TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

GREEN WASTE CLEANUP

PART 1 GENERAL

Cleanup work under this subsection includes all labor, material, trucks, equipment and supervision to pickup, chip and transport tree, branch and brush debris (hereafter referred to as “processed green waste”) stockpiled along all City of Torrington public streets, on City of Torrington owned properties (*including schools*) and other as may be designated by the Engineer. Materials will be brought by the property owners on average to within 5 to 15 feet of the curb or road edge. Cleanup work includes pickup and transport of tree logs greater than 8 inches in diameter (hereafter referred to as “unprocessed green waste”). Contractor shall provide safe work zone.

Work includes all labor, material, equipment and supervision specifically supplying bucket truck(s), grappling equipment, transport trucks and crew(s) to remove storm damaged trees, trim snags and remove damaged hanging tree branches that are located within the street right of way. This part of the work shall also include the satisfactory cleanup of the green waste debris resulting from the tree cutting and trimming operations. City inspection will designate which damaged trees shall be removed completely and which trees shall be trimmed only.

The Contractor shall schedule work in sequence as follows:

The “bucket truck with crew” work shall be completed first, followed next with chipper work (“processed green waste”), and last by picking up “unprocessed green waste”.

A Notice to Proceed should be issued the third week of November 2011. Work shall be completed within 30 days from date of the Notice to Proceed. Any Contract amendments or modifications will be in writing. Use of any subcontractors shall be approved by the City of Torrington. **The Contractor shall submit with his bid a list of subcontractors and the percentage of overall work he plans to subcontract out.**

Any contract awarded on or after July 1, 2009 requires any mechanic, laborer, or worker who performs work in a classification listed on the prevailing wage rate schedule on any public works project to complete a ten (10) hour federal OSHA safety and health course and provide proof of completion to the City of Torrington.

This contract shall require payment of State of Connecticut Prevailing wage rates and Davis-Bacon Wage rates (the Contractor shall pay the higher of the State or Federal prevailing wage rate), and compliance with certain local, state and federal requirements. This project is partially federally funded. Wage rates will be issued under separate cover by addendum. (*See attached wages rates made part of addendum #2*)

PART 2 MATERIALS

The CONTRACTOR shall employ such equipment and materials necessary to perform the Work as customarily used for this cleanup operation such as chain saws, wood chippers that are **capable of chipping 15 inch diameter or larger** tree section, safety equipment, traffic control, bucket truck, etc. The contractor shall provide equipment specifically used for removal and transportation of large logs that are too large to be chipped. *The bucket truck shall have a minimum 50 extension.*

PART 3 EXECUTION

3.01 Cleanup:

- A. Cleanup operations shall be conducted in such a manner that motorist and adjacent property owners will be inconvenienced as little as possible.
- B. The Contractor shall leave the roads and all parts of the adjacent property affected by his operations in a clean, neat and satisfactory condition. Work includes raking and removal of small sticks and other small wood byproducts.
- C. Cleanup crew work includes removing green waste stockpiled along curbside. The Contractor shall schedule cleanup on streets in the order of numbered work zones as shown in the attached Cleanup Zone Map. Work shall progress from zone 1 to zone 5 in order or as directed by the Engineer. *Also supplementing the zone map is a spreadsheet indicating the district areas within. Cleanup operations shall be scheduled so that the designated zones and districts are followed in order.*
- D. Clearing operations shall be conducted so as to prevent damage to existing structures and properties, and so as to provide for the safety of employees and the public. Damaged trees shall be taken down in short pieces and shall not be cut and felled where damage is possible to the road and adjacent properties. Any existing structure, installation, accessway, parking lot, lawns or any other property that is damaged or claims filed for losses due to damage in the course of clearing or cleanup operations will be repaired at no cost to the city by the CONTRACTOR as directed by the ENGINEER. *Where lawns have to be crossed with equipment as an example in City parks where hangers have to be removed, the Contractor shall be responsible for repairing any damage to turf, remove any ruts made by equipment and reestablish turf. The contractor may use protective materials over lawn areas such as plywood sheets to help spread out equipment loads. Work in these areas may be scheduled later in the work schedule when the ground may have firmed up more due to colder conditions.*
- E. The contractor maybe directed by Engineer to work on private property or cross private property to access the work areas. Before the Contractor enters private

property, the City will obtain written permission from the property owner. The City's generic Right to Access Form will be used in such case.

