Conservation Commission Meeting Minutes Monday March 6, 2017 Board of Selectman's Room, Uxbridge Town Hall

Please note some items may have been taken out of agenda order.

Present: Chair Jim Hogan, Vice Chair Andrew Gorman, Treasurer Jeff Shaw, Members Pat Hannon and Agent Melissa Dillon.

It being 6:30 pm, the meeting being properly posted, duly called and a quorum being present, the Chair called the meeting to order.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

1. Request for Determination of Applicability (RDA), FY17-8, 70 West River Road-Pout Pond (Map 13, Parcel

Applicant: Pout Pond Recreation Committee

Project Description: Placement of washed sand on the beach at Pout Pond for recreational purposes.

Discussion: Cindy Scott, on behalf of Pout Pond Recreation Committee, attended to request placement of sand on the beach. Pine Sand and Gravel has been the past provider and has given option of 2 types of washed sand, brick and concrete. Brick was agreed upon as it is cleaner. The amount of sand will be around 25 tons, or about a truckload - delivered around May - they will cover the septic with a picnic table to identify it so that it does not get driven over.

MOTION: Mr. Hannon moved to make a negative determination for the work. Seconded by Mr. Shaw, the motion carried 4-0-0.

2. Notice of Intent (NOI), 629 Hartford Avenue East (Map 8, Parcel 3533)

Applicant: David Craig

Representative: Andrews Survey & Engineering, Inc. Project Description: Construction of a single-family home with associated earthwork, utility, and landscaping within the Riverfront Area

Discussion: No DEP number has been issued yet. Applicant has requested a continuance for the next meeting.

MOTION: Mr. Gorman moved to continue the public hearing. Seconded by Mr. Shaw, the motion carried 4-0-0.

3. Abbreviated Notice of Resource Area Delineation (ANRAD), DEP #312-1028, Crownshield Avenue, Hyde Park Circle, Tea Party Drive (Map 29, Parcels 3126, 3117, 3053, 3084, 2965, 3866, 3099, 3987, 3895, 3825, 4682, 3162, 696, 4693, 4745, 4858, 4829, 4884)

Applicant: Rick Terrill, Uxbridge Multi Family

Representative: Goddard Consulting LLC

Project Description: Request to verify the wetland delineations are correct at the listed parcels.

Discussion: Applicant requested continuance since the peer review has not been finished.

MOTION: Mr. Gorman moved to continue the public hearing to the next scheduled meeting. Seconded by Mr. Shaw, the motion carried 4-0-0.

REPORTED/ONGOING VIOLATIONS

- 1. Cumberland Farms
 - Discussion: Mr. Rick Lauter, Regional Manager, on behalf of Cumberland Farms, attended to respond to a potential violation. The vendor was supposed to haul it off site. Safety Ballards were being installed when they had a problem. Dig safe was contacted on 2/1 & 2/17 for core drilling but they went through a gas line. During this event the station was shut down since the line was incorrectly marked during these issues the material was placed aside and forgotten about and must have been disposed of incorrectly. Mr. Lauter is unsure which contractor placed the soil there. The vendor will go back and clean up the area. There is about 1.5 cubic feet of material in the water and will be removed using ladders, hand shovels, and 5-gallon buckets. Commission agrees to issue a 'friendly' enforcement order in order to correct the violation.
 - MOTION: Mr. Gorman moved to issue an enforcement order for 22 Douglas Street to remove the
 deposited soil using hands and no machinery and dirt is removed off site. Seconded by Mr. Shaw, the
 motion carried 4-0-0.

2. 79 River Road

 Gary Dulmaine checked in with the owners and is overseeing the project. This will be removed from the agenda.

Denise Child is going to the site on Friday 3/10, 8am and members are welcome to attend. Commission is
concerned that work is going on that was not approved including storage of soil and cutting of trees.
Commission will see what comes out of the visit with DEP and request a scheduled for work. Work is still
in the jurisdiction of the conservation commission even with superseding Order of Conditions.

4. Crownshield (Hyde Park)

Building permit plan submitted- The Commission questions if the plan accurately shows what is currently
in the field. Commission members reviewed pictures taken from previous site visit. Ms. Dillon indicated it
would be beneficial to see the site again on their own. Construction material is already over the Members
to measure it out Mr. Hogan will reach out to the building inspector and visit the site with the agent.
Melissa will work with Mark to help get permission for other members to obtain permission to visit the site
on Saturday at 9am.
