Selectman Holmes thanked everyone for their concerns and support asking about his health.

The Community Events Committee was before the board and Ms. Ricci explained that COMMUNITY EVENTS FUND we need to support the events so that they continue to be held which does help the businesses in town.

Selectman Teitelbaum moved to see if the Town will vote to petition the Legislature for special legislation amending Section 2 of Chapter 82 of the Acts of 2008 to allow for the annual deposit of (twenty five percent) 25% of the proceeds of the Wareham parking meter fund into the Community Events fund, and (twenty percent) 20% of the excise collected under section 3A of the General laws, Chapter 64G, also known as the "hotel and motel tax", as of the effective date of this act, and for the subsequent fiscal years, but in no event earlier than January 1, 2015, and further in no event shall the amount in the aggregate in the Community Events Fund for any fiscal year exceed \$60,000, or take other action relative thereto. Selectman Whiteside seconded.

The board wanted to amend the policy to add that pouring license holders have coverage under a liquor legal liability insurance for bodily injury or death for a minimum amount of \$250,000 on account of injury to or death of 1 person, and \$500,000 on account of any 1 accident resulting in injury to or death of more of 1 person. For temporary licenses on Town property the coverage shall be 1 million dollars per single event or \$3 million in aggregate.

Selectman Whiteside moved to amend the liquor policy to include the insurance requirements (as attached). Selectman Tropeano seconded.

TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

The new hours for Town Hall starting on September 29th will be Monday, Wednesday & Thursday from 8:15 am to 6:00pm and Tuesday from 8:15 am – 6:30 pm and the Town Hall will be closed on Fridays.

The Mayflower Group has now accepted the Town.

During the installation of the doors and windows at the Library it was noticed while installing the last window that it had rot and ant damage. Mr. Sullivan authorized them to move on to find out the extent of the damage.

The Municipal Maintenance Director had noticed that the Old Town Hall wasn't properly painted, the contract was for them to brush on the paint however, it was being sprayed on and not brushed. They were instructed to scrap off the paint and repaint it with the brush as agreed to in the contract. This is currently being done at no additional cost to the town.

The Parking Kiosks for the month of August generated \$51,176.75 and last year it brought in \$35,906.75. The total revenue for FY14 so far is \$132.351.25.

Selectman Holmes asked about something that was brought up last week in which two businesses on Cranberry Highway were not in compliance. Mr. Sullivan stated that one of the Sergeants on duty along with Attorney Bowen visited the establishments and they were not able to produce a license at the time. One of the businesses has applied to the Board of Selectmen's Office for a junk dealers license and the other one hasn't shown up and they will take further action.

Chairman Slavin attended a Planning Board meeting last night in which they discussed the rehab of the Snow and Jones building across from the Minot Forest School.

The Best Friends Preschool will be getting their occupancy permit.

S&H Realty located near the new Walmart had made a change and will be going before the ZBA.

Rosebrook has signed an agreement for 5 Guys Burgers and Fries to occupy one of the spaces they have available.

As requested, I have prepared a suggested form of article and motion:

<u>Article</u>

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for dam repairs at Parker Mills Pond, and all other costs incidental or related thereto; to determine whether this appropriation shall be raised by borrowing or otherwise; or to take any other action relative thereto.

<u>Motion</u>

Moved: that \$1,000,000 is appropriated to pay the costs of dam repairs at Parker Mills Pond, and all other costs incidental or related thereto; that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Board of Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$1,000,000 under G.L. c.44B, or any other enabling authority; that the Board of Selectmen is authorized to contract for and expend any federal or state aid available for the project, provided that the amount of the authorized borrowing shall be reduced by the amount of such aid received prior to the issuance of bonds or notes under this vote; and that the Board of Selectmen is authorized to take any other action necessary or convenient to carry out this project.

If the Town would like to condition approval upon a debt exclusion vote, the following sentence should be added at the end:

This vote shall not take effect until the Town votes to exempt from the limitation on total taxes imposed by G.L. c.59, §21C (Proposition 2½) amounts required to pay the principal of and interest on the borrowing authorized by this vote.

In the event that a debt exclusion vote is desired, a ballot question in the following form would be appropriate:

Ballot Question #_

Shall the Town of Wareham be allowed to exempt from the provisions of proposition two and one-half, so-called, the amounts required to pay for the bond issued to pay costs of dam repairs at Parker Mills Pond and all other costs incidental or related thereto?

1.20 LIQUOR LICENSE INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE POLICY

a. All License Indemnity

All applicants for a new liquor license, "one day" liquor license, or for an annual liquor license renewal, shall as part of the application submit an executed, notarized statement providing as follows:

"In consideration of the issuance of the liquor license that is the subject of this application, the applicant's duly authorized signatory binds the applicant to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Town of Wareham, its officers and employees from any and all causes of action that may arise from the Wareham Board of Selectmen's issuance of this license."

b. Insurance Required of Pouring Licenses

All "pouring" license holders are reminded of the insurance requirements of G.L. c. 138, s. 12, which applies to so-called "on premises" consumption licenses issued under that section:

"No license shall be issued or renewed under this section until the applicant or licensee provides proof of coverage under a liquor legal liability insurance policy for bodily injury or death for a minimum amount of \$250,000 on account of injury to or death of 1 person, and \$500,000 on account of any 1 accident resulting in injury to or death of more than 1 person. Proof of the insurance coverage required by this section shall be made by filing a certificate of insurance in a form acceptable to the local licensing authority."

c. Temporary Licenses

- 1. Applicants for G.L. c. 138, s. 14 licenses, commonly referred to as "one day licenses", shall provide proof of coverage under a liquor legal liability insurance policy for bodily injury or death for a minimum amount of \$250,000 on account of injury to or death of person, and \$500,000 on account of any 1 accident resulting in injury to or death of more than 1 person. Proof of the insurance coverage required by this section shall be made by filing a certificate of insurance with the Board of Selectmen before the approved license will be physically issued.
- 2. Should the premises on which the license will be exercised be in whole or in part on Town property, the applicant shall obtain a liquor liability certificate of insurance naming the Town of Wareham as an additional co-insured. The amount of coverage shall be 1 million dollars per single event or \$3 million in the aggregate. The appropriate certificate of insurance must be filed with the Board of Selectmen before the approved license will be physically issued.
