UXBRIDGE BOARD OF SELECTMEN MEETING UXBRIDGE TOWN HALL BOARD OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING ROOM MONDAY, OCTOBER 26, 2009 - 7:00PM

Present: Chair Michael Potaski, Vice Chair Kevin Kuros, Clerk Beth Pitman, Selectman Peter Baghdasarian and Selectman Cari Kay Robertson. Also present, Town Manager, Michael Szlosek and Administrative Assistant, Tracey Ante.

I. CALL TO ORDER AT 7:00PM

A. Announcements

Chairman Potaski announced the upcoming Mason's Halloween Party, October 30th. He read a statement from a citizen thanking the Uxbridge Police and the Animal Control Officer for their helpful response action for a missing dog. Alternatives will hold its annual Tapestry Arts Show November 13, 2009 through December 11, 2009. Art work will be displayed at the Town Hall.

Selectman Beth Pitman offered an apology to the community for her recent comments.

Citizen's Forum

Residents were present and addressed concerns with regard to Ms. Pitman's recent comments and submitted a petition.

I thank the Chairman for the opportunity to publicly and sincerely offer my apologies to the community and to any and all who were offended by my recent comments. After several weeks of reaching out to others in the community, selfreflection and discussion with my children, I have come to the conclusion that this is not an error which will prevent my working effectively on behalf of our community. I have learned a valuable lesson or two which will, in fact, make me an even better Selectman. Many people in the community were kind enough to point out to me that my comments were in fact a response to comments made by my colleague Selectman Robertson and yet she was not chastised or attacked for her position. While I consider what we both said, in hindsight, to have been impulsive and poorly worded, I also think that it is clear that the attacks on me were motivated by partisan politics and by opposition to the school building project. This can be the only explanation for why Selectman Robertson's comments were completely ignored. I will continue my commitment to public education and to the overall well-being of our community, but I will also work harder to be less impulsive and more thoughtful during our deliberations and discussions. I was not born a Selectman and I am learning.

I acknowledge that those who oppose me are motivated by hatred and that comments on local discussion boards are proof of this.

I acknowledge that my home is in foreclosure. I am a single mother of two children trying to hold things together in my private life WHILE serving my community and that the need for a high school transcends even MY personal financial problems. IRONICALLY, I am being attacked here and on the Internet by SOME people who are far better off than I am financially and are accusing ME of selfishness when my personal financial situation is so dire. My position on the school is about what is in the best interests of this town, not about my personal

needs or wants. My son will never see the new high school and my daughter probably won't either. Again, this is not an issue of personal benefit to me.

I welcome all citizens to reach out to me, via phone or email, as your opinion is important to me. My phone number is publicly listed and my email is on the Town website.

Again, I am truly sorry for having offended anyone.
