TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

GREEN WASTE CHIPPING

PART 1 GENERAL

Chipping work under includes all labor, material, trucks, equipment and supervision to chip at curbside tree branches, tree parts, and brush debris (hereafter referred to as "processed green waste") stockpiled along all City of Torrington public streets, on City of Torrington owned properties (including schools) and other locations as may be designated by the Engineer. Materials will be brought by the property owners on average to within 5 to 20 feet of the curb or road edge. Work includes chipping tree logs up to 12 inches in diameter. Tree logs greater than 12 inches may be chipped at the contractor's option if equipment is capable of taking larger diameter materials. Any tree logs greater than 12" that the contractor's equipment is not capable of chipping or the contractor elects not to chip shall be left at curbside in a neat pile with the length of pieces not to exceed 42 inches. The Contractor shall provide a minimum three man crew with box truck and chipper. Contractor shall haul all chipped green waste to the City's designated processing/recycling site located at Supreme Industries, 216 Bogue Road, Harwinton CT 06791. The Contractor is not responsible for the payment of any disposal fees that may be charged at the offsite location(s). The City will be contracting directly with the owner of the designated processing/recycling site to allow the City's contractor to dispose at the site.

A Notice to Proceed should be issued shortly after award of the contract anticipated to be the fourth week of November 2011. Work shall be completed within 25 calendar days from date of the Notice to Proceed. Any Contract amendments or modifications will be in writing. Use of any subcontractors shall be approved by the City of Torrington.

The Contractor shall submit the following with his bid:

A list of subcontractors Percentage of overall work he plans to subcontract out Listing of Equipment available for this work Number of Chipper crews

Any contract awarded on or after July 1, 2009 requires any mechanic, laborer, or worker who performs work in a classification listed on the prevailing wage rate schedule on any public works project to complete a ten (10) hour federal OSHA safety and health course and provide proof of completion to the City of Torrington.

This contract shall require payment of State of Connecticut Prevailing wage rates and Davis-Bacon Wage rates (the Contractor shall pay the higher of the State or Federal prevailing wage rate), and compliance with certain local, state and federal requirements. This project is partially federally funded. (See attached wages rates)

PART 2 MATERIALS

The CONTRACTOR shall employ such equipment and materials necessary to perform the Work as customarily used for this chipping operations such as chain saws, wood chippers that are **capable of chipping up to 12 inch diameter** tree sections, box truck/container(s), safety equipment, traffic control, etc.

PART 3 EXECUTION

3.01 Chipping:

- A. Chipping operations shall be conducted in such a manner that motorist and adjacent property owners will be inconvenienced as little as possible.
- B. The Contractor shall leave the roads and all parts of the adjacent property affected by his operations in a clean, neat and satisfactory condition. Work includes removal of small sticks and other small wood byproducts.
- C. The Contractor shall coordinate his work schedule with City forces. Contractor shall schedule chipping work on streets in the order of numbered work zones as shown in the attached Cleanup Zone Map. Work shall progress from zone 1 to zone 5 in order or as directed by the Engineer. Also supplementing the zone map is a spreadsheet indicating the district areas within. Cleanup operations shall be scheduled so that the designated zones and districts are followed in order.
- D. Chipping operations shall be conducted so as to prevent damage to existing structures and properties, and so as to provide for the safety of employees and the public. Any existing structure, accessway, parking lot, lawns or any other property that is damaged or claims filed for loses due to damage in the course of chipping operations will be repaired at no cost to the city by the CONTRACTOR as directed by the ENGINEER.
- E. The contractor maybe directed by Engineer to work on private property or cross private property to access the work areas. Before the Contractor enters private property, the City will obtain written permission from the property owner. The City's generic Right to Access Form will be used in such case.
- F. The contractor's work day shall be from 7:00am to 4:00pm Monday through Friday not including Holidays, extended holiday weekends such as Thanksgiving. The contractor must stop chipping operations by 4pm, however the processing/recycling site(s) will be open for disposal until 4:30pm for deliveries.
- G. The Contractor will be required to weigh a full truck load of processed green waste at the weigh station located at O&G Industries located on Bogue Road, Harwinton, Connecticut. The weight of the empty truck to be used for weighing material loads shall also be recorded to allow the City to calculate the weight of a cubic yard of chipped material.

PART 4 MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

- A. The actual quantity of chips ("processed green waste" material) that are delivered to the City's processing/recycling site will be measured for payment. Payment will be calculated by taking the unit price bid per cubic yard of "processed green waste" and multiplying that unit price by the actual measured quantity of delivered chips inspected and recorded. There will be no separate payment for any logs greater than 12 inches, cut and stacked at curbside.
- B. Measurements for "processed green waste" will be made by the City Inspector at the processing/recycling site and shall be calculated by taking the actual dimensions (length, width and height) of the material containers. Deductions in material dimensions shall be made to reflect partially filled containers. A page titled Truck Load Deductions Sample" found herein schematically shows partially fill trucks and varying percentages to be used as a general guide by the inspector in determining the deduction percentages of partially filled trucks/containers. The inspector's determination shall be final. City inspectors will also travel with the contractor's chipping crew and will record pickup locations and loads and will also monitor materials for insect infestation. A truck identification code at the chipping locations and at the disposal site will be used by the inspectors to track contract waste only.
- C. Unit price bids shall include all labor, equipment, tools, traffic control and signage, and all work incidental to complete the item as specified. Fees to weigh full truck loads of materials will be incidental and will not be paid as a separate item. There will be no additional payment for work associated with protecting property and/or repairing any damage resulting from the Contractors operations.
