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DISCUSSION ITEMS

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<u>Review Special Town Meeting Warrant – November 18th</u>

The Town Manager explained the updates from the prior versions of the warrant:

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 Article #1 gives the Town the ability to amend the operating budget to manage the shortfall due to lower than expected grand list growth. The final amount hasn't been determined (through the recap sheet process). Options include a reduction in the insurance budget and some use of free cash. Transfers within the budget might also be looked at but until the amount is known this hasn't been determined.

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• The Affordable Housing Trust met Monday night and increased the request of CPC funds to \$200,000

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• Since some work at Kiwanis Beach to take down the fence around the tennis courts had already been done and paid for the amount of the article for this project has been increased by \$1,000 to \$43,000

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• The article on public safety signage was removed at the request of the Selectmen, to be considered in the spring

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• Due to the budget issue the typical article to put funds in stabilization was removed

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• Some other minor edits to various articles have been made.
