1. CALL TO ORDER BY CHAIRMAN

Chairman Eckstrom called the meeting to order at approximately 7:00P.M. She apologizes for the meeting starting late, due to the board being an executive session.

2. <u>LICENSES & PERMITS</u>

A. **Show Cause Hearing** 7:15pm. Barry's Lighthouse Restaurant, Martha Martin, Manager 3198 Cranberry Highway, East Wareham should be revoked or cancelled based upon M.G.L. c. 138, sec. 64, to wit: violation of M.G.L. c. 138 sec.69 and 204 CMR 2.05(2) and in violation of the Board of Selectmen policy #88-14A rules and regulations. Chairman Eckstrom turned meeting over to Selectman Sauvageau, to conduct the hearing as she wishes to recluse herself from the hearing.

The Town of Wareham building inspector has visited the premises on several occasions and found the restaurant with a close sign and no visual sign of business.

Mr. Conseletti's other concern is that a number of bar rooms have been advertising to young women, to come to their establishments.

Selectmen Sauvageau notes that due to the free speech amendment they cannot restrict this type of advertising. The Board of Selectmen can look into under age drinking legally as a licensing authority.

If the Board approves this request, it is recommended that the approval be with the fee structure and conditions noted. (W/S Development has already paid the Commercial Sewer Permit Fee.)

<u>Recommended action.</u> Motion for the Board to approve the sewer connection tie-in requests for the following establishments at Building 2—The Pavilion at Wareham Crossing subject to the following fee structure and conditions:

- Prior to backfilling, Water Pollution Control Facility staff shall inspect all cleanouts, pipe and connections.
- Any and all cuts within existing paved roadways shall be inspected and approved by the Director of Municipal Maintenance.
- The grease trap will be pumped out three (3) months after the restaurant opens and the owner will notify the WPCF when this is to occur so staff of the WPCF can inspect the grease trap and the future pumping frequency can be determined at that time.
- Payment of all fees, including:
 - Design Review and Construction Inspection Fee of \$1,500.00 (paid as part of the plans submitted for review for Building 2—Pavilion)
 - Sewer Connection Fee equivalent to twice the annual sewer fee: Retail = 1 EDU/10,000sf; the breakdown is as follows:

Cosi Restaurant regular seating = 1 EDU/12 seats. 80 seats = 6.7 EDUs x \$650.00/year doubled = \$8,710.00 **Qdoba Restaurant** regular seating = 2 EDU/12 seats. 65 seats = 5.4 EDUs x \$650.00/year doubled = \$7,020.00

Chairman Eckstrom notes that the building needs to be preserved for its history and culture. She encourages CPC funding also.
