No-one came forward for Citizens Participation.

## IV. PUBLIC HEARING ON 6/18/13 SPECIAL TOWN MEETING WARRANT

MOTION: Mr. McDonald moved to open the public hearing on the 6/18/13 Special Town Meeting Warrant. Mr. Trudell seconded.

**VOTE:** Unanimous (6-0-0)

No-one came forward re: the public hearing.

MOTION: Mr. Gray moved to close the public hearing on the 6/18/13 Special Town Meeting Warrant. Mr. McDonald seconded.

**VOTE:** Unanimous (6-0-0)

#### V. <u>BUSINESS</u>

A. Town Administrator's Report.

Mr. Sullivan distributed information re: the Stabilization Fund & Free Cash. (Attached as reference).

#### B. Discuss & vote 6/18/13 Special Town Meeting Warrant articles.

Article 2 – Police Cruisers

Mr. Sullivan distributed information on the proposed police cruisers. (Attached as reference). He discussed mileage on various police vehicles in the present fleet.

**NOTE:** Ms. Donahue arrived at this time.

Mr. Sullivan stated it is estimated that approx. 4,000-6,000 miles per month are being put on the police vehicles.

Mr. Worthen feels the choice of vehicle (name) being proposed needs to be defended. Mr. Sullivan feels this is a Capital Planning Committee issue & is out of the purview of the FinCom. Ms. Cottuli concurred.

Mr. McDonald feels the majority of the FinCom members concur w/ the need for new police cruisers, but maybe not what type & how to pay for them. Ms. Bronk feels the FinCom needs to be concerned about the funding of the cruisers. Mr. McDonald expressed concern re: how many police cruisers will be needed next year. Mr. Sullivan stated there will be three (3) requested next year & they will be funded through the budget.

Brief discussion ensued re: various police vehicles that are taken home, such as supervisor vehicles.

Mr. McDonald stated he understands the need for police cruisers & a need for a replacement program. He expressed concern re: an original request of \$200,000 for police cruisers, but now the request is up to \$230,000.

Mr. Gray asked who makes the decision on what vehicles to purchase. Mr. Trudell explained that the Capital Planning Committee did not get into what vehicles to purchase (one year ago when he was on the committee). Mr. McDonald added that the police vehicles will be purchased, not leased.

Ms. Donahue spoke re: the use of the Stabilization Fund. She spoke re: the information submitted by Mr. Sullivan this evening relative to uses of the Stabilization Fund & a proposed policy for funding the Stabilization Fund. She submitted a draft letter addressed to the BOS from the FinCom which she read into the record (that deals w/ requesting the BOS to establish a policy for funding the Stabilization Fund). (Letter attached as reference).

Ms. Bronk questioned how much over budget the Police Dept. was last year & this year. Mr. Sullivan stated this year, a Reserve Fund transfer request will be needed because the Police Dept. will be over their appropriation budget. He stated the Police Dept. budget cannot be in deficit. He also understands the Town Clerk is coming forward w/a Reserve Fund transfer request. He stated if this request is approved by the FinCom, whatever is left in the Reserve Fund, the Police Dept. will need every penny of it. He stated in FY11, the Police Dept. was over budget by \$205,722 & in FY12, the Police Dept. was over budget by \$160,000. He stated these deficits added to FY13's deficit for the Police Dept. comes to approx. \$400,000 over budget for the past three fiscal years. Mr. McDonald stated the Town can't go back & fix FY11 or FY12 & he understands Mr. Sullivan is working on getting this year's Police Dept. budget in check.

Mr. McDonald stated there is still a need for police vehicles, but he is uncomfortable w/ the request for five vehicles & the Police Dept. budget being exceeded year after year. He feels five vehicles is aggressive. Mr. Trudell stated he concurs w/ Mr. McDonald, but he noted vehicles purchased in 2011 (3), 2012 (1), & 2013 (1). He stated in looking at the mileage of many vehicles, the mileage is in the six digits. He questioned what the state of vehicles will be next year if the requested vehicles are not purchased. He feels the mileage will be even greater.

Ms. Bronk stated that the Town is on "lean" times & every other department seems to be living w/in their budgets. Mr. Sullivan explained that last year there was a one time payout for a settlement. He feels overtime has killed the police budget as well as there being two retirements. He stated the two retirements were not budgeted for because it is not always known or alert given ahead of time that retirements will occur. He noted there isn't anyone (police officer) available to transfer into the department to cover these retirement departures. He added that there are two illnesses w/ respect to police personnel that will most likely result in retirements as well.

MOTION: Mr. McDonald moved Favorable Action on Article 2 of the 6/18/13 Special Town Meeting Warrant in the amount of \$237,940.00 Ms. Donahue seconded.

NOTE: Mr. McDonald & Ms. Donahue withdrew their motions.

