ARTICLE III. STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING

Sec 13-82. Prohibited parking places.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

Sec 13-82. Prohibited parking places.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

Ordered That,

\$600,000.00 is appropriated for the cost of design services for plans and specifications for (i) the replacement of the Harris Street Pumping Station, (ii) the laying and relaying of water mains on various City streets, and (iii) replacement of City water meters and meter information collection system, including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto; that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow **\$600,000.00** and issue bonds or notes therefore under Chapter 44 of the General Laws or any other enabling authority; that the

Mayor is authorized to take any other action necessary or convenient to carry out the projects; and that the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the Municipal Finance Oversight Board to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any or all of the bonds authorized by this order and to provide such information and execute such documents as the Municipal Finance Oversight Board may require for these purposes.

Order for a first reading to be passed to a second reading

Ordered That,

\$8,000,000 is appropriated for the purpose of financing the construction of various improvements to the City's water system, including without limitation the (i) the replacement of the Harris Street Pumping Station, (ii) the laying and relaying of water mains on various City streets, (iii) replacement of City water meters and meter information collection system, and (iv) the construction of well pumping appurtenances and chemical feed systems, including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto; including without limitation all costs thereof as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C of the General Laws; that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow **\$8,000,000** and issue bonds or notes therefor under Chapter 44 of the General Laws and/or Chapter 29C of the General Laws, or any other enabling authority; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City unless the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor determines that they should be issued as limited obligations and may be secured by local system revenues as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C; that the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust established pursuant to Chapter 29C and in connection therewith to enter into a financing agreement and/or a security agreement with the Trust and otherwise to contract with the Trust and the Department of Environmental Protection with respect to such loan and for any federal or state aid available for the project or for the financing thereof; and that the Mayor is authorized to enter into a project regulatory agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection, to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary or convenient to carry out the projects; and that the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the Municipal Finance Oversight Board to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any or all of the bonds authorized by this order and to provide such information and execute such documents as the Municipal Finance Oversight Board may require for these purposes.

The Petition of Steven Callahan, P. O. Box 329, Middleboro, Ma. for a Variance from Section 8.7.5.2 of the Zoning Ordinance to allow a 180 foot Wireless Communication Tower having a distance of 96 feet from the closest property line (instead of 180 feet) on premises situated at 760 County St., Taunton, Ma.

A public hearing was held in on June 13, 2013 at Maxham School, in the Chester R. Martin Municipal Council Chambers, 141 Oak St. Taunton, Ma. and the following members present: Dennis I. Ackerman, Chairman, Joseph Amaral, Steven Vieira, Estele Borges, Peter Wasylow and Wayne Berube.

For the Petitioner: Steven Callahan, P. O. Box 329, Middleboro, Ma.

Findings: The petitioner is requesting a Variance from Section 8.7.5.2 of the Zoning Ordinance for a Wireless Communications Facility setback from 180 feet to 96 feet at 760 County Street located in the Rural Residential District. The proposal is for the construction of a 180 foot tower to be used by WVBF 1530AM radio station.

The proposal is for the relocation of WVBF from Middleboro to this site and the FCC requires that all AM stations protect nearby AM station on adjacent frequencies from interference. The petitioner is accomplishing this by using the existing tower on the site as a "canceller" and the new tower as a "feeder" to keep the two station's signals from overlapping. The FCC dictates that the new tower has to be identical to, and a calculated distanced from, the existing tower in the direction which would protect the other stations. The petitioner is accomplishing this by placing a second identical lattice-type tower on the same lot. The petitioner explained to effectively protect another AM station in Newport, RI on 1540 kilohertz from interference, the FCC requires that the new tower be located 123 feet from and on a compass heading of 45 degrees true from the existing tower. The cancelling effect will protect the Newport Station and allow WVBF to operate from the County Street site. The proposed AM lattice-type tower is unlike a cellular wireless tower in that an AM lattice-type uses guy wires to support the tower. The tower is guyed in three directions with heavy, stranded steel cables at five levels along the tower's entire height. The lattice-type tower is heavily engineered not to fall like a tree, but to "fold" like a boy scout knife onto itself.

HEARING

The Board finds that the relief can be granted without any detriment to the surrounding properties. The Board grants the relief as presented allowing the continuance of the radio program in Taunton.

