AN ORDINANCE MAKING TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS TO SEC. 19-3.1

Chapter 19

SEWERS AND DRAINS

Section 19-3.1: Procedure for the Assessment of Betterments For Laying of Common Sewers

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton and by authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 19-3.1 of Chapter 19 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out subsection a. and inserting in place thereof the following subsection:--

a. All betterments for the laying of common sewers shall be assessed against owners of property pursuant to the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Dear Council President Colton and Members of the Municipal Council:

The Economic Development Incentive Board held a hearing on October31st on a request for certified project status under the Massachusetts Economic Development Incentive Program on the following proposed project.

General Fire Extinguisher, Inc. for a new building at 314 Broadway, on a 1.8 acre lot involving demotion and remediation of a derelict building, extensive wetlands, and replacement of poor soils at an estimated project cost of \$600,000 This project will be located in a new site specific EOA in the Broadway highway business district.

The EDIB TIF recommendation:

Projected 10 year EDI benefits:

- Retain the current 10 fulltime positions including 2 recent hires and create 2 new positions in the next five years.
- Total new taxes to the City \$239,741 (80%)
- Total benefit to General Fire Extinguisher \$60,432 (20%) in keeping with other commercial projects

It is understood that any companies seeking state tax credits and benefits, as a certified project must first receive local approval and tax relief. This project was approved at the Economic Development Incentive Board Meeting held on Wednesday October 31st. We respectfully request a hearing with the Council Committee of the Whole on Tuesday November 20th in order to meet the deadline for the December EACC meeting. The certified project application and draft TIF agreement will be included in your council package prior to the meeting.

General Fire Extinguishers was established in 1975 as a small 1 man operation selling and						
servicing fire extinguishers out of the basement of Gene LeClair's residential home at 12 Arthur						
St. in Taunton, MA. As the company was gaining a good reputation for service it also began to						

grow it's services by offering extinguisher hydro-testing which necessitated hiring a second employee. As time when on, the company contiued to grow and offer more services like installation and servicing of: fire suppression systems in restaurants, gas stations and heavy off road equipment to name a few. This created a need for a variance to expand the existing garage on the property for more space and more employees to meet the needs of the company. As future projections indicated more growth for General Fire Extinguishers, it became incorporated in the early 90's and necessitated a process to begin a plan to look for property to build on that would allow for more room to expand. The number of employees had risen to a high of 10 by the year 2000. Land at 314 Broadway in Taunton was purchased that year with the intent to build a larger working space as soon as time allowed to plan the building makeup and raise sufficient capital. After many years of delays due to planning and the nature of the land with the condemned building that would need to be demolished, the project was finally able to begin in 2012. Today the company employs 14 people, 8 full time and 6 part time with the potential to grow more after moving to our new location.

The idea to expand our growing company began in 2000 with the purchase of land located at 314 Broadway in Taunton that included a small unrepairable building and 1.8 acres of tree filled land, almost one third of which will be unusable due to standing water for \$ 125,000. After years of planning, the land development project began in late July of 2012 with the development of a required detention basin, followed by demolition of the existing condemned building that was falling down. Expenses began to incur for preparing the basin, demolition of the existing building, removing an unexpected 16 feet of soft peet from the property, excavating a hill to be used in the back and to prepare for the foundation was approximately \$150,000 and climbing as the project moves along. The estimated cost to construct the proposed building will be in the range of \$600,000 which is up from the original estimate due to some unforseen changes.

If all goes according to plan, construction is scheduled to begin in early September with completion expected sometime before the end of November. Assuming this timetable is accurate, General Fire Extinguishers, Inc.is planning to begin Business from the new location at 314 Broadway sometime before the start of the Winter season.

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TAX INCREMENT FINANCING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF TAUNTON AND

General Fire Extinguishers, Inc.

This Agreement made this 20th, day of November, 2012 by and between the City of Taunton (hereinafter referred to as the "CITY") and General Fire Extinguishers, Inc. of Taunton, Massachusetts (hereinafter referred to as the "COMPANY").