MOTION: Mr. McDonald moved Favorable Action on Article 2 of the 6/18/13 Special Town Meeting Warrant in the amount of \$237,940 to come from the Stabilization Fund. Ms. Donahue seconded.

VOTE: (5-2-0) Ms. Bronk & Mr. Trudell opposed

MOTION: Mr. Gray moved the FinCom approve the sending of the letter re: the funding of the Stabilization Fund policy to the BOS drafted by Ms. Donahue. Mr. McDonald seconded.

VOTE: Unanimous (7-0-0)

Article 13 – Purchase Cover for WPCF Equalization Tank

Mr. Sullivan submitted an email from Mr. Camphina re: Article 13 & he read item #4 into the record. (Attached as reference).

MOTION: Ms. Donahue moved Favorable Action on Article 13 of the 6/18/13 Special Town Meeting Warrant. Mr. Gray seconded.

Ms. Cottuli recalled there had been some concern re: the wording in this article & the language wasn't clear. Brief discussion ensued.

**VOTE:** Unanimous (7-0-0)

Article 14 – Grant Easement Over Town Property

Present before the FinCom: Selectman Alan Slavin, BOS Liaison

Selectman Slavin stated there is a question before Town Counsel re: this easement. He stated the easement & the pipes would have to cross Rtes. 6 & 28 which is a State road. Mr. Sullivan stated unless there is a clear ruling or change, this article may have to be passed over.

MOTION: Ms. Donahue moved No Action on Article 14 of the 6/18/13 Special Town Meeting Warrant. Mr. McDonald seconded.

**VOTE:** Unanimous (7-0-0)

Article 15 – Petition: Accept Layout of Rock Marsh Road

Selectman Slavin stated the citizens of Rock Marsh Road will have to pave the road before the Special Town Meeting & Mr. Gifford, Municipal Maintenance Director will have to sign off. He is not sure all of this will be accomplished by June 18<sup>th</sup>.

MOTION: Ms. Cottuli moved No Action on Article 15 of the 6/18/13 Special Town Meeting Warrant. Mr. McDonald seconded.

VOTE: Unanimous (7-0-0)

- C. Discuss & vote memo/letter to the BOS re: the Stabilization Fund policy. (DONE)
- D. Open positions of the FinCom.

Not handled.

#### VI. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

#### A. Reserve Fund transfer request.

The FinCom reviewed Reserve Fund transfer request #04-13. The amount being requested is \$25,223.18. The purpose of the request is unforeseen expenses for special elections called by the Governor to fill Senator Kerry's seat. The request is extraordinary & unforeseen because of the above explanation & it was State mandated.

Ms. Donahue questioned why all five polling places need to be open for small elections. She feels for the smaller elections, the polling places should be consolidated.

MOTION: Ms. Donahue moved Favorable Action on Reserve Fund transfer request #04-13 in the amount of \$25,223.18. Mr. McDonald seconded.

VOTE: Unanimous (7-0-0)

#### VII. LIAISON REPORTS

Ms. Cottuli stated Ms. Bronk had asked her to fill in as FinCom representative for the Superintendent of Schools position search. She noted that two out of the three finalists concerned her financially.

Selectman Slavin stated that a new Superintendent has been chosen. Ms. Cottuli stated the candidate chosen was the one that did not concern her financially. Brief discussion ensued.

Ms. Bronk stated there is a need for a FinCom representative to be on the Capital Planning Committee. She stated this committee meets on Friday mornings.

MOTION: Mr. Gray moved to approve the meeting minutes of May 22, 2013. Mr. McDonald seconded.

Attached you will find the quotes for the five marked black and white front line patrol units we have discussed. This memo details the purchase of three Dodge Chargers, which are assigned to patrol officers, and two supervisor all wheel drive Dodge Durangos for the patrol sergeants. Please note that the department had three larger marked SUVs for this purpose but one was totaled in an accident (2007 Ford Expedition with approximately 150,000 miles), the current supervisor vehicle in operation is being used 24/7 (2010 Ford Expedition with over 90,000 miles). With the purchase of the two Durangos as front line supervisor cruisers the 2010 will fall back as the fleet backup taking the place of the 2003 unit, which needs extensive mechanical work. The Durangos are smaller and more fuel efficient than the Expeditions and will standardize the remainder of the fleet.

I would like to address a perceived problem as to why the cruisers always seem to be parked at Meineke on Cranberry Highway. We have ten Dodge Chargers in the fleet, which need to be maintained as front line vehicles. As part of our regular maintenance a discounted rate of \$19.99 for grease, oil, and filter has been arranged for every three thousand miles. With the size of this Town and only five cruisers on duty at a time to cover it, the mileage hits three thousand very quickly. Other than this preventative maintenance with rare exception we deal with brakes and tires only. The cars are dropped off early in the morning at shift change and picked up at shift change in the evening. It is obvious the owner places the cars out front for advertisement. Due to staffing limitations we need to wait to double up a car for pickup. The Dodge product has been great and has proven to be fuel-efficient.

