Chapter 13

ARTICLE III. STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING

Sec 13-82. Prohibited parking places.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

SECTION 1: That Section 13-82 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, be and hereby is further amended as follows:

Insert: “Whittenton Street, north side, between Warren Street and Second Avenue”

Insert: “Bay Street, west side, across from the fire station and between the entrance way to parcel 38-423 (348 Bay Street) and entrance way to parcel 39-310 (314 Bay Street), a distance of 33.6 feet.”

SECTION 2: All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE

CHAPTER 20

STREETS AND SIDEWALKS

ARTICLE III. EXCAVATIONS AND OBSTRUCTIONS

Sec. 20-69

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton and by authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. Article III of Chapter 20 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out existing Section 20-69 and inserting the following Section 20-69 in its place.

Sec. 20-69 Same-Bond required.

- (a) No permit required for excavation in any street or way, including sidewalks and state highways located within the boundaries of the city, shall be granted unless and until the applicant has deposited with the city Treasurer/Collector an amount calculated by the Department of Public Works sufficient to complete any work related to the excavation not done to the satisfaction of the Department of Public Works. The amount shall be calculated by the Department of Public Works for each permit application. The applicant shall then cause the application to be brought to the Treasurer/Collector, who shall sign each permit application for which the required deposit is received. The applicant shall then return the application to the Department of Public Works for approval or denial of the application. The deposit shall be held by the treasurer/collector for not less than nine months following the completion of the project and shall not be released without written authorization from the Department of Public Works. If the City of Taunton is the permit applicant, and City of Taunton personnel are to perform the work, no deposit is required.
- (b) As an alternative to the deposit, an applicant may provide the treasurer/collector with a bond, which bond shall be kept current. A bond provided in accordance with this paragraph shall be deemed to be the deposit for the purposes of paragraph (a). The applicant shall cause the application to be brought to the Treasurer/Collector, who shall verify that a sufficient bond is in place and shall sign each permit application for which there is sufficient capacity under a bond to serve as surety. The applicant shall then return the application to the Department of Public Works for approval or denial of the application. Any such bond shall by its terms remain effective and in full form for a period of time sufficient to provide surety, but in any event not less than nine months following the completion of the project. The surety shall not be released sooner than nine

months following the completion of the project and shall not be released without written authorization from the Department of Public Works. Whenever such a bond shall re-issue or renew, said applicant shall cause same to be forwarded to the Treasurer/Collector.

- (c) This paragraph shall apply to Columbia Gas of Massachusetts and any successor (hereinafter Columbia Gas), the above paragraphs (a) and (b) notwithstanding. Columbia Gas is unique, in part, because of its status as a public utility governed by the Department of Public Utilities. No permit required for excavation in any street or way, including sidewalks and state highways located within the boundaries of the city, shall be granted to Columbia Gas unless and until Columbia Gas shall have provided the Treasurer/Collector with a bond, which bond shall be kept current. Whenever such a bond shall issue or renew, Columbia Gas shall cause same to be forwarded to the Treasurer/Collector. Columbia Gas shall submit each permit application to the Department of Public Works (DPW), who shall before issuing any permit cause each application to be forwarded to the Treasurer/Collector. The treasurer/collector shall verify that a sufficient bond is in place and shall sign each permit application for which there is sufficient capacity under a bond. Any such bond shall by its terms remain effective and in full form for a period of time sufficient to provide surety, but in any event not less than nine months following the completion of the project. The DPW shall cause each application to be returned to it from the Treasurer/Collector for approval or denial of the application. The bond shall remain in place for at least nine months following the completion of the work and shall not be released without written authorization from the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works or the Commissioner's designee.
- (d) When used in this section, Department of Public Works shall mean the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee and Treasurer/Collector shall mean the Treasurer/Collector or the Treasurer/Collector's designee.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

AN ORDINANCE

Chapter 7
Article II

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton and by authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. Article II of Chapter 7, Section 7-46 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, is hereby further amended by replacing the fee schedule therein with the fee schedule appended to this document.

SECTION 2. The following shall be added to Section 7-46 after the word "department": "however, any institution or school that is publicly owned and under the exclusive control, order and supervision of public officers or public agents authorized by the commonwealth or federal authority or both, is exempt from fee number (34), Annual Radio Box Monitoring".

MassMedicum Corporation

The Engineering Department reviewed the plans and report for the proposed MassMedicum development, and has the following comments:

1. The plans (existing conditions) should reference a datum.
2. The 5-foot walkway dimension should NOT include curb. If a monolithic walkway is constructed (no curb, per se) the width should be 5'-6".
3. Is there a need for such a wide aisle width in the rear parking lot?
4. The rear parking lot could use some dimensions.
5. Should there be plans for future expansion?
6. Per the stormwater report, I'm assuming high groundwater in the area of the detention basin is at elevation 94.2. The bottom of the forebay is at 94.0, is this OK?
7. Test pit data, with groundwater elevations, need to be included with this submission.
8. The two westerly corners of the front parking area appear to be undrained low points. What is happening here.
9. Is it a good idea to have a recharge trench directly adjacent to the building?
10. What is the purpose of the concrete block retaining wall? Isn't this just part of the building itself?
11. There are four unidentified symbols at the corners of the parking areas? Are these light poles? If so, is there additional lighting adjacent to the building?