- F. All damaged trees that are determined to be completely removed by the City Inspector shall be cut flush with the ground. There will be no grubbing work.
- G. A truck identification code will be used by the City inspectors at the cleanup areas and at the processing/recycling site(s) to track contract waste only.
- H. The contractor's work day shall be from 7:00am to 4:00pm Monday through Friday not including Holidays, Holiday weekends such as Thanksgiving. Extended hours may be approved by the Engineer. The contractor must be off the roads by 4pm however the processing/recycling site(s) will be open for disposal until 4:30pm.
- I. The Contractor shall use mechanical equipment to reasonably compact debris into trucks or containers.
- J. *The Contractor will be required to weigh a full truck load of processed green waste and three full loads of unprocessed green waste at the weigh station located at O&G Industries located on Bogue Road, Harwinton, Connecticut. The weight of the empty truck(s) to be used for weighing material loads shall also be recorded to allow the City to calculate the weight of a cubic yard of material(s).*

3.02 DISPOSAL OF MATERIALS:

- A. All green waste both in processed wood chip form or unprocessed logs shall be removed and transported by the Contractor to a State of Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) approved processing/recycling site(s) designated by the City of Torrington. **The location of the designated processing/recycling site(s) will be Supreme Industries, 216 Bogue Road, Harwinton CT 06791. The Contractor is not responsible for the payment of any disposal fees that may be charged at the offsite location(s). The City will be contracting directly with the owner of the designated processing/recycling site(s) to allow the City's contractor to dispose at the site.**

PART 4 MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

- A. The first bid item is for the work associated with the cleanup and transportation of "processed green waste" to the City's designated processing/recycling site(s). The actual quantity of chipped "processed green waste" material produced and transported to the City's processing/recycling site(s) will be measured by the cubic yard. Payment will be the unit price bid per cubic yard of "processed green waste" multiplied by the actual measured quantity.
- B. The second bid item is for the work associated with the pickup of "unprocessed green waste" and transportation to the City's processing/recycling site(s).

The actual quantity of “unprocessed green waste” material picked up and transported to the City’s designated processing/recycling site(s) will be measured by the cubic yard. Payment will be the unit price bid per cubic yard of “unprocessed green waste” multiplied by the actual measured quantity.

- C. Measurements for both “processed green waste” and “unprocessed green waste” will be made by the City Inspector at the processing/recycling site(s) and shall be calculated by taking the actual dimensions (length, width and height) of the material container. Deductions in material dimensions shall be made to reflect partially filled containers. Deductions may also be made if loads are not reasonably compacted into trucks or containers. *A page titled Truck Load Deductions Sample” found herein schematically shows partially fill trucks and varying percentages to be used as a general guide by the inspector in determining the deduction percentages of partially filled trucks/containers. The inspector’s determination shall be final.* A truck identification code at the cleanup areas and at the disposal site(s) will be used to track contract waste only.
- D. The third unit bid price is for work associated with “bucket truck with crew”. This work shall be measured by the number of hours of actual use of the bucket truck with crew in performing tree and hanging branch removals. The “bucket truck with crew” work shall only including dropping and stacking materials on the ground and will not include pickup. All cleanup work associated with the materials produced from “bucket truck with crew” operations and transported to the processing/recycling site(s) will be paid for under the respective “processed green waste” and unprocessed green waste” bid items. Payment for “bucket truck with crew” will be the unit price bid per hour multiplied by the actual measured quantity of hours per bucket truck with crew. Multiple bucket trucks with crews may be used and will be tracked separately and total hours compiled for calculating payment. The City inspector shall monitor actual hours of bucket truck work for measurement of payment.
- E. Unit price bids shall include all labor, equipment, tools, traffic control and signage, and all work incidental to complete the item as specified. *Fees to weigh full truck loads of materials will be incidental and will not be paid as a separate item. There will be no additional payment for work associated with protecting property and/or repairing any damage resulting from the Contractors operations.*