In an effort to reduce future Capital purchases I have included police radios in all five new cruisers, which will complete the mobile radio updating for all marked units in the fleet.

The only void in this proposal is the need for additional mobile computers, which are essential. This piece of equipment is a major safety net to our staff for real time information and also increases the officer's efficiency by keeping him/her on the road rather than coming to the station to file reports. In an effort to standardize our computers we are still in need of five units. I have included in the proposal the mounting brackets and respectfully request additional funds for the computers and modems. The cost of the Data 911 computers is \$6652.00 each for a total of \$33,260.00.

- 3 Dodge Chargers to include new radios, radars, and computer mounts. All new emergency equipment and installation included (no equipment transferable due to age and body style).

  (\$42,000 each / 3 mounts \$2,000) \$128,000
- 2 Dodge Durangos to include new radios, computer mounts, and all new emergency equipment and installation included (no equipment transferable due to age and body style). No radar units included in supervisor vehicles.

(\$38,000 each / 2 radios \$5,380)

The Town of Wareham's expenditures continue to outpace its revenues. As such it is no longer viable to fund the Stabilization Fund through the operating budget. This policy proposes that the Town use Free Cash as a funding source for the Stabilization Fund. Free Cash is defined as follows:

Free Cash: Remaining, unrestricted funds from operations of the previous fiscal year including unexpended free cash from the previous year, actual receipts in excess of revenue estimates shown on the tax recapitulation sheet, and unspent amounts in budget line-items. Unpaid property taxes and certain deficits reduce the amount that can be certified as free cash. The calculation of free cash is based on the balance sheet as of June 30, which is submitted by the community's auditor, accountant, or comptroller. Important: free cash is not available for appropriation until certified by the Director of Accounts.<sup>1</sup>

- At the next Town Meeting following the Director of Accounts certification of free cash the Town should vote to transfer funds from free cash to the stabilization fund.
- If free cash is certified at \$200,000 or greater, the Town will endeavor to transfer a minimum of \$100,000 to the stabilization fund.
- If free cash is certified at less than \$200,000 then the Town will attempt to transfer a minimum 50% of certified free cash to the stabilization fund.
- The remaining free cash should be used to fully fund the purchase of capital items.
  - o The caveat being that the Town may wish to let a certain amount of free cash rollover to establish a base for the ensuing Fiscal Year.

Although the Finance Committee is supportive of the need for additional vehicles for the police department, we are concerned about the proposed method of funding through the use of stabilization funds. Pursuant to M. G. L. Chapter 40, Sec. 5B the Town of Wareham maintains a stabilization fund which has a current balance of slightly over \$528,000. The proposed budget for FY2014 does not include any additional funding for that account.

In the not so distant past, the balance of the stabilization fund was at zero. If we continue to make large purchases from this account with adding anything to it, the balance will be back to zero very quickly.

Historically, town meeting has been reluctant to address and adequately fund the capital needs of our town. This places the town in a difficult position when emergency situations force us to make large purchases without sufficient reserves in place. The Finance Committee recognizes the urgent nature of the request for the police cruisers and understands the argument for funding in this manner; however, we also recognize the importance of maintaining a healthy balance in the stabilization fund. Not only is the stabilization fund a safety cushion for emergencies (a "rainy day fund"), but it is also a key component in the bond rating of the town which affects the town's ability to borrow money at more favorable interest rate.

We respectfully request that the Board of Selectmen implement a policy to address future funding of the stabilization account. Since revenue projections do not seem to indicate that it can be funded as a line item in the budget, we would encourage you to consider a policy that sets aside a certain percentage or a set amount of free cash each year to be placed in the stabilization fund going forward.

We are asking for no funds.

In the spring of 2012 we requested and were granted 400,000 dollars to construct an EQ tank for odor mitigation at the treatment facility.

We asked BETA Group to write a RFP for the tank.

In their research they have discovered technology that would allow us to cover the existing open EQ tanks with odor control that would allow us to maintain 1 million gallons of capacity (the size of each open basin) opposed to 150,000 gallons as originally requested to design and construct) a 150,000 gallon EQ tank.

150,000 gallons was determined to be sufficient based on peak flow after a study completed 2011 done with the help of Tech Environmental odor specialists.

This spring and last fall we carried in the excess of 1/2million gallons extra do to weather conditions and high ground water. We would have to divert to the open basin if we complete the 150,000 gallon tank and continue to experience high flows as the result of weather events or high flow events.

The ability to cover the open basins would be less intrusive and less costly then the original research suggested.

The additional language added to the original motion(modifying the motion/article) would allow us to explore this new covering technology in the RFP with the funds already allocated.

This would give us more capacity and more for our money.