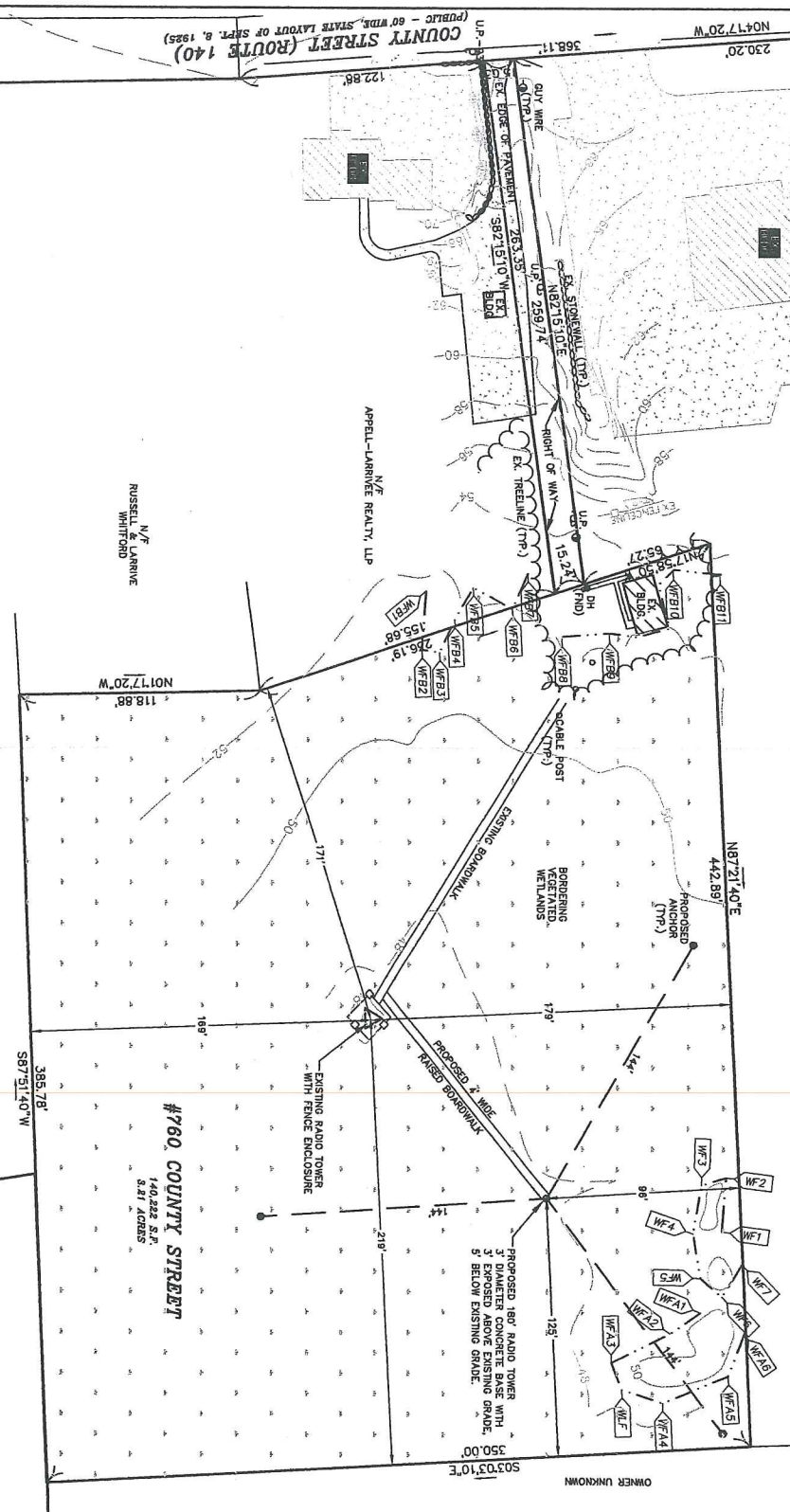
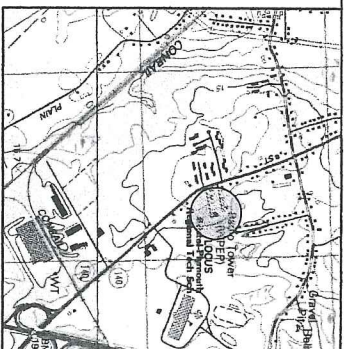

Dear Council President McCaul and Members of the Municipal Council:

Please allow me to respond to the Council's October 2, 2013 letter containing an inquiry regarding whether or not the City currently taxes Verizon for each telephone pole. I inquired of Barry Cooperstein, Chairperson of the Board of Assessors. It was reported to me that Massachusetts General Laws chapter 59, section 18, clause Fifth, prescribes that poles, underground conduits, wires and pipes of telecommunications companies laid in or erected upon public or private ways and property shall be assessed to their owners in the cities and towns where they are laid or erected. Accordingly, the City does tax Verizon. Verizon New England had taxable personal property in the City of Taunton for FY2013 in the amount of \$35,569,200 for a tax of \$1,087,706.14, the City's third largest taxpayer. FY2014 taxable value is \$30,167,500.