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

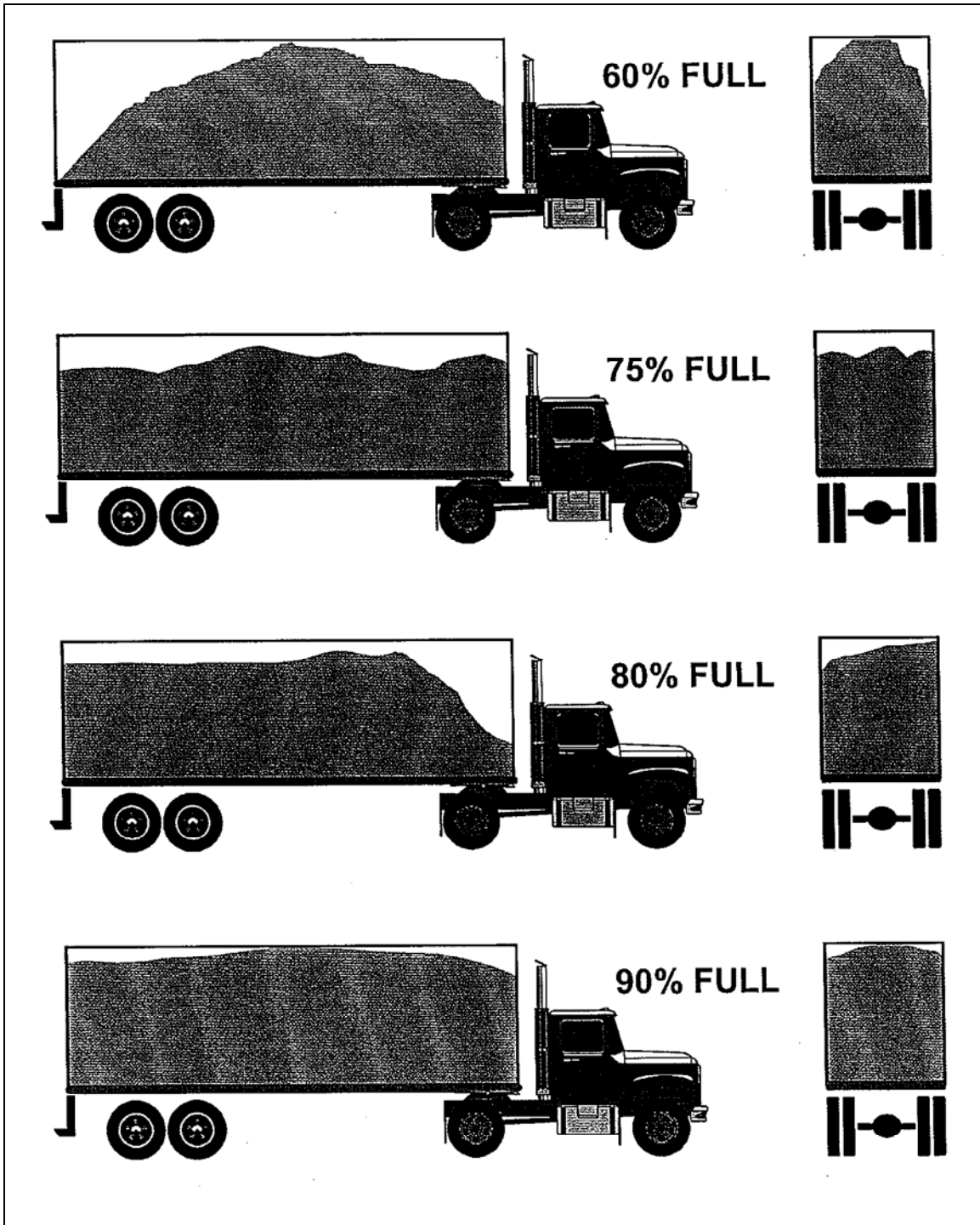