Chairman Campbell and members of the Planning Board:

I am writing this letter at the request of Chief Edward Walsh regarding a site plan review for a Registered Medical Marijuana Dispensary on Revolutionary Drive, Assessors Map 119, Lot 65. The petitioner is MassMedicum Corp.

After a review of the petition, the Security Plan and the Security Outline, I note the following issues from the police department's perspective:

- 1) The building is proposed to be "of modular construction, but it will have no tow hitch or wheels attached after set on its pilings." Notwithstanding the "false façade to dress up the front", in our opinion, this type of building does not lend itself to being a secure facility.
- 2) The Site Security Outline, Section 1(a)(i)(6) indicates the company is "considering" erecting a fenced security area behind the building for employee access. Section 1(a)(ii)(7) states that employees will park in a rear, fenced area. The Site Layout submitted, on page 3, shows a proposed fenced area, the police department strongly recommends that this be required.
- 3) The dual alarm system reference on page 6 of the Security Plan indicates that a panic alarm will be connected to local law enforcement. The police department has no direct alarms, and we would like more information on this aspect of the Security Plan. Moreover, the Taunton Site Security Outline, section 1(a)(ii)(3) indicates that the two alarms will use different alarm companies.
- 4) The Security Plan, page 6. In the event the petitioner cannot meet one of the security provisions, the general manager must provide other adequate substitute safeguards. The paragraph references 105 CMR 725.110(B), to the extent that the petitioner cannot meet any security provisions, the Chief would like specific information on those provisions and the alternatives.

- 5) The Chief would like to review the petitioner's Incident Response Plan, referenced on page 6 of the Security Plan, under the "Facility access and limited access areas" heading.
- 6) The Chief would like to review the petitioner's Inventory Management, and Waste Disposal Plan, as well as the Anti-Diversion Plan, referenced on page 7 of the Security Plan, under the "Product Security" heading.
- 7) The Security Plan, on page 14, under the Access door heading. This paragraph states that all access doors must be 18-gauge hollow metal with commercial grade 1, non residential locks. Our understanding is 18-gauge doors are considered "heavy duty" and there are, at least two levels of doors with thicker metal that provide more security. We believe the most secure doors should be used. We agree with the grade 1 commercial locks.
- 8) The Security Plan, page 14, under the Reception Area heading. The wall separating the reception area from the rest of the facility "must be lined with a force-resistant material to provide protection against forced intrusion." We would need more information on this feature of the security.

Dear Chairman Campbell and Board Members,

On March 24, 2015, the Development Impact Review Board met to review the application of James Kurnick, 102 Island Ave, Quincy, Ma 02169 for a medical marijuana dispensary on lot 119-65 Revolutionary Drive which requires a Site Plan Review from the Planning Board and a Special Permit from the Municipal Council. In considering the petition, the DIRB familiarized itself with the premises and examined the location, layout and other characteristics. After reviewing the petition, plans and testimony, the DIRB finds that the petition was formally sufficient and submitted and reviewed in accordance with the procedures set forth in the Zoning Ordinance and that proper notice was given. **The DIRB hereby recommends that any approval of this petition by the Planning Board contain the following conditions;**

Condition #1) That the plans dated March 7, 2015 shall govern with the following additional conditions;

Condition #2) A set of updated plans shall be submitted that conforms to all of the requirements of this decision before any building permits will be issued. Two sets are required.

Condition #3) the required landscaping along the front property line shall be corrected according to section 7.1 of the Zoning Ordinance

Condition #4) The site shall be kept clean and clear of debris

Condition #5) Two set of as-builts shall be submitted upon completion of all work on site and shall include certification notes and stamps by a Design Engineer (PE) and Land Surveyor (PLS) stating that the development has been built according to the approved plans. Plans shall show at least all of the information shown on the proposed plans referenced in condition #1 above and all utility as-builts.

Condition #6) The dumpster shall be located on a concrete pad, enclosed with a stockade fence, be kept closed at all times and emptied regularly

Condition #7) lighting shall be zero lumens at the property lines

Condition #8) A hazardous materials permit from the Board of health is required

Condition #9) All of the doors shall be shown on the plan

Condition #10) An oil water separator is required for the garage area

Condition #11) There shall be no processing or cultivation on this site

Condition #12) a food permit is required from the Board of Health

Condition #13) the plans shall show a datum

Condition #14) the 5 foot walkway shall not include the curb

Condition #15) dimensions shall be added to the rear parking lot

Condition #16) test pit data, with groundwater elevations, shall be included.

Condition #17) The proposed fenced area is required for the employee access area

Condition #18) The petitioner shall meet with and work out agreements with the Police Department on the "dual alarm system" and how that will interact with the Taunton Police Department. The petitioner shall also provide details on the provisions and proposed alternatives to the security provisions provided.


