

Re: 2013/2014 Council Goals and Objectives

On October 28, 2013 a workshop was held to discuss the goals and objectives for the Council for 2013/2014. From this meeting the following was determined to be the goals and objectives of the council in no certain order:

- 1. Update the Town's website
- 2. Restart discussion with Bangor Gas on the installation of natural gas in other locations throughout Veazie
- 3. Review wages for all employees and have yearly employee evaluations completed
- 4. Review the Town's Charter, Land Use Ordinance, Public Safety and School Department
- 5. Reconnect with the sewer and water departments by having quarterly or semi-annual meetings
- 6. Develop a plan for the future of the Community Center, the reuse of vacated public works space and improvements to the roads located throughout the town
- 7. Provide better direction for the Budget Committee

#### Grounds Maintenance Contract

This contract is between the Town of Veazie (referred to as "we" or "our") and Bangor Lawn & Landscape (referred to as "you"). When this contract refers to you, it includes your employees and agents. This contract is for grounds maintenance services.

#### Services and Terms

Provide grounds maintenance services for the municipal and school owned properties listed on the mowing site schedule attached. Services to begin on April 1, 2015 and continue until November 30, 2015. Service to include spring clean-up and fall clean-up as indicated in the general requirements of this contract.

#### **Independent Contractor**

You and your agents and employees, during the performance of this contract, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers, employees, or agents of the Town. Any manpower needed to fulfill the obligations described under this contract shall be employed by you and you shall be solely responsible for complying with applicable State and Federal laws including, but not limited to, worker's compensation law, employment security law, and minimum wage law.

As an independent contractor, you will also be responsible for maintaining your equipment in a safe, operable, and legal condition.

As an independent contractor, you will be responsible for all bills for labor, materials, equipment, and fuel and any other items which are incurred in providing the services outlined below. The Town will not pay such bills.

As an independent contractor, you have the right and duty to supervise and control your employees, agents, and equipment. The Town personnel has the right to inspect mowing operations and notify you of any problems, errors, or non-performance.

#### THE CONTRACTOR AGREES TO PERFORM THE FOLLOWING WORK:

#### General requirements:

- To furnish adequate and satisfactory equipment and manpower to maintain the required properties on a weekly basis.
- Grass will be cut at a height of 3" to minimize storm water runoff unless specific site requirements, which are included, dictate otherwise.
- Unless the volume of grass clippings becomes too unsightly, it is preferred that clippings remain in place as mulch except in Fairview Cemetery where all clippings will be removed from any and all headstones or grave markers.
- Each Spring Season prior to mowing each location named in List A shall be power raked, removal of deadfall of limbs, removal of leaves, remove accumulated trash and make necessary repairs to prepare areas for ground maintenance. It is mandatory that this occurs at Fairview Cemetery prior to Memorial Day so that the Cemetery is in order for this holiday.
- Each Fall Season remove leaves and accumulated trash in locations named in List A locations and prepare grounds for off season. This may need to occur several times depending on the leaves that have fallen

**Insurance:** Provide proof of the following insurance coverage:

- Worker's Compensation must be provided in accordance with Maine Law
- General Liability: \$1,000,000.00 each occurrence, \$5,000.00 medical experience (any one person), \$1,000,000.00 general aggregate, \$1,000,000.00 products com/op aggregate, \$1,000,000.00 automobile liability combined single limit (each accident)
- The Town shall be listed as additional insured on your policy

#### Breach of contract:

If you are in violation of any of the terms of this agreement, or if the Town Manager or his/her designee are of the opinion that the work described in this contract is being performed unsatisfactorily, the Town Manager or his/her designee shall notify the contractor by either regular mail, e-mail or certified mail setting forth the basis for the Town's complaint. Upon receipt of such notice, you will have ten (10) calendar days to comply with the terms and conditions of the contract or rectify the unsatisfactory work. If, at the expiration of the ten (10) calendar day period you are still not in compliance with the conditions of the contract or the work is still unsatisfactory, the Town Manager or his/her designee will, by mail, e-mail or certified letter, notify you to discontinue all work. The Town may thereupon, by contract or otherwise, complete the work and you will be liable for costs which exceed the rate provided in this agreement. Such charges shall be deemed liquidated damages.

#### Indemnification:

You agree to hold the Town harmless from any claim for death, injury, property damage, or other loss which may result from your performance of ground maintenance services. In the event that such a claim is made against the Town, you will defend the Town, and you will pay any amounts (indemnify) for which the Town may be held liable in a legal action for such claims.

#### Terms of the contract:

The terms of this contract is for the ground maintenance seasons from April 1, 2015 through November 30, 2015, with an option to extend the contract without returning to the bidding process.

#### Price:

Price for ground maintenance as outlined in this contract is: \$14,980.00

#### Payment:

Payment for services shall be made on the Tuesday following the regularly scheduled Council meeting after invoices are received and approved by the Town Council. Invoices must be received via US Mail by no later than 1200 P.M. on the Monday before regular scheduled Council meetings to be processed. If received after this time they will not be processed until the next regular scheduled Council meeting. Currently the Town Council meets the (2) and (4) Monday of the Month. This is subject to change when the Council sets meeting dates which occurs in June of each year.

