# CITY OF TORRINGTON PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION MINUTES January 20, 2016

## 1. Call to Order:

Chairman Calkins called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m., Torrington City Hall Council Chambers, Room 218, 140 Main Street, Torrington, CT

### 2. <u>Attendance/Announcement by Chairman:</u>

Chairman Richard Calkins announced present and serving on the Commission this evening will be Paul Summers, Greg Perosino, Greg Mele, Donna Greco, Jon Sheaffer and Richard Calkins. Also present is City Planner Martin Connor.

## 3. <u>Minutes for Approval:</u>

#### a. 12/9/15

MOTION by Mr. Perosino to approve the 12/9/15 minutes, seconded by Mr. Summers, unanimously carried.

#### 4. <u>Old Business:</u>

#### a. Enforcement Update

No updates from Commissioner Summers. Mr. Connor noted he has invited the new Corporation Counsel Jamie LaMere to a future meeting, and he has briefed her on various Zoning and Wetlands issues.

#### 5. <u>New Business:</u>

a. Site Plan 1174

Applicant:NJR Constructions LLCLocation:3600 Winsted RoadProposal:Construct contractor workshop and office

Nicholas Mancini, Jr., appeared representing the applicant. Mr. Mancini reviewed his proposal for the currently vacant parcel. The shop will be approximately 4,000 square feet in size. The parking and workshop area was reviewed. The septic system design was briefly discussed.

Mr. Connor read his memo to the Commission dated January 4, 2016.

- 1. Prior to obtaining a Zoning Permit for the project, approval from the Torrington Area Health District is required for the proposed septic system and well.
- It is recommended that the applicant follow the advice of Fire Chief Gary Brunoli contained in his letter to the City Planner dated 12/22/15. Motion seconded by Mr. Perosino, unanimously carried.

Ray Drew, Water Pollution Control Administrator for the City of Torrington appeared before the Commission. Mr. Drew reviewed the history of this proposed project. Regular meetings have been held, and this interconnection has been discussed for years. Details of the proposal were discussed. This does not constitute an expansion of the City of Torrington sewer area.

Jim Frick of Woodard Curran appeared. The Woodridge Lake Sewer District is under a consent order, and they have been working to come up with a solution with DEEP. This proposal pipe from Woodridge Lake to the City of Torrington is a conveyance and transmission system only, there are no proposed connections along the entire length of the pipe. Neither Torrington nor Goshen has a will to add connections along this line. The route is shown on the map, along Route 4.

Jim Mersfelder of Woodridge Lake Sewer District appeared and explained the consent order they are under with DEEP since 1989, funding issues, etc.

Questions were posed by Commission members.

Mr. Connor read his memo to the Commission dated January 20, 2016.

Discussion followed.

Zoning designation for properties along the proposed wastewater transmission pipe route are not changed, WLSD pays its fair share of capital costs and associated operating and maintenance expenses and Torrington and the WPCA agrees that there is adequate capacity to accept the flow at Torrington's WPCA's Facility. Motion seconded by Mr. Perosino, unanimously carried.

Mr. Connor reviewed what this entails. ZEO Rista Malanca has attended an intensive Flood Plain Management seminar, and these are her suggestions to update our regs. A memo dated December 23, 2015 to the Commission has been prepared by Ms. Malanca. Mr. Calkins noted we should make a recommendation to FEMA to update the Flood Maps for Litchfield County. Maps are woefully inadequate.
