Dear Members of the Taunton Municipal Council:

Thank you for your letter of June 12th, 2012, received in my office, July 2nd, 2012 and reviewed at our Executive Committee meeting on July 12th.

To address the issues you raised:

1. Security: Importantly, security is not solely the responsibility of the Taunton Development Corporation or the TD/MDC, and in fact, as a condition of closing on the property, immediate past Mayor Charles Crowley accepted, in writing, on behalf of the City, responsibility for the policing of the MSIP Expansion area, as has been the practice with the three previous phases of MSIP. A public safety meeting was held shortly after the acquisition of the property in January and the Taunton Police Department has been including the property in overlapping patrols as a result of the agreement. The Fire Department has developed a response plan for the property as well. The MSIP Neighborhood Watch program will be expanded to include the expansion area as new companies are added starting in 2013.

In addition, No Trespassing signs have been added, and arrangements are underway with TMLP to establish an internet based video surveillance system which will be able to be monitored remotely and will include 30 day recording capabilities. Placement of additional barriers and the repair of perimeter fencing will be reviewed as the redevelopment project progresses.

2. After a bidding process, a grounds keeping company has been contracted by TD/MDC to maintain the entrance (Bay Street) and around buildings in use; they are not going to mow fields or interior areas to be redeveloped. Roadways in use as completed will be trimmed as needed until new companies begin to maintain their properties to the road edge as is the practice in both MSIP and LUIP.

We are excited about the current response with over 200,000 sq. ft. of proposed new buildings in process along the new Charles F. Colton Road and interests of over 750,000 square feet so far in the balance of the property. As these projects become a reality we will certainly keep you posted. This will be held at the Vietnam Memorial on Church Green, Taunton, Ma. The Vigil starts at noon on the 22nd and concludes with a Remembrance Ceremony at noon on the 23rd.

Since 1983 the TAVVA has always been a forerunner in pursuing the POW/MIA issue. Each year, we remind people that there are still thousands of soldiers unaccounted for, from all wars. RE: The original TAT (the architectural team) map of Fairfax Gardens Hope VI, Taunton, MA-Context Site Plan and (6) page petition from residents who live on/off Shores Street requesting that no main entrance to the Fairfax Gardens Redevelopment housing project be erected between 129-135 Shores Street, Taunton, MA 02780.

Dear Council President Colton & Members of the City Council:

I want to appear before you, Mayor Thomas C. Hoye Jr, members of the City Council, Planning and Zoning board(s) to present and show you the original map used by Trinity Taunton Nine Limited Partnership to secure federal funding from Housing, Urban & Development for this project. On this original map, it will show the initial access/roadway leading out of the development to Shores/Fisher Street(s) across from the street from the John F. Parker Golf Course.

On this original TAT (the architectural team) map, you will see in writing "FUTURE POTENTIAL ROAD CONNECTION TO SHORES STREET" that runs straight to the golf course. This original access/roadway does not interfere with restricted wetland area(s) under "Conservation Restriction Area-9.34+ AC. Secondly, on this original map, there is no indication that the main entrance to the above-reference project was to be erected on Shores Street.

On Wednesday, November 9, 2011, 7:00 PM, abutters to the Fairfax Gardens property were invited to the unveiling of the Fairfax Gardens Hope VI. Colleen Doherty, Director of the Taunton Housing Authority and Mike Mathos were present. Also at this meeting were Hank Keating, Vice President, Design & Construction, Mathieu P. Zahler, Assistant Project Manager, Sarah Barnat and other representatives of Trinity Financial.

Upon closer inspection of the Fairfax Gardens Hope VI housing project layout map(s), one Shores Street abutter asked that no houses be built next to her home and officials from the THA/Trinity agreed upon her request. But when I requested that no main entrance to this housing project be placed in front of my home, not one official from the Taunton Housing Authority or Trinity Financial would accommodate my request. I got into a heated discussion with Trinity representative, Sarah Barnat over wanting to place the main entrance to Fairfax Gardens in front of my home.

During the first week of December 2011, Trinity representative, Sarah Barnat called my residence asking me to meet with her so that she could show me the new plans for Fairfax Gardens in person. Two weeks had gone by before I returned her phone call but I did leave her a message stating that "I was not interested in what she had to show me and that I didn't want the main entrance to Fairfax Gardens in front of my home." I couldn't make myself anymore clearer.

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On Wednesday, December 28, 2011, Connie Berdos, 112 Shores Street, Laura Wakefield, 123 Shores Street, Manuel & Maria Bonilla, 129 Shores Street and this writer, Kathryn Cunningham, 135 Shores Street received a FED-Ex package with a memo titled "Fairfax Gardens Redevelopment Update", (2) TAT-map(s) and (s) housing design layouts from Sarah Barnat, Trinity Financial. Since I vehemently opposed the main entrance to Fairfax Gardens from being erected in front of my home, officials from the Taunton Housing Authority/Trinity revised the original roadway leading out of this housing development to Shores/Fisher Street(s) and left this roadway area on their Revised "TAT map" blank. The roadway and the writing "FUTURE POTENTIAL ROAD CONNECTION TO SHORES STREET" had been removed from the TAT map(s) submitted to you and various board(s) in the city.

At the joint meeting held between the Planning Board and members of the City Council, on Tuesday, July 24, 2012, 7:00 PM, when I stood before you and asked that no main entrance to Fairfax Gardens be built in front of my home and that the roadway be built leading out to Shores/Fisher Street(s) towards the John F. Parker Golf Course, it was Hank Keating, of Trinity Financial who stood up and said that "the road could not be built…in that area because of the wetlands." I have the original TAT-(the architectural team map) to prove that Mr. Keating had deceived our Mayor, members of the City Council, the Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals by not informing them about the original map that showed the access/roadway leading out of the development to Shores/Fisher Street(s).

Attached are the (6) pages of signature collected by my two, senior neighbors and life-long-residents of Taunton and the Shores Street neighborhood. I am grateful for the help provided me by Mr. Charles Smith and Mr. William Bourque. The residents of the Shores Street neighborhood ask that our elected officials do not continue to ignore our needs and concerns. Lastly, we are law abiding citizens, taxpayers and constituents.

The only solution(s) to the Shores Street dilemma is to either: (A.) Keep Kilmer Avenue to DeWert Avenue as is, one-way in and one-way out of the Fairfax Gardens housing project; or (B.) Trinity Taunton Nine Limited Partnership returns to their original map and build the roadway leading out of their housing project to Shores/Fisher Street in front of the John F. Parker Golf Course. Lastly, where the fence has been cut out to make way for the proposed main entrance to Fairfax Gardens on Shores Street, Trinity can build a high, brick or stone wall to compliment their new housing development and let English Ivy cascade down the brick or stone wall.