# Manager's Report For July 28, 2015 Council Meeting

Since the last council meeting here are some things I've been working on and/or have been occurring around Town:

I have met with Hopkins on the paving that was recently approved. A contract was prepared and has been returned. Over the next few weeks they will be preforming the preparation work before the drag shim is applied. After that is completed the services in the paved way can be raised to the correct height and final surface will be applied once this is completed.

Following the Public hearing for the School Budget the warrant has been posted and all other necessary paperwork has been completed for the Town meeting scheduled for July 28<sup>th</sup>.

Barney and I met with a homeowner on Jackson drive that has a culvert that has to be reset because of prior improper installation. Silvers has this scheduled to occur next week.

I have met with David Hewins from Maine Communication Consulting. Mr. Hewins will be assisting the Town in replacing the phone system. Money for the replacement was budgeted and approved at the Town meeting. Our current system is antiquated and is in desperate need of replacement. Mr. Hewins and I will meet again on the 30<sup>th</sup> to review quotes that have been received. After our meeting he will meet with the Council to make a presentation and receive final approval on what system will be purchased.

I have continued to work with Time Warner to upgrade our internet speed. The lack of internet speed has been very problematic since we upgraded the Town's Municipal network to a single network. The basis of the problem has been Time Warner working out a pricing schedule that works in conjunction with our franchise agreement. Both staff and I hope that this upgrade occurs very soon.

I attended the economic development meeting and had a very good discussion with them. From the meeting I took away several assignments and will provide them with my findings at a future meeting.

I have met with a member of the Garden Club on town sign planters. She has developed a plan for the planting area and needs assistance making it a reality. With the donation of 2 rocks from Lou Silver the project can move forward. These rocks were placed by me on July 23. Once completed this will certainly make the entrance signs much more appealing.

New fencing has been installed between the back of the cemetery and the towns lay down yard for leaves and brush. This is a great improvement to the wooden fence that has been located there for many years. Next week we will be working on filling in three different roads to make way for additional plots at the cemetery. We will be using the stockpiled compost to accomplish most of this project, which will reduce the size of the pile. After the completion of this we will be burning the brush that was

collected this past fall. This will finalize the work that has been undertaken at the cemetery over the past year.

The Veazie Seniors met in the Council Chambers for their monthly meeting/luncheon and I prepared a BBQ for them. The event was well attended and is always a highlight of my day to see them in the building. Following the meeting a group of them volunteered to come in and clean the wall surfaces throughout the municipal building. This was greatly appreciated by Staff.

I installed numerous new bus signs for the Community Connector. This was needed since the signs that we had were outdated and displaced the old name of the Community Connector. A majority of them have been replaced but a few additional ones are left. These will be changed once additional signs are received.

I have attended numerous construction status meetings concerning the paving of State Street

Julie Strout and I met with a representative from MainePers who provides retirement benefits for the Public Safety departments. The meeting answered any questions we may have had and also to make sure we had up to date participant information.

I attended the Penobscot Regional Communication Board meeting along with the Bangor Region Fire Chiefs meeting. Both meetings were very informational.

Numerous notices of liens have been prepared and sent out as required.

Members of the Economic Development Committee and I passed out gift bags to the youth who participated in the river race. The youth division was the only group that ended in Veazie.

Notification was received from the State of Maine that our Chloride Outreach Plan has been approved. This is part of our general storm water permit requirements.

#### Home Fire Safety

In the wake of the tragic death of a nine-year-old boy when fire swept through a mobile home in Hermon, and in light of this being the ninth fire-related death in Maine so far this year, it is important to know some important tips regarding home fire safety.

According to the American Red Cross, if a fire starts in your home, you may have just two minutes to escape.

The most effective way to protect yourself and your home from fire is to identify and remove fire hazards. Sixty percent of house fire deaths occur in homes with no working smoke alarms. During a home fire, working smoke alarms and a fire escape plan that has been practiced regularly can save lives.

#### Fire Safety Tips

- · If a fire occurs in your home, GET OUT, STAY OUT, and CALL for help.
- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms, and outside sleeping areas.
- · Test smoke alarms once a month, if they are not working, change the batteries.
- Talk with all household members about a <u>fire escape</u> plan and practice the plan twice a year.

Dear Mark:

Thank you for submitting Veazie's Chloride Outreach Plan per Maine's Municipal Stormwater Permit requirements.

We are approving the plan submitted to DEP on July 7, 2015. We found the level of effort to reduce the potential discharge of chloride to local surface and ground water to be minimal. We realize this is in part due to the contracted nature of winter road maintenance in Veazie but we would like to encourage Veazie to continue to explore options during the remainder of this permit cycle.

While Veazie residents are not an outreach target it may behoove Veazie to consider taking advantage of opportunities to occasionally raise the topic and plant the seed that winter maintenance of roads can have an environmental cost. At the same time stress that Veazie is balancing public safety with environmental concerns. Building an understanding or foundation for the topic now may pay dividends in the future should Veazie need to make more obvious changes that directly impact residents.