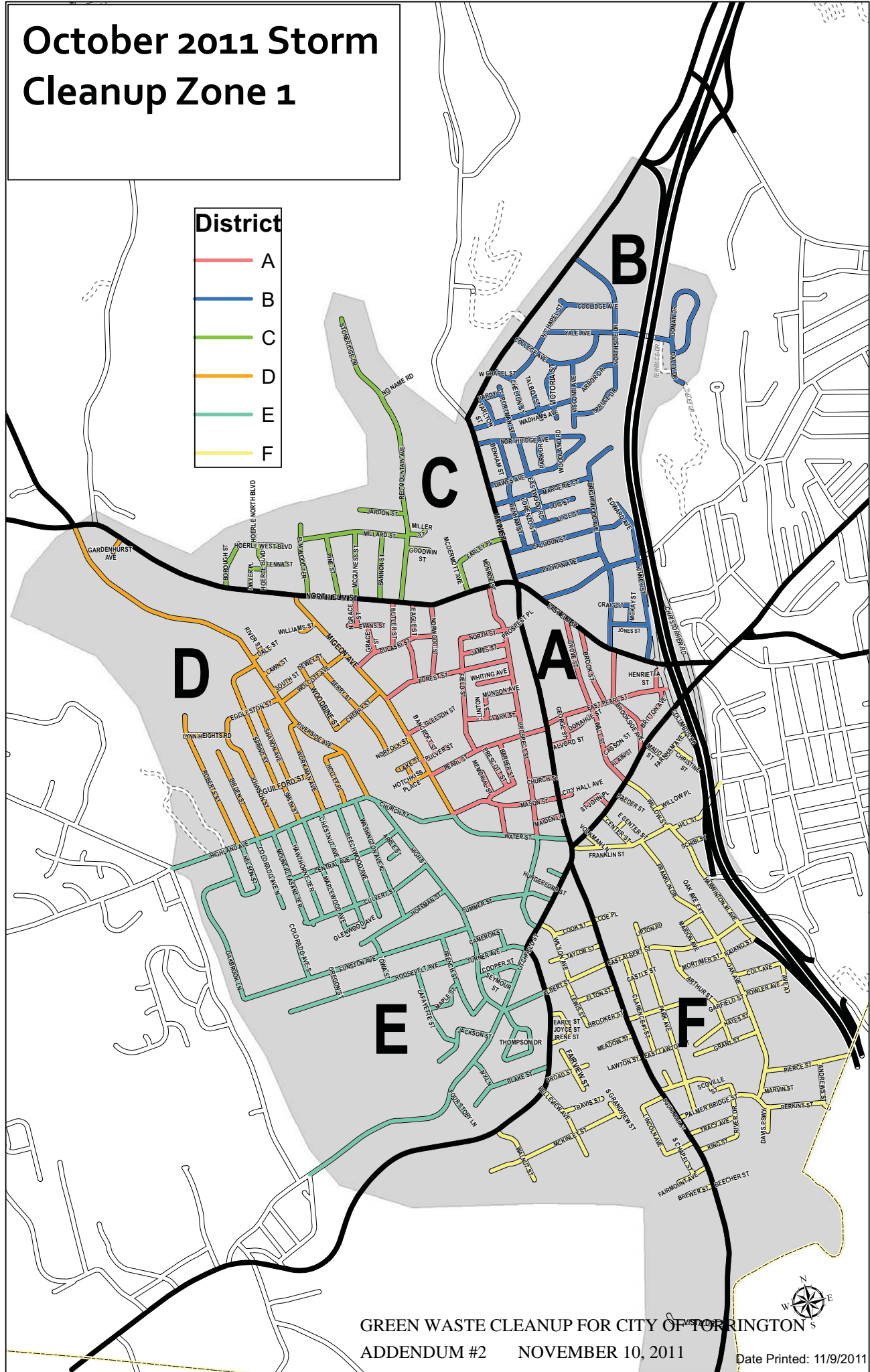
TRUCK LOAD DEDUCTIONS (EXAMPLE)