Condition #19) The Incident Response Plan, the Inventory Management Plan, Anti Diversion Plan and Waste Disposal Plans shall be reviewed and approved by the Police Chief

Condition #20) The type of doors utilized and the lining of the wall separating the reception area from the rest of the facility shall be approved by the Police Chief

Condition #21) The building shall be placed on a foundation with a slab, not piers, for maximum security and protection

Condition #22) The project shall comply with all Department of Public Health requirements regarding Medical Marijuana Dispensaries.

The site was expanded in 1987 in ZBA case #1382 (see attached) but there were no conditions placed on the operation with regards to hours or noise. From a zoning perspective, there are no restrictions that would be enforceable with regards to noise or hours of operation for this site.

The petition of McCabe Sand and Gravel, Inc. for a special permit to allow the expansion of an existing non-conforming use by authorizing the construction of a masonry building approximately ninety-five (95) feet by eighty-three (83) feet to match the existing structures said building to contain eight (8) trucks now kept outside on the premises to be housed in said buildings all pursuant to §5.4 of the zoning ordinance. Location: 120 Berkley Street.

A public hearing was held January 29, 1987 in the Municipal Council Chambers, City Hall, Taunton, Massachusetts with the following members present: Paul Levesque, Chairman; Walter Gazda, Clerk; Don Anderson, Vernon Oldfield, Members; Vincent Rollo, Associate Member.

FOR THE PETITIONER: David Gay, Esq., 73 Washington Street, Taunton, MA

IN FAVOR: William McCaffrey, 692 Caswell Street, Taunton, MA: Mr. McCaffrey lived in the area once and never noticed the noise or traffic.

OPPOSITION: Richard Bentley, 28 Broadway, Taunton, MA for Elizabeth and Helen Brady of 228 Berkley Street.: Concerns were with traffic and the residential character of the neighborhood.

Alan Medeiros, 1 Church Green, Taunton, MA for his family: Concerns were with further expansion of the business as in recent years.

Rose deSilva, 188 Berkley Street, Taunton, MA: Concerns were with traffic hazards and children going to school; feels that there are not sixteen trucks on the site as per testimony.

FINDINGS: The petitioner owns a sand and gravel business located at 120 Berkley Street, Taunton, which has been in existence since 1917, therefore creating a pre-existing non-conforming use in this Urban Residential area. At this time, there are a total of sixteen (16) vehicles on site, with eight (8) vehicles being stored outside twenty-four hours per day. The petitioner proposes to expand the business by constructing a ninety-five (95) by eighty-three (83) foot garage type building to house these vehicles. Plans submitted to the ZBA as testimony included new landscaping, earth berms, and timed sprinkler systems to keep down the dust from the sand and gravel and to water shrubs which will be put in upon the granting of this special permit. The entire project would be completed by early summer, 1987.

The Board finds that construction of a building which would house and therefore hide the remaining eight construction-type vehicles that are left outside all day and night in this residential area, would be more aesthetic to the neighborhood, and therefore would not be more detrimental. It was stated by the petitioner that there would be no further expansion of use, but only of the building on the site.

The Board also finds that the landscaping and sprinkler systems would also make this commercial use more tolerable to its neighborhood in which it has been operating for the past seventy (70)

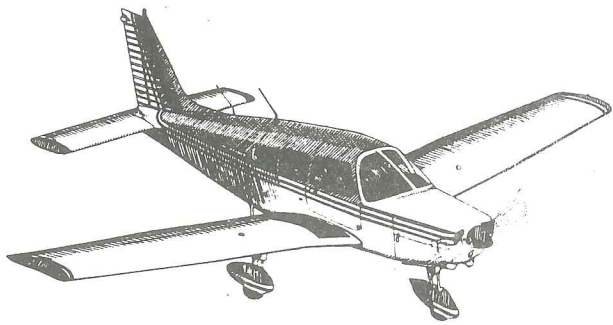

Approximately one year ago, the City Council voted to approve a loan authorization in the amount of \$270,250 for the Hopewell Park Complex. I have attached a copy for your reference. The funding source for this project included a \$200,000 grant from Common Backyards and an appropriation of \$70,250. The grant required a \$50,000 match which is included in the amount to be appropriated.

The project is now complete and the City has received the \$200,000 reimbursement from the grant. The total amount expended to complete the project is \$254,698.14, which is under budget by \$15,551.86. The only remaining action is to appropriate the funds necessary for the City's share of the cost. Therefore, I am requesting Council authorize a transfer in the amount of \$54,698.14 from the Reserve Account to the City Capital Project account number 34-4970-4971.

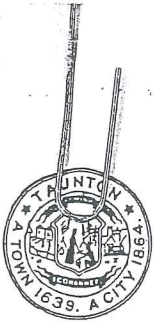

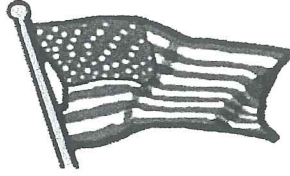


