the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection with respect to such loan and for any federal or state aid available for the project or for the financing thereof; that the Mayor is authorized to enter into a project regulatory agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection, to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary to carry out the project.

#### Order for a second reading to be approved on a roll call vote

Ordered That,

\$250,000 be appropriated for the cost of engineering services for plans and specifications for improvements to the City's wastewater system, consisting of the Phase 9 SSES; that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow \$250,000 and issue bonds or notes therefor under Chapter 44 of the General Laws or any other enabling authority; and that the Mayor is authorized to take any other action necessary to carry out this project.