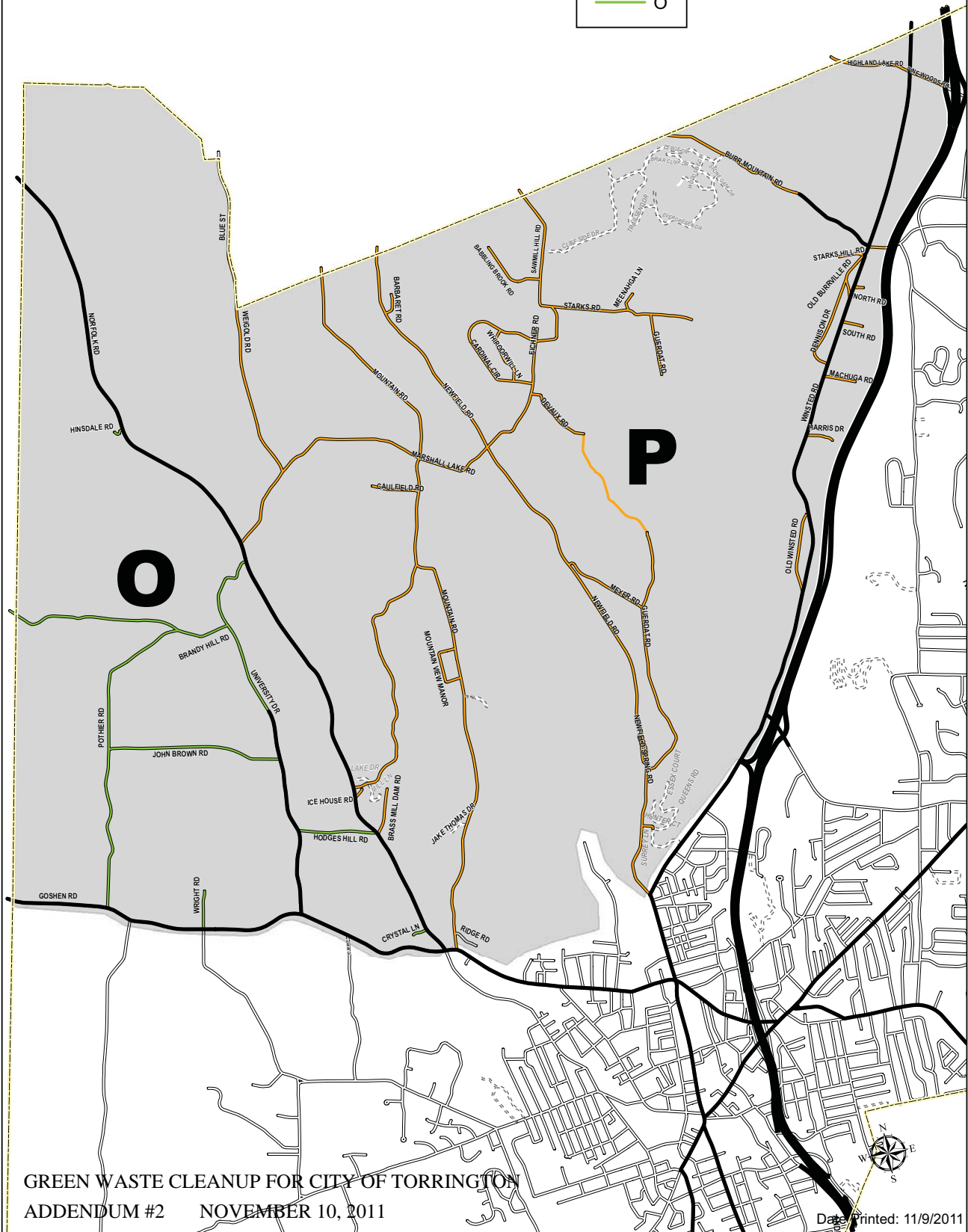
October 2011 Storm