RE: SAFER Grant Spending Update

Dear Honorable Members of the Taunton Municipal Council;

I have been asked to give an update on the status of the SAFER Grant. The total amount of the grant is \$1,345,784.00. As of 8/30/2014 the Fire Department has requested \$917,656.03 in funds, leaving us with a balance of \$428,218.97.

The performance period of the grants ends on December 27, 2014, however I estimate that we will still have a significant balance in the grant allotment. I have contacted our FEMA grant advisors at both the State and Federal level. They will be advising me on how to draft an amendment to the grant that will allow us to access any funds remaining after the performance period expires. They requested that I do no begin such a process until 60 days before the performance period is set to end. It is my estimation that the remaining fund should be able to carry us into March of 2015.

RE: Overtime Usage Report Requested at Budget Hearing on 6/11/2014

Dear Honorable Members of the Taunton Municipal Council;

After reviewing overtime and time off requests for fiscal year 2014 I have compiled the following report.

Over the course of the 365 days of the year the Fire Department had 3651 shift vacancies. A shift is comprised of either a 10 hour day or a 14 hour night. The hourly total of these vacancies was 46,962 hours. Vacation time accounted for 2034 shifts. Personal days and sick days took up 492 and 872 shifts respectively. Line of Duty injuries accounted for 145 shifts and Military Leave for 108 shifts. There are a few other smaller categories that allow department members to use time off but I will keep the discussion to the major ones.

It is difficult to determine which category causes overtime to be hired in the Taunton Fire Department on a daily basis. Once the staffing for the day falls below a minimum number, overtime is then used to maintain a certain level of manpower. The number of vacations used in a year is fairly constant. There are subtle changes when experienced members with more vacation time retire and are replaced by new members with minimal days. Vacation time also runs calendar year within the department which should cause variations over fiscal year examinations but there is a fair amount of consistency with vacation time usage. Personal days are constant within the department with each member getting 5 every year. Firefighters are allowed to carry them over, being able to hold up to a maximum of 10 at a time. This might

cause subtle variations from year to year but still there is a good degree of consistency. Sick time can vary yearly according to a variety of issues. I have tried to bring some consistency to sick time use through contract negotiations. Finally, Military Leave and Line of Duty injuries are wild cards. The department has no ability to either control or estimate these issues. Luckily 2014 was a good year for the department regarding these items with the 253 combined shifts being minimal in my opinion.

When we examine the total number of hours lost in the 5 above areas, 46,962, and compare it to the total number of department hours hired in overtime during the fiscal year 23,687, we see that we are covering roughly half the vacancies created with time and a half spending. Overtime is traditionally higher in times of high vacation use with December, July and August being the top months. Some months, such as October and March are substantially lighter when it comes to using overtime funds. I have attached a pie chart that breaks down staffing and overtime at the Department.

I hope this answers your questions on how overtime is created in the Taunton Fire Department. If you have any additional questions please contact me.



Re: DEPARTMENTAL FINES

Dear Mayor and Councilors:

At a regular meeting of the Municipal Council held on Tuesday, August 12, 2014, the Council motioned that all Department Heads notify the Council of any fines assessed against their Department for non-compliance, how the fines are being paid, and whether they anticipate an assessment in the next six (6) months.

My response is as follows:

In August of 2013, the Building Department paid a compliance fee of \$5,200 to the Massachusetts DEP covering an underground storage tank at 110 County Street. Since a Remedial Action Measure (RAM) was filed with the agency after the tank removal, we anticipate the issue has been resolved and that there will be no more fees.

The Building Department continues to pay an annual fee of \$2,000 to the Massachusetts DEP covering a hazardous release of subsoil gases dating back to 2010. The fee will no longer be assessed once we reach a Permanent Solution which we hope will be accomplished in the early fall of this year. The most recent fee was paid in October, 2013.

Copies of the annual assessments are included for your review. There are no other non-compliance issues/fees assessed to the Building Department at this time.

Recommend to install 2-70w high-pressure sodium lights on poles 77 and 78. The last light is on pole 80. The distance from pole 80 to pole 78 is about 300 feet. In keeping with the policy of the City to put a light on every other pole, the next pole would be pole 78. Pole 77 the last pole, is in a cul-de-sac, and is surrounded by woods, would require a street light. Per Customers request.

- Estimate cost is \$ 10.58 per month
- Does not include fuel adjustment credit

It is requested that this street lighting report be presented to the Municipal Council, for approval of the energy services.