21st century national trends...

“Energy prices: Long commutes and auto-dependent lifestyles are less economically sustainable and increase the cost of living in sprawl.”

“Growth infrastructure” that supports **compact** development” (They are currently building 330sq. ft. apartments in Boston with fold-a-way eating tables and beds, with living rooms located in common areas of the building.)

Lessons learned about transit-oriented development (TOD)

“Successful TOD depends on:

- Strong development market
- Proactive leadership
- **Careful local land planning**
- Supportive policies and **incentives** at all levels of government
- **Availability of land near stations**
- Cooperation between the transit provider and the local government”

Lessons learned about commuter rail and regional economic development

- “...No empirical evidence at present that manufacturing, high tech, or biotech will choose locations because of commuter rail stations.”

The South Coast Rail Corridor Today

- “**Sprawling** growth, both residential and commercial
- Uneven economic development
- Limited networking of environmental resources....”

The Commonwealth’s Sustainable Development Principles

- “**Concentrate** development and mix uses (mixed use zoning by-laws, as in Stoughton)

- Use natural resources wisely
- Expand housing opportunities (very compact in size; new apts. in Boston: 330 sq. ft.)

- “Identify opportunities for **compact, higher-density, mixed use development near stations and other appropriate locations**
- Provide conceptual plans and visuals for TOD with **walking distance of train stations**” (TOD = Transit Orient Development = land development designed to encourage mass transit use)

SCR Smart Growth Opportunities

- “**Regional Transfer of Development Rights** program
(This means: “A legal device by which the development potential of a site is severed from its title and made available for transfer to another location. The owner of a site within a transfer area retains property ownership, but not approval to develop. The owner of a site within a receiving area may purchase transferable development rights, allowing a receptor site to be developed at a greater density.” This occurs through consensus to place conservation easements on property in agricultural areas and on the other hand **allowing development densities to increase in those areas that are being developed.** In most cases the individual development rights are constrained by the use of zoning.” (<http://www.kzoo.edu/convenc/Rules/tdr.htm>)
- **Targeted state assistance and resources to support the South Coast Rail regional smart growth program** (KEY: **Withhold grants/funding for infrastructure from towns that don’t support moving people into the corridor**)
- Legislative changes...
 - Promote multi-municipal planning
 - Enable cross-border zoning and tax sharing

Enhance Multi-Modal Opportunities

- Identify TOD locations with potential for
 - Walking
 - Biking
 - Bus connections
 - Trolley connections
 - **Water transportation connections** (likely will become mandated by law while automobiles will be outlawed; it’s about control of people. Under the “rewilding” of America, on-ramps to highways will be sealed off, forcing people to use their bikes and restrict their mobility. The **rewilding** of America is the development and promotion of strategies to advance **continental-scale conservation** in No. America, particularly the need for large carnivores and a permeable landscape for their movement.)

Environmental Justice Communities Need Better Access (End of Corridor Plan Presentation)

(For Definition See: Mass.gov/envir/smart_growth_toolkit/pages/mod-ej, which states: “In Brief: Environmental Justice (EJ) is based on the principle that all people have a right to be protected from environmental pollution and to live in and enjoy a clean and healthful environment. EJ is the equal protection and meaningful involvement of all people with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies and the equitable distribution of environmental benefits. The objective of this section of the Toolkit is to provide guidance to municipalities and developers on how to better engage EJ populations in the planning and development process.”)

It is akin to Social Justice as used in the Redistribution of Wealth Agenda. It refers to the overall fairness of a society in its division and distribution of rewards, to those who are unable to or unwilling to earn these rewards on their own.

Socialism: To go from capitalism to communism, a society must go through socialism. Is defined: Social system where the means of production and distribution of goods are owned collectively or by government ownership and administration.

Section 200-98: Stoughton Center design review standards

C(9): “Sustainable building design. New buildings constructed in the SCMUOD after the date of passage of this article shall comply with the current Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) criteria, as promulgated by the U.S. Green Building Council to the extent that is feasible for a developer.” [Emphasis added.]