Cleanup Zone 5

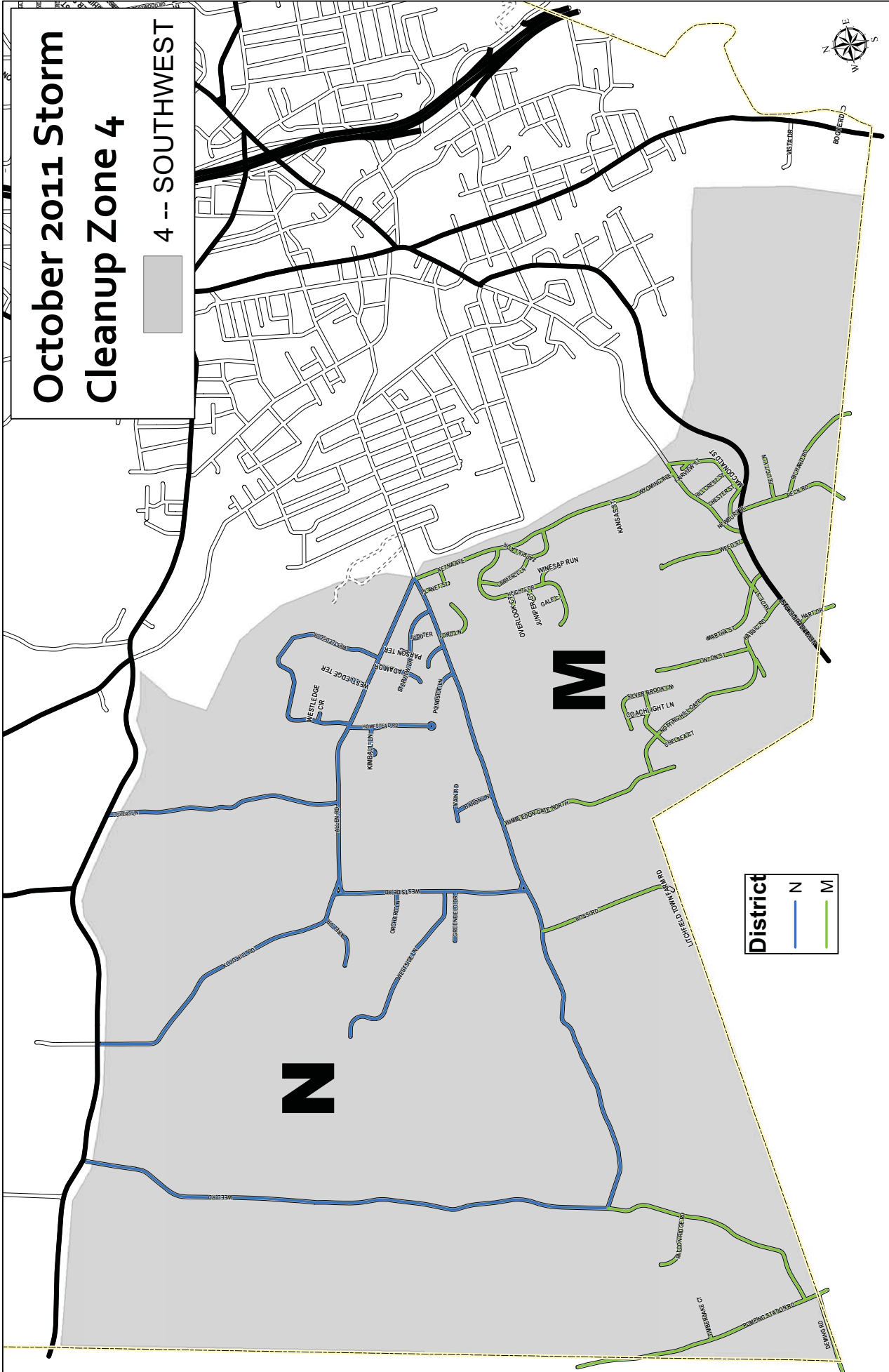


