George Peterson	<ul> <li>The legislative delegation began the discussion by informing those assembled that uncertain financial conditions in the state could have potential impacts on both towns and the regional school district. Information presented included:</li> <li>State revenues are off by roughly \$250M and are tracking well below projections</li> <li>As a result, it is expected that the Governor will invoke his 9C powers to make mid-year cuts.</li> <li>Although 9C reductions don't typically affect Chapter 70 or special education circuit breaker funding, the Governor may request an expansion of his authority to make those cuts</li> <li>The legislators generally agreed that there is too much uncertainty in the budget to make predictions about FY14 local aid, but they cautioned town and school officials to budget conservatively.</li> <li>The delegation reminded those assembled that they supported and</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Submit list of ideas for statutory relief and procedural flexibilities/Members</li> <li>Compile list and submit to legislators/Drennan, Fleming, Goddard</li> <li>Build consensus with advocacy associations and other local government/Members</li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>delivered increases in local aid for the current fiscal year including increases in regional school transportation and circuit breaker funding.</li> <li>Although there are some positive indicators that the economy is improving, the latest revenue numbers indicate a slowing of the economy.</li> <li>Dr. Maruszczak presented information on the effective reimbursement rate for regional school transportation and circuit breaker which showed a fairly sizeable gap between what the district spends and the reimbursement the district receives from the state. He thanked the delegation for their past support and asked for their continued support.</li> <li>Several ideas for statutory relief and regulatory flexibility were discussed including flexibility in the library accreditation policy and flexibilities related to Community Preservation Act (CPA) funds.</li> <li>The delegation suggested the Multi-board compile a list of ideas for policy relief and flexibilities and submit to them in early January so that they may be considered during FY13 budget discussion.</li> <li>They also suggested that we join forces with other cities and towns and perhaps leverage our relationships with the Mass. Municipal Association, the Mass Association of School Committees and the Mass Association of School Superintendents to build consensus and support for our ideas.</li> </ul>
