- Ms. Robinson suggested that a Parking Clerk be appointed to oversee the process and hear appeals and but that the administrative functions of the job, the process of setting up the tickets in Kelly and Ryan and taking payments be internalized. The Selectmen agreed.

- 50 Street. The current business at this location, Motuzas Motors will surrender his Class II license
- when the business is sold. Mr. Gray has been before the ZBA for approval on July 15, 2015 and
- 52 the hearing has been continued until August 19th pending further information.

Motion #6: Motion made by Selectman Brochu to authorize the issuance of a Class II license to display no more than fifty cars to Ronald Gray, the President of Keystone Automotive at 162 Milford Street when Mr. Motuzas surrenders his Class II license.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Motion to Approve Year End Transfers

There were transfers made to ensure that all payroll and expense accounts are not in deficit for FY 15. The largest one is ambulance services wages. This account was not projected to have a deficit; however there was an error made in the payroll process that caused an employee to be overpaid. A repayment plan with that employee has been established, but since the fiscal year has closed those monies can't be recouped to that year. The other overages are minor and mostly related to part-time employees who for various reasons at times worked a few hours over the amount budgeted for during the year.

77 <u>Motion to Approve Renewal of Hopedale Dispatch Agreement</u>

Since the last meeting the Town Manager had an opportunity to discuss with the Hopedale Town
Administrator regarding the terms of the renewal contract. The attached document provides for a
10% increase in the fee paid to Upton in FY 16, and 3.5% increases in FY 17 and FY 18. While
this is a little less in the 2nd and 3rd year than was previously proposed, it will cover
employment cost increases in these years and it continues the strong relationship built with
Hopedale.

Motion #8: Motion made by Selectman Brochu to enter into a Renewal agreement with Hopedale Dispatch as presented providing a 10% increase in the fee paid to Upton in FY 16, and 3.5% increases in FY 17 and FY 18.

Second: Chairman Picard, Majority Action of the Board.

Motion to Approve Contract for Purchase of Natural Gas for Town Buildings

A two year agreement for the purchase of supplied electricity for Town buildings was recently signed. State law in Massachusetts allows this for natural gas as well. Research on current rates for the eleven Town accounts indicates a lock into rate below .640 cents/therm, saving about \$2,000 per year. The Town Manager requested approval for the Acting Town Manager to execute a contract if the rate received on the day of the meeting achieves something below this amount.

Motion #9: Motion made by Selectman Brochu to authorize the Acting Town Manager to enter into a two year rate lock agreement with Constellation within a rate of 6.00 to 6.4.

Review Status of Private Ways for Snow Plowing

The policy set up last year for the plowing of private ways included a requirement that the Public Works Department annually inspect the private ways we plow and assess whether or not they meet those requirements. A list will be posted to the Town website and notice in the newspaper so that residents are aware of the status and have time to make repairs before the Board decides whether nor not the Town will plow those roads next winter. The Selectmen reviewed the enclosed list showing Breton Road and Shore Drive need some attention.

Motion to Approve Inter-municipal Agreement – Central Massachusetts Storm Water Coalition

Upton has participated in the coalition for a couple of years and has had a one year agreement in the last year to set out the parameters of the project and the fee. The project was largely funded by State grants which have ended, and thus the coalition needs a more permanent agreement in place in order to keep the tools and consultant services that are needed. The coalition has proposed a five-year IMA for this purpose. The Town Manager recommends that the Board execute the agreement. The small fee involved provides far more benefits than it can ever cost (GIS mapping that we use for this as well as pavement management and our street sign inventory as well as survey tools and water quality monitoring kits), as well as tools and documents that we'd need to develop anyway, which will continue to be done on behalf of all 28 towns.

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- 127 <u>Discuss Development Options 53 Acre Parcel on Hartford Avenue South</u>
- On July 8th a meeting was held with Pulte Homes who is in the process of acquiring a 53-acre
- parcel of land on the upper portion of Hartford Avenue South for development. That parcel
- currently has a comprehensive permit on it to build a 120-unit development that was to be called
- "Noble Vista" of townhouse style housing, of which 25% would be affordable units. The
- Planning Board discussed this on July 14th and likes the new option proposed by Pulte, and
- suggests that the Selectmen and the Affordable Housing Trust provide direction to the developer.
- The Selectmen will continue their discussion at the next meeting.

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- 136 Discuss Donation of Land for Conservation Purposes Meadow Drive
- The Conservation Commission was approached about a land donation for a parcel on Meadow
- Drive. The Selectmen will discuss this at the next meeting.

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- 140 Motion to Execute Title VI/Nondiscrimination Assurance
- A letter from the State Department of Transportation (DOT) regarding a request that the Board
- execute a confirmation that the Town will not discriminate in the projects completed with federal
- dollars was discussed.

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- 145 Motion #11: Motion made by Selectman Brochu to execute the Title VI/Nondiscrimination
- 146 Assurance Agreement.

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- 159 <u>Review Request for Mailbox Reimbursement 106 Glenview Street</u>
- The Board had received an email from a resident at this address as a result of approaching the
- DPW in July looking for reimbursement of a mailbox damaged over the winter. The resident
- was appealing the denial due to the fact that the request came in after June 30th. State law does
- not allow payments to be made for prior fiscal year bills, except by a vote of 9/10 of the voters at
- Town Meeting. The DPW has inspected the situation and the Director has separately indicated
- that he is not confident that the post was hit by a Town truck.
- No action was taken on this matter.

- 168 <u>Motion to apply for a Demolition permit 2 Grove Street</u>
- The building at this address was acquired by the Town in early March with the intent that it be
- torn down and the land used as parking for Town Hall in the future. The tenants have been
- relocated and the next step is to obtain a permit from Code Enforcement and the process for the
- Historical Commission to review and make a recommendation as to the building's historical
- significance would commence per the Town's bylaws. A decision about filing this permit is the
- action step for this item.

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Motion #13: Motion made by Selectman Brochu to authorize the Town Manager to apply for ademolition permit.

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- The Selectmen recommended a professional moving firm be contracted to assist in relocating the restored Weights and Measures cabinet from the Fire Station to Town Hall that was donated by
- the Historical Society.

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187 *Motion #14*: Motion made by Selectman Brochu to fund the move of the Weights and Measures cabinet in the amount of \$1200.00 from the Risteen Beautification Fund.

- Friends and DCR are planning an event at Upton State Forest to celebrate and to unveil the