- By re-codifying C(9) as a Town Code, the Town is throwing out the U.S. Constitution and setting up the United Nations as its dictator of local law.¹

- Sustainable building design is a regulation of the Convention on Biological Diversity, a UN treaty signed by member states at the Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro, in 1992.
- The Convention on Biological Diversity was signed by President Clinton, but this treaty **was never ratified by the U.S. Senate**, as required by the Constitution.
- **The treaty has no jurisdiction in the United States**, but it is given legal status through towns voting to accept the regulations of the treaty.²
- **This strategy is an end-run around the U.S. Constitution.**
- This zoning by-law is one way the United Nations is conquering the United States – getting local communities to vote for legally-binding United Nations laws and ignore the U.S. Senate’s rejection of a bad treaty, thus who needs the U.S. Senate.
- The U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) was established to assist the United Nations in implementing the regulations of Convention on Biological Diversity³, which also demands: the U.S. is to GIVE foreign countries access to genetic resources inside the U.S. territory and not impose laws that run counter to the objects of this treaty; scientific research is to be carried out on U.S. territory by foreign countries; the U.S. must provide access to and GIVE technology, including technology protected by patents and other intellectual property rights belonging to U.S. citizens and U.S. corporations⁴.
- This treaty also requires that “biodiversity conservation and sustainable development, based on **local** community efforts... which seek to reconcile...social development” move humans into cities and create biospheres in the country, linking cities through corridors. **“The main characteristics of biosphere reserves are: zonation (zoning) pattern for conservation and development...involvement of local communities in management; forming a tool for conflict resolution of natural resource use, through development of dialogues...demonstrating sound policies based on...monitoring...Zonation (zoning) includes strictly protected core areas, typically surrounded by a buffer zone where conservation is emphasized, but where people also live and work, and the whole is surround by a transition area, or area of co-operation, which promotes sustainable development... Large biosphere reserves, which are used as tools for land use planning, incorporate ecological networks and corridors... (there are approximately 45 biospheres in the U.S.)”⁵** Americans are prohibited from going into the core of these biospheres where foreign countries are doing research on U.S. territorial natural resources.
- “The aims of the CBD (Convention on Biological Diversity) are ‘the conservation of biological diversity, the sustainable use of its components, and the **fair and equitable sharing (with Russia and China) of the benefits arising out of the utilization of genetic resources** (such as pharmaceuticals).’... Within this spirit of partnership, biosphere reserves and World Heritage sites have provided a focus for several different types of co-operative links between UNESCO and the CBD

(Convention on Biological Diversity)....”⁶ The **United Nations (UNESCO) controls Independence Hall**, Statue of Liberty, the Grand Canyon, etc., and UNESCO dictates to the Dept. of Interior how they are to maintain these World Heritage cites, with U.S. taxpayer money.

- USGBC was established by Rick Fedrizzi, who is on the Board of UN Environment Programme⁷ that coordinates UN environmental activities.⁸ UNEP is headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya.⁹
- The USGBC is a private company that created the infrastructure of LEED certifications.
- **U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC)** is also a partner of the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) to implement the Convention on Biological Diversity.
 - a. “U.S. Green Building Council (who created LEED), UN Environment Programme...Announce **Partnership on Rio+20**...announced a new initiative today...Amy Fraenkel, director and regional representative of UNEP (stated)...**UNEP’s Regional Office for North America is excited to be working with the USGBC...Our goal is that this collaborative effort between USGBC...in the field of sustainability will move the green economy debate forward locally and globally**, and support efforts to make green cities and buildings pillars of sustainable economic development in all regions of the world.”¹⁰
- The Convention on Biological Diversity is implemented through the purposefully-malleable LEED’s criteria.
- **Most importantly**, the words **current LEED criteria** sets up the infrastructure to allow the United Nations to **automatically implement** United Nations’ dictates upon the Town.¹¹ Which the Town cannot prohibit, unless it removes C(9) and (10) sections of SCMUOD zoning by-law.
- Specifying in the zoning by-law: **current LEED criteria** – legally binds and restricts the Town to abide any and **all future United Nations zoning controls**.
- This will one day include installing United Nations’ LEED-mandated remote sensors, to allow the United Nations to control the heating and cooling of the interior of homes, allegedly to be more energy efficient.¹²

