Minutes for April 4, 2011

Special Meeting convened: 4:30 p.m.

Members: Sandra Slavin, Chairman; Deborah Pfinister; Brenda Eckstrom; Mike Schneider;

Elizabeth Pezzoli, clerk GUEST: Mary Scarsciotti from the Appeals Board

DISCUSSED: Mary Scarsciotti: Occupancy permits issued for former Majestic Mattress redo on Main Street. ZBA got Building Department to issue temporary occupancy permits on the last two permits issued because units were not counted as affordable. All units have to be counted as affordable. Developer Ryan Correia received \$500,000 in federal money for the project, about \$25,000 remains not spent. There are eight units in building, six on upper floors, two on first. If rentals, all have to be considered affordable. ZBA asked attorney Jon Whitten to work to get all counted as affordable. ZBA had given go ahead to have all eight units counted as affordable. When approved originally by ZBA, only five units. The funding agreement is for 20 years and developer doesn't have to pay back the \$500,000. DHCD is supposed to keep track of affordable/market sales and ZBA wants DHCD to count units based on legislation in efffect at time. Money needed for Whitten's fee - one day of work - \$1,000.

<u>APPROVED MOTION:</u> Withdraw earlier permission to spend \$15,000 of AHT funds for audit and to release funds from administrative funds for 2011. 5-0-0

APPROVED MOTION: To allow up to \$2,000 to Whitten for work. 5-0-0

<u>CONCERN:</u> Sandy Slavin asked for recommendation from MS to enable someone to track affordables (some are being sold at market rate). Suggested checking with area towns to see how they monitor affordable housing sales. MS to ask Whitten how we should monitor since it appears state is not.

<u>HEARD:</u> From Marilyn Donahue, Fin Com member, on Article 37 for spring town meeting. She feels some pieces are missing, suggested we eliminate the word "convey". Said article is conceptually a good idea, but will be hard to sell to voters. Sounds too specific where it really is just a general concept. Not sure AHT has to go to town meeting with this. Suggested seeing if town would support assisting AHT in satisfying the town's affordable housing requirements. Feels it could be voted down because of the way it is written.
