#### LEADERSHIP TEAM

#### ONSET STONEBRIDGE SEWER LINE REPLACEMENT UPDATE

The Onset bridge project is moving along nicely. They have removed all the insulation from the pipe and have removed 50% of the pipe itself. We should by the end of today, have all the pipes removed and working on removing the rollers and doing a complete inspection of the structure holding the pipe in place. We will excavate around the pipe into the ground to assure that there is plenty of good pipe to weld to. The police details, the past couple of days have added greater comfort and safety to working conditions both to the contractor and the public. Wait time in traffic has been at a minimal. We will continue to monitor progress and integrity of the by-pass pipe today and throughout the weekend. Mr. Guy Campinha was before the board updating them on the replacement of the sewer line.

#### SOUTHEASTERN MASS. METROPOLITON PLANNING ORGANIZATION

(SMMPO) held at the District Southeastern Regional Planning and Economic Development (SRPEDD) update on Joint Transportation Planning Group (JTPG) Routes 6 and 28.

On Wednesday, March 16, 2011, Selectman Walter Cruz and Mr. Andrews attended a meeting with John Charbonneau, Town Planner at SRPEDD in Taunton, MA. Their

intention was to effectively communicate our active interest in assisting with the planning process for the Route 6 and Route 28 full depth reconstruction process. This is a \$15 million Transportation Improvement Program designed to enhance traffic flow, improve public safety, sidewalks and utilities. The Joint Transportation Planning Group will need our support and cooperation in the coming weeks and months. Also, he has secured the Massachusetts Dept. of Transportation for our 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Wareham Works Economic and Community Development Summit to be held on Saturday, March 26, 2011 from (10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.) as a keynote presenter on this important Transportation Improvement Project for Route 6 and Route 28.

#### MASSACHUSETTS DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

On Tuesday, March 15, 2011, the DOR held a Regional Assessor's Conference for South Coast Communities. Ms. Marilyn Browne, Chief of Bureau of Local Assessment led this group discussion on various updates to the Commonwealth Gateway which is a state of the art Financial Management Information System for Cities and Towns. Also, topics of discussion included, certification preparation of local assessors' real and personal property proposal values, instructions questions and answers. This workshop qualified for assessors' continuing Education Credits.

# WAREHAM'S PARTICIPATION IN SOUTH COAST REGIONAL COMMENTS ON THE 2010 MASSACHUSETTS INTERSTATE, MERRIMACK AND SOUTH COASTAL WATERSHEDS SMALL MS4 NPDES DRAFT GENERALPERMIT.

On Friday, March 11, 2011, Mr. Andrews joined 36 communities in a group action response for the Town of Wareham with regards to Federal Environmental Protection Agency South Coastal Watershed, Small MS4 NPDES Draft General Permit. He has concerns regarding:

- a. The compliance with the permit conditions and requirements is cost prohibitive.
- b. Numerous conditions and requirements of the permit are vague.
- c. Compliance with certain permit conditions is impossible.
- d. EPA has exceeded its authority in issuing this permit.
- e. The permit will cause undue financial burden on the municipalities.
- f. Concerning section 2.90 non-numeric effluent limitations.
- g. Concerning 2.1.1.1.c the cause or contribute provision.
- h. Concerning section 2.2.1.d limits on phosphorus.

- i. Concerning section 2.2.1.e Long Island Sound TMDL Nitrogen limits.
- Concerning section 2.2.1 f and g regarding Bacteria TMDL's.

#### 10. <u>SEWER BUSINESS</u>

a. Discussion re: 13 Arnold Street

Present before the Board: Attorney Robert Perry representing the owner

Nazih Elkallassi – owner of property

Guy Campinha – Treatment Plant Operator

Attorney Perry gave a brief history regarding this property which was a buildable lot according to the Building Inspector. When the sewer lines were installed, a letter from the Town dated December 15, 2005 stated not to install a tie in stub for 13 Arnold St. An application to the Conservation Commission for Order of Conditions was denied. An appeal before the Superior Court overturned the Conservation Commission's denial. Ultimately, a house was constructed after Mr. Elkallassi paid a betterment fee in full and paid to have a stub for tie in in the amount of \$7900. Attorney Perry is seeking a

reimbursement of the \$7900.00 on the premise that the cost of the stub is part of the betterment fee. Mr. Campinha stated that the lot was unbuildable before sewer and water lines were placed in Rose Point. Mr. Campinha's recommendation is that the Board deny the request for reimbursement. Brief discussion ensued.

#### 11. LIAISON REPORTS

Selectman Holmes advised that the intake coordinator at CEDA will no longer be at CEDA after the end of the month due to the grant reaching capacity. Selectman Holmes also I nformed the

Board that grants given to 6 affordable and 2 market units on Main Street will not be able to be counted by the State for the Town's 40B inventory due to a change from State which changed from 20 years to 30 years.

Selectman Holmes reminded the Board of the Zoning Board of Appeals meeting on March 23, 2011 at 6:30 p.m. in the Town Hall Cafeteria regarding the wind power matter.

Chairman Donahue reported that the Finance Committee wanted to send the Town Meeting warrant to print on April 11, 2011. Chairman Donahue will try to get the Finance Committee to extend that to April 13, 2011 thereby giving newly elected Selectmen members the opportunity to vote of the articles. Also Chairman Donahue wishes to extend an invitation to the Finance Committee to attend the next Selectmen's meeting when the Upper Cape Vocation School budget would be presented. The Finance Committee continues to discuss the legal service budget.

Selectman Eckstrom reminds the Board and public of the upcoming 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Wareham Works which will be held at Town Hall from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on March 26, 2011.
