

Dear Honorable Mayor Hoye and Members of the Municipal Council:

The purpose of this letter is a request for a designated parking space for me in front of my business located at 89 Main Street.

As you may be aware, I have owned New York Lace since 1990, a downtown Taunton landmark since 1907. I am physically disabled and require a walker or a motorized scooter to enter into my business on a daily basis. I have noticed that the crosswalk that is located in front of 101 Main Street will be eliminated in the new Sidewalk project. My concern is that if I do not have a designated parking space, and all of the spaces are occupied in front of my business, I will be forced to either walk a long distance with my walker or need to maneuver my scooter along the street until the closest crosswalk. This could be especially dangerous in the winter with the snow and ice. Unfortunately, as my condition progresses, I will solely depend on a motorized scooter for mobility.

In previous years there have been reserved parking spaces for taxi stands for an annual fee. If necessary, given my particular needs, I would be willing to pay a reasonable fee for a personally reserved parking space. Obviously, I would prefer not to even make this request, but my business ownership requires my access to Main street parking. I respectfully request your understanding and assistance.
