- Q1) Where are these 13 sidewalk Street Planters and (2) island pots located? Or do you know the dimensions of them? And the purchase of new plots for island beds on Main Street, the size of these?
- A1) The thirteen (13) sidewalk street planters are located on both sides of Main Street in downtown Torrington. The planter containers have a top exterior dimension of 30"x30"; the top interior or planting area is 22"x22"; the bottom interior dimension is 18"x18"; the height is 30". The pots are currently planted with Pencil Holly and English Ivy. The city wishes to retain those perennials and request that supplemental annuals be added to the planters. While some of the perennials may not have survived the winter, the city has made arrangements for the replacement of the dead plants and ask that the successful bidder see to the planting of the same. The two island beds are located on Main Street in downtown Torrington. The smaller northerly island approximately 190 S.F.; the larger southerly island approximately 792 S.F. Regarding the purchase of new pots for the island beds is discretionary that there be pots in the middle of the island to add dimension and ease of maintenance.
- **Q2)** On page 9 about 3/4 of the way down the page it says (3) Purchase new pots for Island Beds on Main St. However on Appendix A (pg12) it does not have a line item for adding any new pots. So my question is if they need or want new pots, how many, what dimensions, and where exactly would they go?
- A2) The number of pots for the center islands is discretionary. This is a suggestion that there be pots in the middle of the islands to add dimension and ease of maintenance. The purchase of the pots would be included in the labor and materials cost for the island beds.
- Q3) We are interested in bidding the garden beds and planters. Initial questions are; where are the 13 sidewalk street pots located and what size are they? Does the Mayor's office have a preference of

- choice for plant selection?
- A3) See question/answer 1. The pots are currently planted with Pencil Holly and English Ivy. The city wishes to retain those perennials and request that supplemental annuals be added to the planters. While some of the perennials may not have survived the winter, the City has made arrangements for the replacement of the dead plants and ask that the successful bidder see to the planting of the same.
- **Q4)** In scope of work it specifies that all plantings must be in by May 20th. We typically use Memorial Day as the date to have all plants planted. It is possible to get a killing frost up to that point.
- A4) This is a tentative date for the plantings "weather permitting".
- **Q5)** Under scope of work 'supply and plant all plant materials...' line item 2 is two island planters, are those existing planters? Line item 3 is for the purchase of new pots for the island beds on Main St. Should the cost of these be included in the labor and materials for the island beds on the Fee proposal or should they have their own line item. I would not expect it to be an annual purchase.
- A5) No, they are not existing planters. Yes, they should be included in the labor and materials cost on the Fee proposal for the island beds.