- The Stoughton Center Mixed Use Overlay District Zoning By-Law – dictates **LEED’s criteria to “Residential Urban (RU) district.”**¹³
- Carol Browner, assistant to the president on energy and climate change, describes the Smart Grid as “**allow(ing) utility companies to manage the flow of electricity.**”¹⁴ That means the utility company will control the thermostat inside your home, as they currently do in California, to meet malleable United Nations standards – in an effort to “**bring our species under control.**”¹⁵
- The **United Nations Smart Growth Human Settlements** are being enacted with the micro apartments, which are under construction at the Seaport’s newest residential building, the Boston Wharf Tower. Apartments being built on Melcher St. will be **330 sq. ft...**”part of a new wave” of construction in Boston; “We think of the common space in our buildings and the streetscape (sidewalks, grocery stores, banks, Laundromats, subway) outside as the living room for our residents.”¹⁶ Zoning by-laws had to be changed to allow micro apartments.
- “Convention on Biological Diversity, Target #2 by 2020...**local strategies and planning processes...including...spatial planning (zoning)**...Tools are available for integrating biodiversity into spatial planning exercises through the mapping of ...conservation planning.”¹⁷ To keep people in the cities and prevent them from going into the countryside. To limit travel only through corridors between cities.
- The United Nations Environmental Programme’s “Thematic focus... Environmental **governance**, May 2013, reveals the **use of eco-drones or conservation drones used for real-time monitoring...poaching, illegal fishing, illegal trade, and agriculture.**¹⁸ To monitor obedience of the zoning implemented through LEED to meet the requirements of the Convention on Biological Diversity.

The following Town of Stoughton Code is part of the Convention on Biological Diversity mandate:

(C)(10): “Sustainable site design. The SPGA shall encourage the use of the latest best management practices for stormwater management such as Low Impact Development (LID). This may include the use of rooftop landscaping on

buildings that have a flat roof.”

- This paragraph goes hand and hand with (C)(9) as cited on the first page, first paragraph of this paper, in implementing the United Nations treaty, as well as being just an incredibly stupid idea of putting dirt on a flat roof to retain rainwater, and in the winter, to retain ice.
- United Nations’ “‘Smart growth’ concepts” emerged as “Lands Legacy Initiative unveiled as a means to help...**local** communities address...land management ... (which) would **increase** federal land acquisition **funding**...and designate 5 million acres of wilderness at specified locations...northern New England... provide grants to state and localities to acquire land and plan for **open space**.”¹⁹
- UNEP Global Environmental Alert Service (GEAS) is a **mechanism** for identifying, selecting, and communicating early **warning** information on emerging issues to **decision makers** on a regular basis across UNEP’s focus areas.... **focusing on policy-relevant** environmental hotspots....”²⁰ The decision makers are not identified.

The above §200-98(C)(9) and (10) are unconstitutional, since their intent is to enforce the Convention on Biological Diversity regulations to the exclusion of the Town’s underlying zoning by-law when there is a conflict between the two.²¹ The United Nations is given legal authority to destroy the autonomy of the Town’s citizens, officers, and leaders.

The unique and original language of “sustainable development” and “sustainable building design” originated with United Nations Environmental Programme, in 1988, when they convened a working group of experts to explore the need for an international treaty on biological diversity. The Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), in 1992, was the result.²²

Indicators that the Town is scrapping the U.S. Constitution to illegally enforce the United Nations’ Treaty, Convention on Biological Diversity and its Agenda 21 blueprint:

TO WIT: Decisions of the Governing Body of the treaty: 9 Decision IX/8 Review of Implementation of Goals 2 and 3 **of the Strategic Plan of the Convention on Biological Diversity**: “National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plan:...iv. Establishing appropriate **mechanisms** to improve the participation and involvement of...**local** communities...vi...(s) Promote and support **local** action for the implementation...**by integrating...into...local level assessments and planning processes**...Decision X/5. **Implementation of the Convention and the Strategic Plan**...2. Invites Parties to establish **mechanisms** at all levels to **foster the full and effective participation of...local communities**...”²³ Those mechanisms are LOCAL Zoning By-Laws, to implement the CBD treaty and bypass the U.S. Senate’s approval.

TO WIT: UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon stated: **“The United Nations General Assembly has encouraged the use of the Convention on Biological Diversity’s Strategic Plan for Biodiversity...Rio+20 Conference on Sustainable Development....”**²⁴ Every citizen that pushes for UN-controlled zoning by-laws is patted on the head and encouraged to use the weapon of political correctness to shut up dissenting points of view. TO WIT:

- a. U.S. Constitution, Art. I, Section 10, cl. 1: “No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation....”
- b. U.S. Constitution, Art. I, Section 10, cl. 3: “No State shall, without the the consent of Congress...enter into any Agreement or Compact...with a foreign Power....”

TO WIT: The Town of Stoughton’s Code allows constitutional scrutiny and removal when sections of this by-law are found to be unconstitutional: See, § 200-89 Validity; and § 200-88 Amendment.

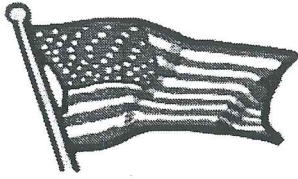