WHEREAS, the COMPANY desires to complete the demolition and remediation of a small derelict building and the construction of a new facility on the property,

WHEREAS, the cost of this project will be \$600,000 which will include the demolition of one building, remediation, site preparation, and the construction of a new building including landscaping.

WHEREAS, the CITY, as recognition of the COMPANY's property improvements, and its attendant capital investment and employment opportunity is willing to grant the COMPANY certain tax concessions, and

WHEREAS, the COMPANY is committed to funding the Project and fostering the hiring of Taunton residents for the jobs created by the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Taunton has agreed to submit an application to EACC for approval of a new EOA to be known as 314 Broadway.

WHEREAS, the CITY by vote of the Municipal Council pursuant to Chapter 23A, Section 35 has designated as an Economic Opportunity Area ("EOA") and Tax Increment Financing Zone ("TIF Zone") an area of the City which includes the site on which the Company is undertaking the Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3F of Chapter 23A the Company has requested the Municipal Council to approve a certified project application submitted herewith; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for the mutual consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties mutually agree, as follows:

A. CONDITIIONS:

The City shall grant the tax increment exemptions set for herein, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The construction of a new facility at 314 Broadway to be used for fire extinguisher sales and service in accordance with City of Taunton requirements.
- 2. Diligent, good faith efforts by the Company to create approximately two new positions within 60 months of the completion of construction and to retain the current 10 full time people as set forth in that certain Certified Project Application of the Company to be submitted herewith.
- 3. The use of diligent efforts to give priority consideration to residents of the City of Taunton and the Greater Taunton Economic Target Area for employment opportunities that are to be filled from outside the Company. The Company will work with the Mayor's Office, the Taunton Career Center, and with other appropriate City agencies to provide priority to Taunton residents of available job openings.

When job opening are to be filled, the Company, in cooperation with the Mayor's Office and other City Agencies will participate in job fairs for Taunton residents. The Company will publish notices of job openings in the local Taunton newspapers in advance of publication of notice in newspapers of wider distribution.

- 4. Starting in January of 2014, and continuing for the term of this Agreement the COMPANY shall provide the CITY an annual report in the month of January for the previous year, which report shall contain the following information:
 - a. the employment level of the project in the beginning and end of the reporting period;
 - b. the specific number of Taunton and Greater Taunton Economic Target Area residents at its facility at the beginning and end of each report period;
 - c. the utilization of local contractors during the reporting period.
- 5. To the extent practicable (which term shall include financial capability, bonding, capacity, bid pricing, ability to adhere to performance standards, availability of workers, experience and similar such factors) in the construction of the on-site building initially contemplated under this Agreement and related on-site improvements, General Fire Extinguishers agrees to direct it's development contractor (the "DMC") to utilize, when practicable, local contractors who satisfy all final bid criteria. GFE will direct its DMC (the "DMC" Directive") to include in DMC's final bid packages a requirement that the final bidding contractors comply, to the extent the same is applicable, legally valid and enforceable, with the intent of the City's Fifty-Fifty Ordinance, on file in the City of Taunton Office of Economic and Community Development.

B. TAX INCREMENT EXEMPTIONS:

The CITY hereby grants a tax increment financing exemption to the COMPANY in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 23A, Section 3E, Chapter 40, Section 59, Chapter 59, Section 5, subsection 51, and all applicable law. Said exemption shall be granted with respect to the project as described above. Said exemption shall remain in effect for a period of ten years beginning with fiscal year 2014 (July 1st, 2013) and ending with the fiscal year 2023 (June 30th, 2022). Said exemption is as follows:

The base year for determining assessed value of the property shall be Fiscal Year 2013, in which the expected assessed value of the facility is \$346,400.00.

C. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. As long as the tax increment financing plan and agreement remains in effect, it shall be binding upon the COMPANY and its successors and assigns and upon the CITY.
- It is distinctly understood and agreed that all parties hereto shall make a reasonable and good faith effort to perform their obligations under this Agreement. If and to the extent that either party is prevented from performing its obligations hereunder by an event of force majeure, such party shall be excused from performing hereunder and shall not be liable in damages or otherwise, and the parties instead shall negotiate in good faith with respect to appropriate modifications to the terms hereof. purposes of this Agreement, the term force majeure shall mean any supervening cause beyond the reasonable control of the affected party, including without limitation requirement of statute or regulation; action of any court, regulatory authority, or public authority having jurisdiction acts of God, fire, earthquake, floods, explosion, actions of the elements, war riots, mob violence, inability to procure or a general shortage of labor, equipment, facilities, materials or supplies in the open market, failure of transportation, strikes, lockouts, actions of the labor unions, condemnation, laws or order of governmental or military authorities, denial of refusal to grant or appeals of any permit, approval of action of any public or quasi public authority, official, agency or subdivision and any litigation relating thereto, or any other cause, whether similar or dissimilar to the foregoing, not within the control of such party obligated to perform such obligation.
- 3. Failure by the Company to perform any term or provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a default under this Agreement unless the Company fails to commence to cure, correct, or remedy such failure within sixty (60) days of the receipt of written notice of such failure from the City to the Company and thereafter fails to complete such cure, correction or remedy within ninety (90) days of the receipt of such written notice, or, with respect to defaults which cannot be remedied within such ninety (90) day period, within such additional period of time as is required to reasonably remedy such default, provided the Company exercises due diligence in the remedying of such default. The provisions of the Certified Project Application shall be incorporated into and made a part of this Tax Increment Finance Agreement.
- 4. After receiving written notice from any person, firm or other entity, that such holds a mortgage which includes as part or all of the mortgaged premises, any part of the project or any improvements thereon, the City shall, so long as such mortgage is outstanding be required to give to such holder the same notice as in required to be given to the Company under the terms of the Agreement, but such notice may be given by the City to the Company and such holder concurrently. It is further agreed that such holder shall have the same opportunity to cure any default as is available to the Company and that such holder shall have forty-five (45) days more to cure any such default than would be available to the Company under the provisions of this Agreement. In addition, so long as any such holder, within seventy-five (75) days of receiving any such notice from the City, shall commence proceedings for foreclosure of any such mortgage and shall, in the meantime, keep and perform or cause to be kept and performed all the obligations of the Company, or shall undertake to cure any default under or failure of the Company to satisfy any condition of this Agreement. Not-withstanding the foregoing, any late payments of property taxes due under this Agreement shall be subject to the same interest and penalty charges that would otherwise be levied in case of a failure to timely pay property taxes.
- 5. In the event that the Company fails to comply with the terms of this Agreement, the City may, as its sole remedy, take action to request decertification of the project by

the EACC. Upon decertification, the City shall discontinue the exemption benefits provided to the Company as set forth herein, commencing with the fiscal year in which such decertification occurs. If the Project ceases commercial operation during the term of this Agreement, or if the Project has not begun commercial operation by the date that is five (5) years from the date hereof, the Company may terminate this Agreement.

6. All notice permitted or required under the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, or shall be delivered by private express carrier, as follows, or at such other address as may be specified by a party in writing and served upon the other in accordance with this section:

- 7. This Agreement shall run with the land. The covenants and agreements herein contained shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding on the successors and assigns of the parties hereto. This Agreement may be amended only in writing with the consent of both parties. The Company shall be entitled in its discretion to perform any or all of its obligations under the agreement through one or more affiliates.
- 8. If any provision of this Agreement shall be found invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall be construed as narrowly as possible and the balance of the Agreement shall be directed to be amended to the minimum extent necessary to provide to the City and to the Company substantially the benefits set forth in this Agreement.
- 9 If a conflict exists between the terms of this Tax Increment Finance Agreement and the Certified Project Application, the terms of the Tax Finance Agreement shall control. Compliance shall be reviewed annually and a report shall be issued by the City of Taunton Law Department to the Mayor, Municipal Council, EACC, and the applicant outlining any deficiency as well as the applicant's compliance status for the immediately preceding calendar year. In the event certain deficiencies are noted, the parties shall proceed under Sections 3-4 of Section C of this agreement.
