19 The Board welcomed James Gardner, COA Social Services Coordinator. Mr. 20 Gardner came before the Board to request \$15,000.00 from the Ella Risteen Trust Fund 21 (Claus B Fund) to assist struggling individuals and families in the community. The funds 22 will be sent to Superior Oil and Mr. Gardner, using the guidelines established, will 23 authorize fuel deliveries to needy citizens. He noted that the COA has already helped 24 sixty-one families. Under the SMOC program, some family's do not quality, so these 25 funds will help. The Selectmen agree that these funds are designed to help people in 26 need and authorized the amount of \$15,000.00 from the Ella Risteen Trust Fund Claus 27 28 Β.