October 2011 Storm Cleanup Zone 4

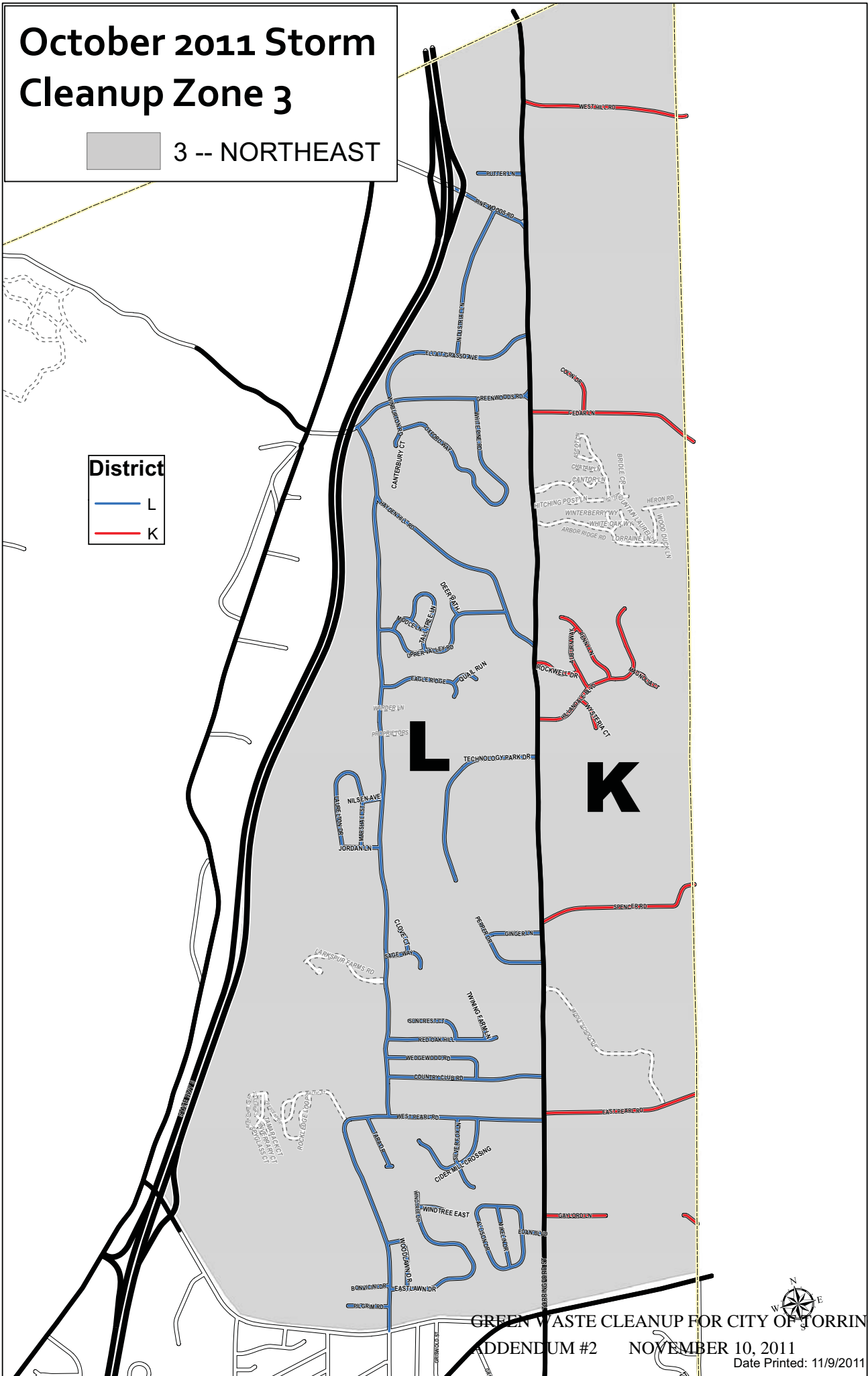

