a. Review and discussion with Andrew J. Bosse Forestry Service Forest Management Plan for Charlene Susan Besse Park on Riverside Avenue

Ms. Malanca explained to the Commission that this Forest Management Plan, phase 1 & 2, have been paid by an America the Beautiful grant from CT Department of Environmental and Energy Protection. Forester Andrew Bosse was hired to create a Forest Management Plan. He has

done an inventory of the forest and created a draft plan. Phase 2 is for local boards and Commissions to review and comment on the draft plan.

Forester Andrew Bosse was also present and discussed the details of this plan. He mentioned that the draft plan does not currently recommend a meadow, but some members of the Conservation Commission suggested that be considered. He stated that stand 4 would be a good place for a meadow. The Commission members thought this was a good idea as well.

The Commissioners thought it was a very good plan and supported its implementation, especially the removal on invasive species.
