Community Preservation Committee Posted Meeting – April 6, 2011

Meeting opened at 7:32 pm. and suspended.

Public Meeting opened at 7:32.

- 1. Presentation by Kelly McElreath regarding Town Hall renovation project.
 - Ms. McElreath presented an introduction of the project.
 - Members of the Committee gave a historical overview of the facility, including the impact of the 1998 Mass. Historical Committee ("MHC") Grant of \$100,000.
 - The Committee conducted a space needs assessment to determine the space need now, 5 years and 10 years.
 - The Committee's architects, after consulting with an expert in historical preservation, developed a concept plan. That concept plan was sent to MHC and received favorable feedback.
 - MHC will not approve a concept plan must present either a schematic plan (\$75,000) or a design plan (\$100,000). MCH indicated it may consider a schematic plan.
- 2. Questions by the Board and responses:
 - Total project cost likely to be \$5 million.
 - If schematics are approved by MHC, then further design would be required.
 - The architects believe that MHC approval would be good for quite some time if the Town wasn't prepared to immediately fund construction.
 - The concept plan has room for additional meeting space Mr. Adams questioned whether there was a need for additional meeting space.
 - Mr. Desjardins stated that the Board of Health space was inadequate and noncompliant.

- Mr. Holmes questioned what the Town got for the \$50,000 in funds for the feasibility study.
- The Committee responded that the study was completed and was used in connection with the MHC submission.
- 3. Questions and comments from the Public:
 - Ken Glowacki, a member of the Capital Budget Committee. That Committee had some questions. Will the schematic allow for a cost analysis? Yes, per Ms. McElreath.
 - Mr. Glowacki questioned whether an RFP should be put out <u>first</u> before funds are approved.
 - Discussion as to how much of the funds will come from CPA.
 - Mr. Glowacki expressed concern that the analysis to date does not include investigation of alternatives for new construction, etc.
 - Ms. McElreath responded to several of the concerns.

Public hearing closed at 8:40 p.m.

- 4. Public hearing opened Restoration and archeological study of stone cave.
 - Presentation by David Mackey, co-chair of Upton Historical Commission.
 - Requesting \$24,500 to restore stonework of the cave and to study the archeological features of the site.
 - Questions as to whether volunteers could participate in or at least view the dig.
 - The Committee will get an answer by Town Meeting.

Public hearing closed at 8:55.

- 5. Motion made by Mr. Carey to recommend to Town Floor the Town Hall Renovation Committee's request for \$75,000, with \$56,836 coming from Historical Reserve Funds and the balance from undesignated funds.
 - Discussion regarding the scope of use of CPA funds.
 - Motion approved unanimously.
- 6. Motion by Mr. Holmes to recommend to Town Floor the Historical Commission's request for \$24,500 from the Historic Reserve Fund to the extent available and the balance from undesignated funds.

- Motion approved unanimously.
- 7. Discussion and approval of office expenses and discussion of pending projects.
- 8. Discussion regarding Sweetwilliam Farm project.
 - The Committee expressed significant concerns regarding the potential for further development of the site including an expanded barn, converting the store to a house, replacement farm stand and parking and the use of multiple temporary greenhouses 18 feet high and 16,000 square feet.
 - The Committee expressed concern that the Town was "sold a bill of goods" when the project was presented as the project was to preserve the existing farm, not allow for an expanded farming operation and additional structures.
- 9. Moved and approved to submit a warrant to Town Meeting to transfer \$10,000 to the Administrative Fund.
