Conservation Commission Meeting Minutes Monday, June 6, 2016 Board of Selectmen Meeting Room, Uxbridge Town Hall

Present: Chairman Patrick Hannon, Treasurer/Vice Chair Jim Hogan, Secretary Jeff Shaw, Member Lauren Steele, and Melissa Dillon-Conservation Administrator

It being 6:30 pm, the meeting being properly posted, duly called and a quorum being present, the meeting was called to order by the Chair.

- 1. Andrew Gorman-Potential New Member
 - Discussion: Mr. Gorman is a technical writer for Natural Services and has been following some cases that the Conservation has been dealing with.
- 2. Eagle Project-Francis Caccavelli
 - Discussion: Mr. Caccavelli would like to build 4 benches around the pond in order for better viewing
 of the Pond and in order to keep an eye on children. The benches would be open so you can sit on
 both sides and will be spaced easily.
 - o MOTION: I, Mr. Shaw move that we accept the Eagle Project to install 4 benches at the edge of the Pond. Seconded by Mr. Hogan, the motion carried 4-0-0.
- 3. Discussion on Pout Pond
 - Discussion: Only Coast Guard Approved Lifejackets will be accepted at the pond and water wings and arm floaties can only be used in the swimming area. Passes will be handed out the next day with the rules stapled to a bag containing the parking pass and bracelet. The North Uxbridge Polish American Club has donated the services to help fix up the Snack Shack including drop ceilings
 - o MOTION: I Mr. Hogan, move we approve the Pout Beach Rules as amended. Seconded by Ms. Steele, the motion carried 4-0-0.
 - o MOTION: I, Mr. Shaw, move that we accept the fees as \$45 for a Season Pass and \$3/person for walk ins. Seconded by Mr. Hogan, the motion carried 4-0-0.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

1. Request for Determination of Applicability (RDA), 114 Douglas Street (Map 18B, Parcel 4545)
Applicant: David Martin

Project Description: Repaying of existing driveway within the Buffer Zone to an underground brook and culvert.

- Discussion: No representative present.
- MOTION: I, Mr. Hogan, move that we issue a Positive Determination. Seconded by Mr. Shaw, the motion carried 4-0-0.
- 2. Request for Determination of Applicability (RDA), 156 Albee Road (Map 41, Parcel 2975)

Applicant: Frank & Jill Kenrick

Project Description; Removal and clean-up of downed and rotted trees within the Buffer Zone to a resource area.

- Discussion: The Kenrick's would like to clean up the site for safety as there are people who fish at the pond. The Commissioners would like the trees that are fallen by or in the pond to stay but the ones that are standing and dead and by the road can be removed. The trees to be removed should be marked and then approved by the Commission. A site visit is set for Thursday the 9th at 7pm.
- MOTION: I, Mr. Shaw move that we continue the Public Hearing until the next scheduled meeting. Seconded by Mr. Hogan, the motion carried 4-0-0.

Applicant: TTK Real Estate, LLC

Representative: Andrews Survey & Engineering

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Project Description: Proposed 15 lot Residential Subdivision with associated grading, drainage, and utilities that has portions within the Buffer Zone of a Bordering Vegetated Wetland.

- Discussion: DEP File number received with DEP comments. Mr. Connelly gave an overview of the project. The representative would like to schedule a site walk and determine how much of the site should be staked out. It is still going through peer review with the Planning Board and there is expected to be more. Ms. Steele believes that the drain easement should be revisited and determined as a wetland. A site visit was set for the 16th at 6:30pm.
- MOTION: I, Mr. Shaw, move that we continue the Public Hearing until the next scheduled meeting. Seconded by Mr. Hogan, the motion carried 4-0-0.
- 4. Notice of Intent (NOI), DEP #312-1013, 255 Chocolog Road-Cobbler's Knoll (Map, 39, Parcel 4254)

Applicant: FIKOW, LLC Representative: Andrews Survey & Engineering Project Description: Construction of 52 single-family residential building lots and associated grading within the Buffer Zone of Bordering Vegetated Wetlands.

- Discussion: Asked to be continued.
- o MOTION: I, Mr. Hogan, move that we continue the Public Hearing until the next scheduled meeting. Seconded by Mr. Shaw, the motion carried 4-0-0.

Applicant: Countryside Associates, LLC Representative: Andrews Survey & Engineering Project Description: Construction of 12 townhouses with associated paving, landscaping, utilities, and earthwork within the 200' Riverfront Buffer Zone

- o Discussion: Asked to be continued.
- o MOTION: I, Mr. Hogan, move that we continue the Public Hearing until the next scheduled meeting. Seconded by Mr. Shaw, the motion carried 4-0-0.
- 6. Notice of Intent (NOI), DEP #312-1014, 177 River Road (Map 45, Parcel 3166)

Applicant: Giguere Realty

Representative: Heritage Design Group
Project Description: Construction of a septic system for an existing garage with second floor office within' the
200' Riverfront Area of the Blackstone River.

- Discussion: Administrator talked with FEMA about the septic being in the flood zone. FEMA stated that regardless of where it stands in the flood zone as long as there is no elevation change there is not a problem. Special condition that construction soils are taken off site.
- o MOTION: I Mr. Hogan, move that we approve the Notice of Intent with the Uxbridge Standard Conditions and the special condition that all construction spoils will be taken off site. Seconded by Mr. Shaw, the motion carried 4-0-0.

 - Discussion: No representative is able to make it to the meeting but is willing to address the situation. There was an anonymous complaint about the landscaping waste and that they are using it as a dumping site for their business waste.  - Discussion: The Commission will wait until Joe Bellino from DEP comes back from vacation.

 - o Discussion: Mrs. King sent in a letter of concern and all concerns will be address with Dam Safety

 - o Discussion: Passing off to DEP.