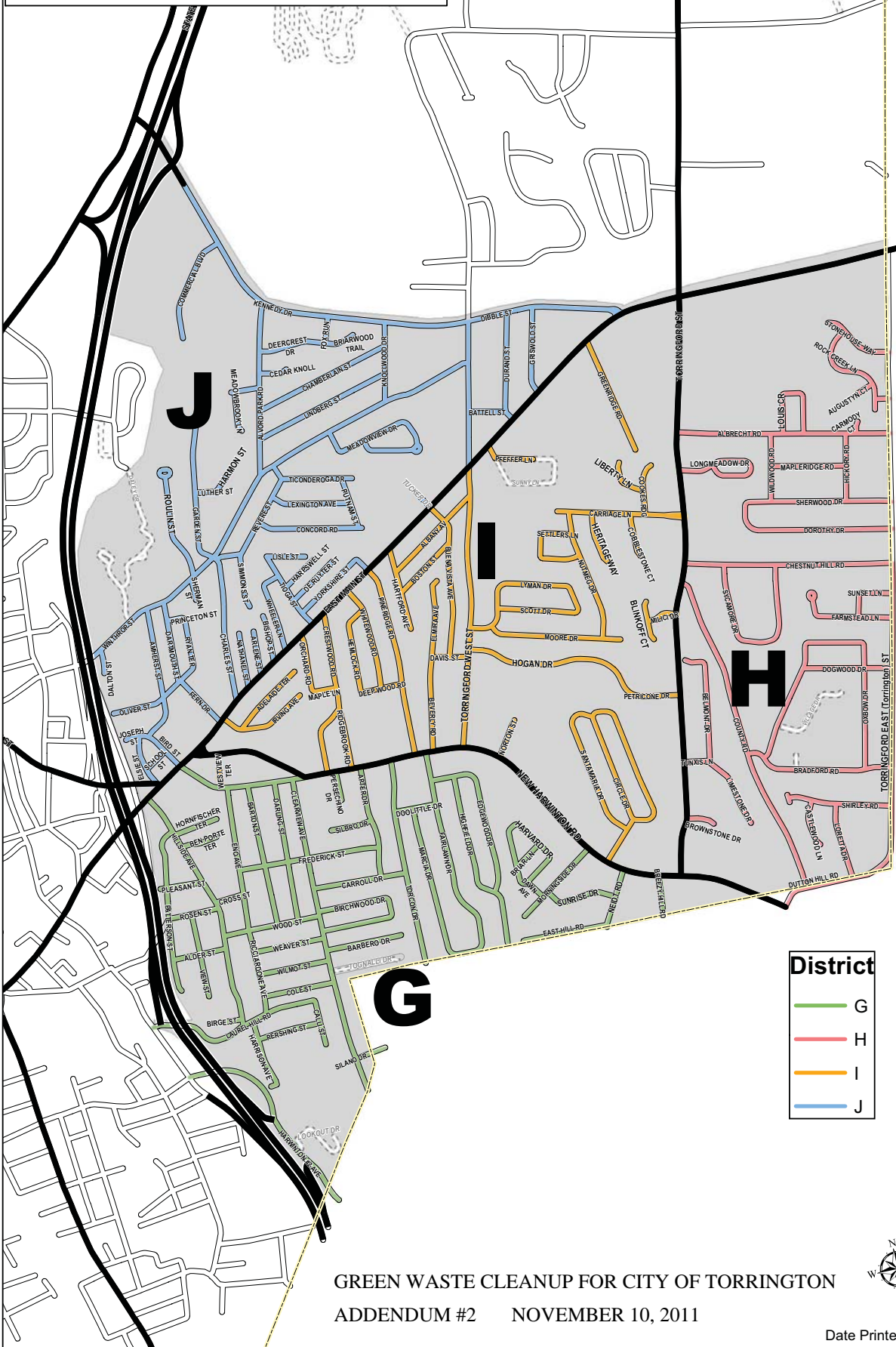
