8. TOWN BUSINESS

 Present before the board: Tom & Janet Pilleri
 Mr. Pilleri spoke about the vandalism occurring in the Swifts Beach area. He said that this has been happening for about three years. Multiple windows have been broken as well as siding being cracked. They are requesting additional lighting be installed in the Swifts Neck Beach Parking Lot. Mr. Pilleri would also like to see Police cruisers patrol the area more often as well as having the gate closed at 9pm as posted on the sign.
- b. Discussion of town meeting article re: Future Generation Wind Present before the board: Keith Mann Mr. Mann spoke about article #16 Purchasing Wind Power for the purchase of electricity and associated net metering credits to be generated from FGW's planned wind energy project to be co-located with the Mann Farms cranberry farm off Head of the Bay Road in Buzzards Bay. Mr. Mann stated that with the discount of 20-30% this would have saved the town approximately \$207,000 last year.
- c. Discussion of town meeting article re: Recycling Committee Present before the board: Marilyn Russell. Earl Russell and Jack Dixon Ms. Russell was before the board to discuss article #14 To fund recycling committee an additional \$3000.
- d. Discussion of town meeting article re: Tax Increment Financing Present before the board: Ken Darcy, Bob Foley and Salvadore Pina Mr. Foley spoke about the proposed town meeting warrant article. This would allow them to close the facility in New Bedford and transfer the workers to this location and to add an additional 35 positions.
- e. Discussion of town meeting article re: Harbormaster Present before the board: Garry Buckminster & Jamie McIntosh Mr. Buckminster spoke about his articles #8 to transfer from the waterways account to the Harbormaster's maintenance improvement account. These funds would be used to survey the Onset pier, which is in need of repair. Article #9 transfer from harbor services permits receipts to Harbormaster's maintenance and improvement accounts. This money would be used to purchase a vessel that would allow them to pull moorings, also pay for patrol boat dockage, upgrade life jackets, medical kits, etc. This money would also allow navigational equipment upgrades and the purchase of a new motor for a skiff and maintenance of the patrol boat. Article #25 Amend the waterways bylaws, division IV, article 1, section 2 & 2A. This would streamline the mooring process.
